SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

It is with much pleasure that I now present on behalf of my Executive the Fourteenth Annual Report, and Balance Sheet for your consideration and adoption.

The various sections of the report cover the activities of the Association during the season of 1960/61, which incorporated for the first time the inauguration into this Shire of Semi Finals and Finals.

To some extent this was a successful step and only needed the full co-operation of all Clubs participating to carry out this endeavour to lift the standard of the game in our Shire.

In all Divisions the Semi's, Finals, and Grand Finals were keenly contested, but the laurels would go to the A1 Division Final when Woolooware and Miranda Rangers met in a titanic struggle, and only in the concluding stages with minutes left for play did the rangers team, who had combined well, get on top to win by a very small margin.

The A2 Division keenly contested gave off the ingredients of Test atmosphere cricket, when Miranda Magpies and Engadine were unable to conclude their game in the time specified, the Executive had to rule joint Premiers in this Division.

B1 Division dominated by the strong batting side of Miranda R.S.L. for most of the season had to take second place to the improved Evoca side who came from almost a hopeless position to defeat R.S.L. in the Grand Final who were Minor Premiers.

B2 Division not to be outdone by the higher Grades, staged a terrific Grand Final between Minor Premiers North Cronulla undefeated, and Engadine who had beaten North Cronulla in the Final. Engadine combined in a way that surprised many, to win this Grand Final in a very convincing manner indeed, and were a long way the most improved side at the conclusion of the season.

In conclusion, and defence of the Semi Finals and Finals I definitely feel something bigger than ever before stepped into our cricket here, and would like to see this step taken, retained for another season or two, so that the full impact would be of great benefit.

The Executive extend their congratulations to the winners of each Division, and express their thanks to those Clubs who combined to the end in an endeavour to play cricket as long as possible while the time was available.

MEMBERSHIP

Initial registrations were 343, Grading being, A1 6 teams, A2 6 teams, B1 6 teams, B2 6 teams - total registrations were 433 for the season, less than the previous season, we sincerely hope the trend does not continue. The prospect of better grounds, may bring interest to some who have gone to other Associations, who can thank their Councils for the continued interest they show in respect to the upkeep, and welfare of the sport in the District, the Executive of this Association would also like to be in this position, and thank Council for its endeavours, we still hope for this opportunity.

LIFE-MEMBERSHIP

I have much pleasure in presenting for consideration and sincerely hope adoption, of a nominee for Life-membership, Mr. Jack Moodie. Through many years of working to benefit cricket in this Shire, Jack has always been there with me, also worked with other Life-members when the District Club was formed, being Secretary in 1952/53.

Jack gave valuable service to this Association over the years, being our Assistant Secretary, has for the past five years been Secretary of the Junior Association, and a lot of hard work has gone into this supreme effort easily Jack's greatest contribution to cricket.

OBITUARY

It is with deep regret that we record the passing of two very dear ones, Mr. Fred Vormister who always gave assistance to the cause of sport, enjoyed fussing around, also liked to watch any sport being played, has been gone almost a year, we still miss you, "Vale Fred".

Mr. John Woodhouse who had played cricket here over the last twelve years or so, was a fine sportsman, always enjoyed his game, but

also did a great deal of organising for Juniors, held his Club St. Patricks together over the years, took a pleasure in assisting with any job to assist the welfare of cricket. Was Treasurer of the Junior Association at the time of his sad departure, John had also been a nominee for Life-membership, and would have possibly been accepted had our Final Council Meeting not lapsed.

To relatives and friends of the above loved ones the Association extends its sympathies to you in your sad bereavement, "Vale John".

B1 Miranda R.S.L. 40 points and Minor Premiers, Evoca 36, Gynea Bay 34, Jannali 30.

Semi-Finals: Miranda R.S.L. met Gynea Bay, Evoca met Jannali.
Results, R.S.L. defeated Gynea Bay, Evoca defeated Jannali.

B2 North Cromulla 47 points and Minor Premiers, Engadine 43, Jannali 28, Sylvania Heights 26.

Semi-Finals: North Cromulla met Jannali, North Cromulla winning, and Engadine met Sylvania Heights, Engadine winning this game.

Summary: All games were evenly contested and certainly had an atmosphere about them that was tense and truly competitive.

Next to the Finals: Woollooware met Miranda Rangers in the A1, to anyone able to witness this game, especially in the closing stages would agree that the inauguration of the Finals into this Shire was producing the kind of cricket that really is interesting and the possible forerunner of better things from the game. Miranda Rangers won a keenly contested Final.

A2 Final Southern United and Engadine were having a grand tussle at Woollooware Oval, the game fluctuating in turn and was anyone's game right through, a keenly contested game with Engadine finally becoming the victors.

B1 Division: Miranda R.S.L. met Evoca this game as many others do, had its changes of misfortune in turn, but Evoca with a good all round display took the honours.

B2 Division: North Cromulla met Engadine and Engadine got right on top on the first day and thence were never headed, looking a very much improved team, during this stage of the competition, also inflicting the first defeat of the season to the strong North Cromulla side.

So to the Grand Finals: Miranda Rangers looking a good side now met the Minor Premiers at Woollooware Oval Sutherland School of Arts in the A1. Rangers batting first gathered a good score on the first day, and put the pressure right on the batting strength of School of Arts for the second Saturday. However School of Arts under pressure, with good bowling, and fielding, could not rise to the occasion, this game in quality did not reach the same standard as the Final, when with fifteen minutes left for play, either team still had a chance to represent in the Grand Final.

Congratulations from the Executive, to all participants of the A Grade sides, for Miranda Rangers who combined like a team to win this seasons A1 Division, I feel this side will do a lot to raise the standard of cricket within the Shire.

A2 Division: Miranda Magpies met Engadine at Seymour Shaw Park, on the first Saturday Magpies had scored well, and Engadine felt they would be thoroughly tested in their chase after runs and would need all the batting concentration to pull this game around.

Engadine were in trouble early but in the closing stages pulled the game around almost in their favour, when time ran out.

Mrs. Broughton, School of Arts scorer for the A1 side, continues to dominate this award for the neatness and correctness, not really easy with a couple of little girls to give an eye to, we are ever thankful to the ones who assist in this manner, our game is better for their effort.

A2 Grade - Mr. Jack Marston, Miranda Magpies, excelled in this Division gaining four of the six trophies, namely Batting Average 78.66, Batting Aggregate 472 runs, Bowling 14.38, All-rounder 68.2 points, I'm sure everyone would be happy to join me in saying this is a grand performance, heartiest congratulations to Jack Marston.
