The grant was approved and construction work is expected to commence very shortly to hopefully be available for use around September this year.

Our Trivia Night was again an outstanding success raising much-needed funds toward the construction of our clubhouse facilities and equipment requirements. Thanks to our MC Mr. Ken Newman for again officiating and preparing all the questions. The annual Club raffle was also a great success with Bob Price again providing all the hard work – thanks again Bob.

Once again I must thank all the Coaches and Managers for their magnificent efforts with all our teams, together with all members of the Management Committee for the dedication, support and enthusiasm throughout the year. We are very fortunate to have such a dedicated group of people involved in our club. Special thanks must also go to our Secretary (and newest life member) Ian Latham for all his efforts in preparing the successful submission for the Sports and Recreation Grant and the production of the annual yearbook.

Another club stalwart needs special mention...**Robbie Knight**. Not only does he play in the senior competition for the club, he also coached the 12A's who narrowly missed being premiers, this year Robbie walked the streets of Engadine and obtained few thousand dollars sponsorship from local businesses for the club. No one asked him to do it....he just did it of his own free will for our club. **Heaps and heaps of thanks Robbie from everyone involved with the Dragons.**

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 2003/2004 season provided a real mixed bag in registration numbers. Despite the pre-season advertising and promotion there was a dramatic downturn in junior player numbers with the Club fielding ten teams made up of 109 Engadine and 6 St. Patrick's registered players. For the second season running we formed a joint team, this time with St. Patrick's, the 16C St. Pat's Dragons. Thanks to the efforts of both committees the venture proved again to be a real success and provided the opportunity for twelve of the thirteen players to compete in their last season of junior cricket.

In complete contrast to the juniors our senior numbers swelled for the fourth consecutive season and we fielded a record seven sides made up of 103 registered players in the SSCA competition. It was pleasing to see that the majority of our new registrations were made up of last season's under sixteen's.

For the first time in many seasons the Club fielded an under eight team in the SSJCA Competition. After disappointing results in recruitment from the "Have 'A' Go" Cricket Program over the past two seasons the re-introduction of under eight cricket has provided the opportunity to develop players at an early age. Our two under eight coaches Dean Griffith and Chris Jackson did a tremendous job in their first year as accredited coaches with the team winning seven of their ten matches. From the feedback I have received all nine players thoroughly enjoyed their cricket.

On the field our juniors found it difficult in a number of grades especially our 10A's side, which contained a large number of rookies. To their credit they stuck to their guns and showed great improvement in all their individual skills. Our 12C team made up of first year twelve's were competitive at various stages of the season. In their second year of this age group they should be right up there in contention for the final. All the under fourteen teams finished out of the top two but all had their share of success throughout the year. The 14B's, the Club's "Most Improved Team" defeated all the top sides but played without luck. The 14A's with nine of the eleven players in their first year of the age group had a number of good wins including knocking over eventual Premiers Illawong. Next season they will be warm favourites for the 14A grade honours. Our two 14D sides provided two of the best matches of the season when they faced off against each other. Both matches were played in great spirit and sportsmanship with the honours being shared. The 16C joint team struggled throughout the year but remained positive and did their best. The Club slipped from third to fifth in the SSJCA Club Championship which was a pleasing result considering the above-mentioned huddles.

Our seniors competed strongly across the grades with the greater majority of the teams in contention for the finals at various stages of the season. As previously mentioned we had another great influx of juniors making the transition to the senior ranks, which has provided great optimism for the future of our senior club. The A1's were again struck by injury and work commitments, which effectively finished their season mid year. The B2, B6 and C1 teams showed great early form but the Xmas break proved fatal in their premiership aspirations. Our youngest team, the B8's battled hard all season without a lot of points to show for their efforts. I'm sure with the experience gained in their first senior year they will go from strength to strength.

We again figured strongly in the Final's Series with two junior, and two senior sides contesting the final. Congratulations go to our Premiers, the 16A, B5 (Minor Premiers) and B7 (Minor Premiers) teams. Commiserations to our runner up, the 12A side. All four teams performed consistently and thoroughly deserved their place in the Final. Special mention must be made of the effort of our 16A team, which has now made it three straight 16A Premierships. Congratulations to all the players involved in setting this distinguished record and to the best two coaches in our Shire, Stuart Slack and Harry Robbins.

Yet again, the Club figured prominently at the representative level with nineteen junior players being selected to represent the Sutherland Shire in the NSWDCA Competition. Congratulations to our 14A player Ben Marciante who was selected in the Under 13 Emerging Blues team. Also a special mention for Greg Ings (14A), Mark Rice (12A) and Sam Newman (12A) who were all invited to trial for the Emerging Blues.

