### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

Firstly my thanks to the very hard working Executive Committee who so ably assisted me in all matters pertaining to Cricket, and its well-being throughout the season concluded.

Progress - The Saturday Morning Boy's Competition has gained terrific momentem in the past season, having increased from some 400 Members to approximately 630 strong with 47 registered teams.

This would possibly be one of the largest Boy's Competitions in N.S.W. Their strength in numbers has only been superceded by their performances.

It must be with great satisfaction, that the Officials of our Junior Association look back on Season 1959-60.

The unenviable task is to try and conduct this ever increasing potential on the deplorable grounds within this Shire, nothing other than gloom shadows their triumph, with these facilities even becoming more and more depressing, to each Executive who is intent upon providing these lads with an interest to good living, and eventually citizens of this Shire.

We have surely, parental support, Senior Cricket Assn. support, but what is needed most at this juncture, is local Council Support, in creating new playing fields, and attention to the areas that have been in use for so many years.

With these thoughts in our minds, we must have an ultimate goal an outlet for our forthcoming talent, that being, a District Club with full Grade Status. The only way this can be achieved is by a concentrated, and co-operative effort by all cricketing bodies in the Shire.

Gentlemen - our boys are keen, can we match their keenness with a united effort, let us look well into the future when we could see some of our youngsters of today playing in State games, or even representing Australia. There are so many people who assist our common aim in the course of a year, that space prevents individual acknowledgement.

To all of them may Itherefore, as a final word, offer my thanks and that of my Executive for the good job being done, and express the hope for your continued unselfish support.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen,
On behalf of the Executive Committee I present for your consideration and adoption the Thirteenth Annual Report, dealing with the activities of the Association during the 1959-60 Season.

MEMBERSHIP

Initial Registrations for Grading were 333, this being broken into four divisions, Al - 6 Teams, A2 - 8 Teams, Bl - 6 Teams, B2 - 6 Teams after three attempts to complete a draw, I feel I must emphasize the need for all Clubs to agree upon the decision of the Grading Committee in future years, and to also complete the registration forms not later than the Adjourned Annual Meeting.

Further Registrations during the Season were, Al - 39, A2 - 28, Bl - 37, B2 - 56, making the Total Registrations - 485.

This general increase points towards an even bigger Season in 1960-61.

The Divisions for the greater part of the season were keenly contested until in some cases the stronger teams, in some instances improved by additional registrations, became too far in front to interfere with the ultimate result, and was duly accepted quite early who would win each Division.

The glorious uncertainty of Cricket added salt to the wounds at times when the leaders were in plenty of trouble, yet on the second days play proved what team work and understanding can do.

The Executive extend heartiest congratulations to the winners of each Division, and compliment the other teams in the manner in which they tried all the way to topple the eventual winners.

Miranda R.S.L. in the Al deserve better recognition than I can proffer in my comments, but concluded the Season with a good win over the Premiers, who I feel sure will aclaim this fine effort.

A2 although eventually won by the Miranda Rangers quite easily, did provide this grade with some very keen cricket, and will help to give the Al grade a necessary needle.

Bl provided very interesting cricket for most of the season and I feel sure those playing in this Division enjoyed their cricket.

B2 developed into quite a struggle with some interesting results, even the lowest team defeating the top teams, throughout the year.

### GROUNDS

The difficulty encountered this year with the ground position has not improved with the years, it is indeed a catastrophe, an insult

to the playing Members of this Association, to go out and play on the grounds that abound in this Shire.

Were it not expressively in the interest of the sport and to keep the youngster in the game, many would give up, as the enjoyment on fielding a ball on these rough grounds properly, does entail too much risk, hence the general unwillingness for the younger ones to also take such risk.

These grounds could be looked into and given care during the off season where other sports do not prevail, there are some six or seven such grounds not used during the winter sport, to those sporting organisations who roll around these other grounds, your Members have my whole-hearted sympathy.

### MELBOURNE CUP SWEEP

Many thanks to our Honorary Vice-President Mr. K. Murphy, who again supplied the tickets for our Melbourne Cup Guessing Competition, which I am pleased to say did leave us a little on the right side of the Ledger, the Executive wish that I convey their thanks to those who supported the cause, as £33.3.0 was cleared. 1st Prize went to Mr. S. Devine, No. 1155, Second prize went to K. O'Connell, No. 1054, Third prize went to Mr. B. Gannon, No. 872.

It is to be hoped that Clubs will give consideration to the cause and assist the Executive in the sale of tickets next year, our thanks to the School of Arts team who combined to sell £13.0.0 worth of tickets, Southern United next with £9.10.0

### ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

A total of 10 Council Meetings were summoned throughout the Season two lapsed, Delegates are not upholding the confidence placed on them by their own Clubmates who must, I presume elect their most responsible men to the task of looking after their Club's business, at the Association Council Meetings.

Fourteen Executive Meetings were held, these were well attended in most cases, some very contentious matters as usual were on hand, but in most discussions a favourable climax was reached. I personally express my thanks to the Members of the Executive who devote time to matters pertaining to the correct functioning of Cricket within this Shire, it has been my pleasure to be associated with you, and I hope I am again called upon to help in some capacity.

### NOTEWORTHY PERFORMANCES

Ron Moss in Al playing for the North Cronulla side collected three trophies again, just to prove he is still as good as last season. George Stathers again collected the treble in trophies, and with the correct tuition could go places, we would like to see you in Telegraph Shield, George. Athol Eagles collected his two-hundredth wicket in Martin Shield matches during this Season's series, and has scored some 1500 runs. Vic. Dwyer 826 runs keeps on keeping on, seeing them well, and playing good cricket, a hard chap to shift. G.Taylor them well, and playing good cricket, a hard chap to shift. G.Taylor lot wickets in his first season in the Senior Association will be plenty of worry for up and coming batsmen of the future, the only

performances for comparison is, T Robinson 131 in 1922-23 and A. Eagles, 107 in 1934-35. J. Cropp wicket-keeper for the winning B1 team, Evoca took 31 catches and stumped one, allowed only 20 byes in a total of 2147 runs.

All matting has been picked up from locations and Brett's are well ahead with the repair of same, this I feel will ensure good mats in plenty of time for the commencement of the next Season, some new sets will be required, but will be controlled ultimately by affiliations.

Len even in the shadow of the inevitable, played his game of cricket last Season, and enjoyed it to such an extent as to win the A2 Grade trophy for the best Wicket Keeper.

Such a fine performance under difficulties that his team mates would be aware of, showed his ability, and determination to carry his burden unselfishly.

To his relatives we extend the sympathies of the entire Members of this Association, "Vale" Len, "Be not weary in well doing".

It is with deep regret that we also record the passing of a very dear person at the conclusion of the Season, Mrs. Every, wife of our "Life Member" Mr. Jim Every, who did not play last Season, but turned out at times to see his old Club, Oyster Bay in action.

Irvin Every son of the deceased, also a very well-known cricketer in our Shire, to all we express our deepest sympathies. "A star is born, a love is lost".

### THE SUTHERLAND JUNIOR ASSOCIATION BOY'S COMPETITION

To the Executive of this organization must go all thanks for their efforts during the Season just concluded 1959/60, from the efforts of this Committee will eventually come the life of Cricket within the Shire.
