AROUND THE GROUNDS

Congratulations to our Premier B2 and B3 teams on their comprehensive wins. The B2's hit top form at the right end of the season winning their Final with a day to spare. Bowling first Illawong were all out for 96 with John Sheehy 4 for 22 and Corey Moors 4 for 30 making short work of the opposition. Dragons replied with 2 for 101 off only 16 overs to clinch the match with openers Cam Westlake (43) and Jeremy Moors (40) doing the damage.

Our B3's did a similar job on Cronulla Sports bowling them out for 84 with Josh Kedwell taking 4 for 29. Dragons ran down the target in the 25th over with Josh Kedwell scoring 47 and Brayden Heffernan 24 not out.

Triggered by Lachlan (3/3 off 3), and finished off by Ryan (4/1 off 3) and the game was over. Tyson closed out with the final wicket in the 12th over.

Back into bat, we had another 7 overs before the end of week 1, and kicked off week 2 with the remaining 13 overs. Tyson (10), Ryan (12), Lachlan (8*) and Connor (3*) took the team to 7/105 to complete the first innings.

The mighty 10B's traveled down to the SCG (Sutherland Cricket Ground) for our final hit out of the 17/18 season and recorded an impressive victory over a brave Illawong/Menai outfit keen on revenge for their first round defeat. It was a thrilling match that saw our boys dig deep to notch their 3rd win by 9/113 to 4/103.

Captain Ethan won the toss and elected to bat on the lively drop in deck. He asked Lucas and Mitch Duric to don the pads as the opening pair. Unluckily Mitch scooped a catch to the square leg fieldsman without score. Lucas batted through his 10 overs stoically and snatched a couple of cheeky singles to remain 2 not out. The skipper came in first drop, cracked a boundary on his way to 6 before losing his off stump to a nice delivery. Zach fell victim to a similar ball to the same bowler, out for no score. With our innings in danger of collapse, Cooper strode to the crease with purpose and dealt in boundaries only on his way to 12 earning him the play of the day in week 1 for this cavalier performance. Ollie deserved the right for 2 batting opportunities this match and in his typically powerful style he found the boundary 5 times for a combined score of 24. Mitch Brownscombe was in at 7 but was unlucky to chip one back to the bowler without troubling the scorers. Kyle carried his bat from week 1 into the second, forming a nice partnership with Bradford. He was eventually run out sharply for 3. Bradford continued his strong vein of form with some career defining batting. His lusty swinging provided plenty of excitement to the capacity crowd at Sutho before he was eventually dismissed for 22 with four 4's. Since Christmas, Tom has completely reinvented his batting with far more aggression in his style. He, and the whole team has reaped the reward for this change of approach with some nice scores recently. In this match he whipped 3 boundaries off his toes on his way to 21.

We were at our best with the ball and in the field in week 1, allowing only 39 to Illawong. Amazingly we were unable to take a wicket despite these efforts. The boys possibly had their minds on their winter sport pursuits in the second week and our standard slipped to allow Illawong back into the contest.

We missed Lucas' line and length in week 2. His 2 overs in week 1 conceded only 1 run. Ollie shouldered the heavy burden of 5 overs this match and went for only 8 runs, including a maiden. He was the only 1 of our wicket keeping quartet not to allow a bye. Tom sent down 6 overs of classy left arm tweak and medium pace for 17. His first over his best, a maiden. Mitch B was tasked with 5 overs and was very tight early on with a maiden. He smashed the stumps

to dismiss one of their best batsmen in his last over stemming the run rate. In the field, he was everywhere and saved several crucial runs. Mitch D provided the play of the day in week 2 with a sensational run out, throwing down the stumps from 15 metres and 45 degrees. His 5 overs included a maiden and finished at 0/20. Captain Ethan was his usual miserly self proving difficult to play and he finished with 0/11. Kyle provided the bowling breakthrough and took their first wicket after 23 overs by sending the bails flying with a superb yorker. His 3 overs included zero sundries and yielded only 3 Illawong runs. Cooper got his 4 over spell underway with a maiden then followed up with some zinging deliveries recording none for eleven. Bradford had a fine match with the ball. He has really improved his consistency and almost eliminated the loose balls from his repertoire. This match he allowed 4 runs off his 4 overs but the highlight for this scribe was a breathtaking run out. Zach was under the weather in week 1 but returned with strike in week 2. His 2 overs bamboozled their batters with spin and pace from over and around the wicket and figures of 0/6 are in the book.

We selected Mitch Brownscombe to take the trip up to Corner Brew for the man of the match milkshake for his good all round efforts this round.

Despite only 3 wins in the 2017/18 campaign, the Dragons 10B squad had a terrific season showing great sportsmanship and improving their skills while having heaps of fun.