On the financial side of things we were again well supported by our old faithfuls, Engadine R.S.L. & Citizens Club, Cosmo Lighting, Engadine Bowling & Recreational Club Ltd and Sutherland Credit Union. This season also saw the greatest number of advertisers ever in our Newsletter, thanks to the extraordinary efforts of Robbie Knight the Club is some \$3000 better off. On the social front thanks goes to Ken Newman whose M.C. skills provided another socially and financially successful Trivia Night. Bob Price's Club Raffle broke all records, thank you to Bob and to all the members and players that bought tickets.

This season saw the Club seek a "Department of Sport & Recreation Program Grant". I'm delighted to report that we were successful in our application and were awarded \$7400, which will be of great financial aid to the proposed construction of our clubroom and indoor training facility at the Anzac Oval Sporting Complex. All going well the room should be available for the commencement of the 2004/2005 season.

This being my last season as Club Secretary I would like to thank all the various Committee Members that I have worked with over the many years, it would be unfair of me to single any one person as I and the Club have been fortunate to have had so many dedicated people working to make our Club the best in the Shire. I have had many proud moments over the years, non-better than seeing junior players taking on coaching rolls within the Club. We are the most fortunate Club in the Association with all but two teams being coached by ex-juniors; incidentally fathers of ex-juniors coach the other two teams. With the A.G.M. just around the corner, Wednesday 2nd June 2004 7.30pm in the rooms of the Eagles Soccer Club we will again be calling for nominations for all positions. It would be great to see some new faces at the A.G.M. and more importantly new faces on our committee. Working for this great Club has been a most rewarding experience and I highly recommend it.

Thank you to all the Committee for your support and work this season, it was a pleasure to work with you all. A special thanks goes to Tony Gleeson who took on the roll of reporting to the Engadine District News and all the footwork he put in prior to the start of the season with advertising and promoting our registrations. Last, but not least, thank you to all the parents, relatives and friends who gave great support and encouragement to the players during the year. Thank you to all our players and good luck to all our juniors who have played their last season of junior cricket, hope to see you in the senior ranks next year.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA

AS AMENDED 2003/2004 SEASON

Note:

- The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.
- Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations, all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final last played or any other such date as the Committee may announce or publish.
- In the absence of nominations the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.
- The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge special circumstances or to provide encouragement.
- All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

GENERAL CRITERIA:

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the determination of performance awards, the following criteria shall apply uniformly: Where a bowler is competing with a batsman and/or wicket keeping for a Club honour, the following system shall apply:

- For each 10 runs scored: - 1 point
- For each wicket taken: - 1 point
- For each catch/stumping made: - 1 point

Where two batsmen or two bowlers are vying for a honour/award the Management Committee will take into account the ratio of runs to innings, and/or wickets to overs noting the strike and economy rates and in each instance make judgment based on its assessment of all circumstances.

The above may also be used for determining "All-rounders" but with respect to the junior, intermediate and senior divisions it is to be read in conjunction with the criteria specified.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS:

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions: For all junior and intermediate teams engaged in competitive cricket there will be four awards presented. One for batting and one for bowling plus two others to be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager). The Coach and Manager may recommend two awards from the following four categories, Most Improved Player, Most Consistent Player, Team Player and Best Fielder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. No one person may win more than one of the above awards.

In addition, consideration will be given by the Management Committee to recognizing "all rounder" skills where the efforts of an individual player provide justification for an All-rounder award. As a guide, within the Junior Division, minimum 100 runs scored and 10 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 7 catches/stumpings). Intermediate Division, minimum 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals. The Management Committee will look at situations that parallel these performance levels and take such efforts into account.

Senior Division: To each team there shall be available awards for batting, bowling, and where earned All-rounder. For Batting, and Bowling the award will be based on the highest aggregates derived from the official Scorebooks. Aggregates include both innings but exclude finals. In the case of more than one player sharing the highest aggregate the player with the highest average will be awarded the trophy. To qualify as an All-rounder the recipient must have achieved in the year, no less than 200 runs scored and 20 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 15 catches/stumpings). A player who represents the club in more than one team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of finals.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE DIVISIONS PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Six (6) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of more than one keeper having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

SENIOR DIVISION PERFORMANCE AWARDS:

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) three (3) trophies awarded.

Batting Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who scores the most runs in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The most runs will be the aggregate of all runs credited to the batsman as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Runs scored in finals shall be excluded.

Bowling Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who takes the greatest number of wickets in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of wickets will be the aggregate of all wickets credited to the bowler as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Wickets taken in finals shall be excluded.

