#### **MATCH REPORTS**

#### 10A Team

Round 5 saw us back at Preston Oval against Bosco. Ryan was captain and won the toss and elected to bat. The boys went out thinking it would be an easy game to win but some excellent bowling from Bosco openers saw the loss our two of our gun batters Gando and Lachlan in quick succession, then Jayden was bowled by a sterling Yorker from a bowler 3 times his size – leaving us a 3/33 after 9 overs. An outstanding 25\* from Lucas and with good batting from Noah and Ryan we finished 4/55 after 20.

Bosco went in to bat and surprised with some aggressive batting from their top few batters, Kade kicked us off with an early wicket, but a few dropped catches from us in the field saw Bosco get off to a pretty decent start. Ryan grabbed a very important wicket #2, but Bosco were looking okay at 2/37 after 15 overs. Jayden came into bowl and took out Bosco's middle order with a 3 for none, 3 over spell and a great Gando run-out and Bosco finished 7-42.



Week 2 saw the weather take a turn for the worst and ended up being a wet game. Bosco went in to bat and struggled to score runs against our great bowlers. Lucas grabbed our only wicket (finishing 1/6) and with several maidens and some tight bowling from a lot of the boys including Tom who only got 1 run off 3 overs and Fred who got 2 runs off 3 overs Bosco finished 8/59. After a rain delay Ryno and Tyson went in to bat and with 4 runs needed for victory we got those in fairly quick order. All

the batters ended up in for a hit with the highlights being Kade 15\*, Ryan 11 and Lucas who came back from retirement to finish 32\*. Final score was 9/112 and man of the match went to Jayden for his great bowling with figures of 4 overs 4 maidens 3/0.

#### 10B Team

The mighty Dragons 10B squad returned to the winners circle with a resounding victory over Illawong/Menai at Sutho. We scored 6 for 117 and restricted them to 8 for 89.

Cooper led the boys into battle this round. He lost the toss and we got sent into bat. Kyle and Bradford got us underway and both smashed 4's to get off the mark. Kyle was then dismissed but Bradford returned to his best batting form and chalked up 22 runs for our high score. His innings included 4 memorable boundaries. Ethan is shaping up as our "Mr reliable" and had 2 opportunities to bat this round and remained undefeated on 12 classy runs. Lucas was very unlucky to be run out by a brilliant piece of Illawong fielding for 1. Mitch Duric was in at number 5 and settled himself in well and defending against their pace attack with poise and precision. He returned in week 2 with another stoic batting effort ultimately getting bowled for 1. Very pleasingly, he accumulated many runs to the team total stealing heaps of cheeky byes. Zach had a few decent swings of the bat and snuck through for several byes but was out to a superb catch from the opposition wickie. Mitch Brownscombe set to work on his innings with a cracking boundary followed by a 2 and 1 before retiring not out for 7. Ollie got the runs flowing down the order in week 2 with a score of 6 notched up in quick time. Cooper knuckled down early with great patience and some solid defence before breaking the shackles and belting several 2's, a 3 and many singles. The boys were set the task of not conceding too many byes and overthrows which has been a thorn in our side over the past 4 rounds. Awesome to see that all the practice has paid off. Collectively we only let Illawong sneak through for 3 byes and our discipline to throw the ball accurately back to the wicket saw us record nil overthrows. This is a tremendous improvement. Well done team. Special mention to Mitch Duric in week 1 who was throwing himself all over the place at wicket keeper to prevent the ball getting past. He was brilliant to keep a clean sheet with nil byes. Same result for Cooper and Ollie too.

With the ball we were very effective. Mitch Brownscombe got us underway and from his 5 overs he strangled their scoring to 13 runs and sent down a maiden. Brother Zach saved his best to the last of his 6 overs smashing the stumps twice, including their best batsman as well as 2 maidens. In the field Zach took a screamer of a catch close to the wicket. Lucas bowled all 3 of his overs in week 1 and was tidy as always with none for three with 1 maiden. Tom was inspired to get a wicket with his left arm express bowling and delivered this in the third of his 4 overs. With the ball, Mitch Duric was very tight and his line and length was spot on. None for 13. We've seen some nice bowling from Kyle in the first 4 rounds but he was yet to take a wicket. Well didn't he deliver in this match! 2 wickets for a measly 8 runs from his 4 overs. Congratulations mate. Ethan capped off a memorable all round match recording figures of 2 for 7 including a maiden. Bradford fired up the slinging action with some serious pace bowling that had their batsmen jumping about. Unlucky not to take a wicket this match with 0/8. Cooper showed the boys how to bowl accurately at a nice medium pace that is very difficult to hit. He can thank Ollie who took a sweet catch at 'keeper for his 1 wicket for 6 runs. Speaking of Ollie, he missed week 1 but came back with a vengeance in week 2. In his 12 deliveries he notched a remarkable 11 dot balls. Wow.

Guys, we returned to the winners circle this round because we listened to Cam and the coaching staff. Great to see. Our fielding and wicket keeping has improved out of sight.
