If you are yet to enjoy this rewarding role, I encourage you to come along and be involved with our club as a participating volunteer. 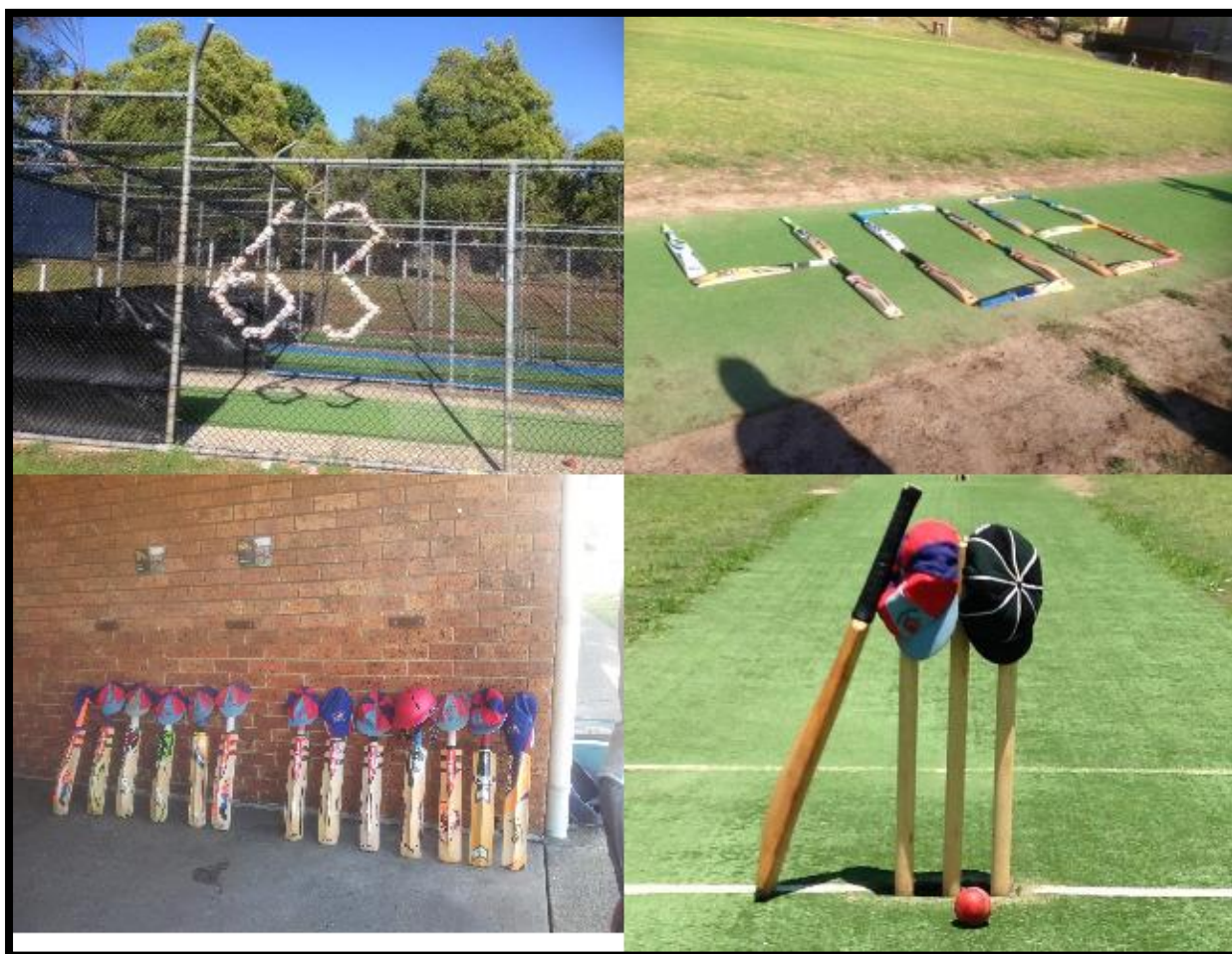