Wicket Keeping Award: Shall go to the player within the Division nominated who as the wicketkeeper is credited with the greatest number of dismissals in the season. There is no weighting for grade. The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper as shown in the official score book and shall be inclusive of first and second innings. Finals shall be excluded. In the event of more than one keeper having an identical tally, byes but not leg byes shall be taken into account and the award made to the keeper with the lowest number of byes.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS:

Senior Club Champion: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who, through efforts with bat or ball has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club Champion (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the Scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding cricketer in the junior or intermediate divisions, who through efforts with bat or ball has proved him/herself competitive at the higher levels (A or B Grade) of the SSJCA Competition. In determining the merits of a batsman relative to a bowler (or wicket keeper) for the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

Club All Rounder (Junior and Intermediate divisions): (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy).

Determined by the Management Committee. Derived from an examination of the scorebooks. Awarded to the most outstanding all round performance in the Junior and Intermediate Divisions. As a guide a minimum of 150 runs scored and 15 wickets taken (wicket keeper a minimum 10 catches/stumpings). For the purpose of assessing this award the general criteria set above shall apply. In addition 1 point will be awarded for each fielding catch and run out. While first and second innings shall count, finals will be excluded.

JUNIOR & INTERMEDIATE CLUB AWARDS:

Most Improved Team: (Perpetual trophy, and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be taken into account.

Bob Price Encouragement Shield: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee. The award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will take into account age, performance, level at which played, years of experience. Commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricket to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Greg Heffernan Fielding Trophy: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded specifically for fielding effort. The number of catches taken is a factor but for a wicketkeeper allowance is made for the advantages of gloves. Considerations include alertness, speed and accuracy of returns, determination, and encouragement of fellow players, in particular bowlers.

Rookie of the Year: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player who has completed their first ever year of competitive cricket and has displayed potential and enthusiasm for the game.

SENIOR CLUB AWARDS:

Outstanding Junior in Men's Cricket: (Perpetual trophy and personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Determined by the Management Committee. Awarded to a player in the first full year ever of senior cricket that displays a high level of skill, ability, and potential.

EDCC SERVICE AWARDS:

Club Service Awards: Introduced in 1996/97, the whole purpose of the Service Award is to acknowledge continuous club playing service and promote pride in the club. The awards are in periods of five years, ie: five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

Club Member of the Year: (Perpetual trophy & personal trophy) Nominations are sought.

Awarded to a club member who, gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Club Executive shall determine the recipient.

Life Membership: The Club Executive shall determine all nominations for LIFE MEMBER. While any club member may nominate any other club member to be a Life Member such nomination is to be in writing with reasons in support. The Club Executive is not bound to accept nominations or give reasons for rejection. In considering any such nomination it will be guided as follows.

- The basic merits of each nomination.
- The years and nature of service to the club rendered by the nominee.
- Generally, but not exclusively, no less than ten years club service is seen as a minimum.

EDDC BRADMAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP:

This scholarship is to select two players from the under 12 age group, preferably from the highest graded team, and send them to attend the July Talented Player Winter Camp conducted by the Bradman Foundation during the July school holiday break. The four day course is conducted at Bowral and the Club will cover the costs all accommodation, fees, meals, internal transport at Bowral and resource material. In addition assistance towards travel costs and pocket money will also be included. Each scholarship is valued at \$390.

Preference will be given to selecting A grade players although the grade is not a major factor. Primarily the scheme seeks annually to identify two keen cricketers within the club, who will benefit from this experience and are deemed to have potential. At the same time they must be seen to be interested in pursuing cricket at the higher levels, eg. Representative and ultimately Grade.

The Management Committee with input from the coach of our highest graded under 12 team will make the selection at the end of each season. Selections are subject to informal acceptance by players and parents prior to places being reserved, funds committed and a formal decision being announced. The selection process is at the discretion of the Management Committee and no correspondence will be entered into.

For one reason or another the season started with about as much drama as was humanly possible to have in a junior cricket team. One of the many difficulties we had to overcome early on was the fact that we only had 9 players and 4 of those boys had never played cricket before. We eventually got two more players but they hadn't played the game before either. That was fair enough but we were obliged to participate in the very competitive 'A' grade comp up against kids who really did know how to play. Consequently Rob Smith and I decided very early that we would treat the season as a learning experience for these little blokes and do everything we could to get as many players involved as possible and, at the same time, do what we could to see the team wasn't flogged off the park every Saturday.

As a coach I thought it was my duty to do two things. One was to try and come up with ways to make the team as competitive as possible. Secondly, depending on the state of the game, to project as many players as possible into the fray with bat and ball. And if you think complying with those two objectives would be simple enough then try being a coach for a year in similar circumstances and see how easy it is to maintain that balancing act.

Consequently we lost quite a few games outright in the first half of the season, but I never gave up hope that they would improve providing I kept insisting that they kept trying to do the little things right way.

Almost all players got to bowl in nearly every game, including the wicket keeper. As for the batting order, I thought it was essential to maintain a top order as much as possible against 'A' grade bowlers and to rotate the bottom two thirds of the list. I think in most instances this policy was the most effective for this team and it was the fairest method that I could think of.

Throughout the year I preached the message, "If you put in a full effort then you won't have to wait around for the coach to reward you, the game itself will reward you." I'd like to think that most players in this team are now beginning to understand what that meant.

We played 10 games, won 3, drew 1 and lost 6. Which really is an okay result considering what we were up against and the ability variables within our team. But that 3 run victory in the last round against the only team to defeat the eventual premiers Illawong was very satisfying for everyone connected with this team.

We all know these boys started out as a bunch of little guys with mostly a minimal understanding of cricket but from where I stand, they ended up a good looking team with all the skills and respect for the game just beginning to emerge. I really do hope that trend continues next season.

But I think once young players reach a point where they feel they have overcome the physical demands and begin to accept the disciplines the game itself imposes on them, then suddenly when they overhear someone talking about a guy being a "real cricketer" they know exactly what that means.

He was a genuine contributor to the team scoring 290 runs including a great century and took 16 wickets with an economy rate of 2.70 runs per over, plus he also took a couple of slips catches.

He is a naturally attacking batsman who wasn't afraid to take on the bowlers and yet I was especially pleased to see how well he is beginning to adjust to better class bowlers. His own bowling is very sound with good control of line and length. The club is fortunate to have such a talent as Liam in our midst.

HAYDEN SMITH: This guy has another year of under 10's still to go and already he is one of the better players in the Shire. His batting is as resolute and determined as I have seen in a young opener. He does all the right things and seldom misses opportunities to score. His bowling is also up there with the best in his age group while his fielding is second to none. He scored 277 runs at an average of 30.77 and actually carried his bat on no fewer than three occasions. He also took the most wickets for the year taking 22 wickets at an impressive economy rate of 3.28 runs per over and took 4 catches. Over all he is becoming the personification of the modern day cricketer, a complete all-rounder.

ROBBIE FARNAN: This was really Grannie's first year of cricket. He played beginners cricket at Heathcote two years ago but when that club folded he was unable to play. So, two years later he came to us, still very green with not a lot of skill. But to his credit he showed a tremendous spirit and willingness to learn, so that once he figured out what the game was all about he began to show his real ability. He scored 110 runs with most of those in the second half of the season and took 8 wickets with a very good economy rate of 3.44 runs per over. He was mainly our first string wicket-keeper, but gave someone else a chance at the drinks break occasionally, but ended up taking 5 catches behind the stumps. He's a very promising player with a good attitude this boy and I have very high hopes for him.

ANDREW HOFF: Hoffy began the season in two minds about a lot of things. "Am I an attacking batsman or should I become more defence conscious? Do I bowl medium pace or spin? Am I a wicket-keeper or am I better suited in the field?" I could see all these questions going around in his mind so I made some decisions for him. Firstly become a batsman who knows how to select the right ball to score from. Second become a leg-spinner and third forget about wicket keeping and put yourself at cover or mid-wicket. Once he had his mind put at ease he set about re-building himself, but not without some misgivings especially about his bowling. I pleaded with him to continue to develop his natural leg-spin talent and not to worry too much if he got belted occasionally or if catches were continually dropped off his bowling. It was not easy for him but I'm pleased to say he stuck to the task and, in my opinion, he is becoming the best leg-spin prospect for his age in the Sutherland Shire. I just hope he believes what I say and continues along the same pathway next season. He scored 42 runs and took 8 wickets at an economical rate for a slow leg-spinner of 3.33 runs per over. He also took 4 catches and was involved in 3 run-outs and I'll tell you what, he's a terrific fieldsman.

MARK KIDD: Mark is another boy who has loads of natural skill and I expect him to develop into a very good player once he backs himself and plays his natural game. I'm convinced he just needs to go ahead and unleash a bit of positive aggro and allow his real ability come to the fore. He has a wonderfully fluent left-arm bowling action that I predict will evolve into a real force in a year or two. His run total of only 42 runs was not in any way a reflection of his true capability as a batsman. And neither were his 7 wickets from 59 overs. But just look at his incredibly economical run rate of 2.75 runs per over. I really like the way he looks and acts like a cricketer this bloke and I have a lot of confidence in him. Whatever team you are in next season Mark, believe in yourself and carry a positive attitude with you and you won't fail.

NICHOLAS CHAMBERLAIN: Nicky came to the Dragons full of positive attitudes and a self-belief that defied description. However when he came face to face with the every-day demands of the game itself he was initially taken aback. But to his credit he has put his head down (most of the time) and was prepared to acquire the technical skills he could see he needed to master if he was going to fulfil his own predictions about what he was going to achieve out on the cricket field. He bats quite well but without the necessary patience required to amass a sizable total at this stage, while his bowling is full of all those little promising signs of better things to come. His fielding is enthusiastic but he needs to stay focussed. He was more than happy to help out as wicket keeper when the need arose and did a good job as well. I like the passion for the game this boy carries around with him and the day he acquires a little bit of self-restraint will be the day he emerges as a genuine cricketing talent. He scored 36 runs from fairly limited opportunities and took 5 wickets from 28 overs at an excellent economy rate of 2.64 runs per over plus he took 4 catches.

TOMMY DOWD: If ever a boy deserved a medal for trying then this is he. Not only was this his first year as a cricketer but he carries with him an added burden, fairly common among kids these days it seems, which I would rather not mention here. Suffice to say Tommy had more than his share of things going against him. But I will be forever in admiration for this little bloke for the way he stuck it out and tried his very best every single time he walked out onto the field. Some kids have natural motor skills while others take a while to acquire them, with Tommy he really had to work hard just to keep up. He batted 8 times and was actually not out on 3 occasions at the end of the days play having courageously defied the bowlers his wicket for many overs. But I think the highlight of his year was the day he was involved in a magical run-out throwing the return from almost side on to hit the stumps on the full. The spontaneous and ecstatic reaction of his teammates as they rushed to embrace him is a moment in sport I will never forget.

MICHAEL McFARLANE: Another boy in his first year in cricket. Michael found the going really tough and at first had a hell of a time trying to make him competitive. That's a big ask for a little fella as a batsman up against physically much bigger 'A' grade bowlers or when he was trying to land the ball in the middle of the pitch when he got the chance to bowl. But here again this indomitable spirit emerges from within nearly all kids who play cricket. He would not give up. He hadn't had time to acquire the technique and skills of the game but that wasn't going to keep this bloke on the canvas. He tried and tried right to the last game. He didn't score a lot of runs but he did take 2 valuable wickets and a sensational catch that also had his teammates rushing to congratulate him. You know, it doesn't matter how good or not so good you are, when you achieve something like that it makes everything else seem unimportant.

MITCHELL DIBB: Yet another first year boy and he found it just as hard as all the others. He's a very quiet and likeable boy, who seldom had much to say, but he has a very good build for a cricketer and I thought he might evolve as a bowler as the season progressed. But those 'A' grade batsmen are renowned for knocking the confidence out of newcomers to the bowling crease. He bowled 12 overs and took 1 wicket much to the delight of his team. And again those 'A' grade bowlers have no pity on newcomers to the batting crease either so mostly his time in the middle with the bat was very limited. But he also did not give up and kept right on trying his best.

MITCHELL COSGRIFF: Another first timer who joined the team just prior to Christmas. Mitchie looks a good prospect to me although his figures don't show it yet. But he can play under 10's again next season so I confidently expect him to do really well from here on providing he applies himself to the disciplines of the game and begins to think cricket and nothing else while he is on the field. He's a physically big boy with all the qualities of courage and desire who will do well with bat and ball and in the field next year if he is prepared to work at it. He bowled 13 overs and took 2 valuable wickets in our last gasp victory against Sports in the final round. Attend yourself and learn the fundamentals Mitchie and I guarantee you will do well next season.

JULES STAS: Jules is a very likable and highly intelligent young man with real ability hiding inside him somewhere and he only allows you a brief glimpse of that ability every now and then. So much so that it wasn't until our practice session just prior to round 6 that I thought I noticed something about his technique that prompted me to elevate him into the opening role with the well performed Hayden Smith at the other end. The result was he stayed at the crease for over 30 overs against Bosco who have a very good group of fast bowlers. The fact that he only scored 13 runs on that occasion didn't matter, the thing is, he defied their bowlers and saved us the prospect of another outright loss at a time when the team needed to get itself out of the doldrums and begin to improve. I was very impressed with him that day. I just hope I'm around somewhere to see what happens when this guy uncorks his latent talent on a more regular basis. Jules scored 40 runs for the season and took 2 wickets from 13 overs. He also took 2 very good outfield catches.
