I have much pleasure in submitting for your consideration and adoption, the Fifteenth Annual Report dealing with the activities of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, during the season completed 1961-62.

Thirty teams affiliated and 557 players were registered during the season, this being an increase of six teams the previous year, it is a satisfying stimulant to record progress such as this, and only hope the upward trend continues.

In recording the six new teams I feel a word of congratulations may be well spent in their direction, as four of the teams were entirely new Clubs into this Association.

Wononora R.S.L. graded into the B2 Division performed well on the field attended to all correspondence from the Association promptly, had a reasonably good Delegate attendance at the Association meetings, and completed the season, with full honours, and from all accounts enjoyed their Cricket immensely, many thanks "Bill Coloqhoun" for your co-operation, hope you will be with us in the coming season.

Carrington, with all players registered unknown to the Executive were graded B2, did not come up to the expectations of the "Dark Horses" but enjoyed the game here, and from all accounts were well accepted by the opposition, Andrew and Cris Cunningham attended the Association meetings, also attended the Junior Union meetings, which is well worth the Executives' thanks.

Caringbah Baptist were also considered the "Dark Horses" in this Grade Bl a very good side, and nearly took this division, very capably handled during the season, a fine team of sportsmen, we look forward to another season with you.

Sutherland Tigers filled the vacancy in the Bl division made when the St. Patrick's team objected to their grading, and in protest withdrew. Much work went into my endeavours to try and retain this team in this Division but my efforts were in vain. I thus turned to some way of saving a bye, which in many ways spoils Competitions. In defence of a newly formed Club mostly boys, I would say the team gave a good account of the ability that lay therein and had many good games, it will not be very long before some of these "Tigers" will be commanding respect as they gain that team spirit, we thank all our opponents for the consideration shown to us, and the sporting manner in which the games were played, my thanks also to the Jannali Club who allowed us the use of their second kit.

Engadine Hotel Cricket Club, would I think, be the most improved Club in the last few years, three teams in this year's Competitions, won the Al Grade, performed well in the Bl, and was a very much improved team at the end of the Competition in B2.

The Club fell down a little on its representation at the Association meetings, this I feel is paramount in the correct functioning of any Club.

Well done Engadine on winning the Al Competition, and in providing the Association with players for the Inter-Association matches.

Congratulations to Miranda Magpies winners of the A2 Grade, completely in control during the early stages of this Competition, gaining a big break on the other teams, but came back to the others quickly when defeated some two or three times in the second round, giving speculation as to their earlier success, eventually proved they were every bit as good as did appear, some worthwhile talent in this side for Al Grade.

Many thanks from the Executive for your share in providing players for the Inter-Association fixtures, my thanks also to Jack Marston for attending meetings of the Sutherland District Club on my behalf.

Miranda R.S.L. Club won the Bl Division well, were always a good side, had some very close games, but proved their superiority with good team understanding and applied the pressure at the right time.

Frank Jackson did a fine job throughout the season, on the field of play, and also excelled with full attendance marks at the Association meetings. Congratulations to Miranda R.S.L. in winning this division from the Executive and participants, my own thanks to you Frank for your cooperation, your effort certainly made my task easier.

From the Executive and players in the B2 division, congratulations to the Sutherland School of Arts team for your fine win in this division, only a young team in to gain experience, but finished up tops, and their win would be the most popular in all the Grades.

The School of Arts is to be complimented also in looking to the future by assisting these boys who in some cases are still participating in the Saturday Morning Competition. The Manager, Mr. Kevin Killey, exploited their ability and keenness expertly, also managed the C.S. Watson Shield Team, so to Kevin Killey goes the pride of place all over for mine, I have pleasure I'm sure on behalf of all, saying thank you for a job well done.

To the Clubs who were not so fortunate this season in some way, commiserations, we hope you have enjoyed the cricket, that your grading was satisfactory, and mostly you will all be with us next year.

Many thanks to the valiant efforts of our Umpires, who although few in numbers gave good service wherever allotted to games, we hope you can build up your strength for season 1962-63, thanks to Wally Thompson the Secretary of the Umpires League, co-operated with me on the redraw and redraw. Wally has carried out his duties to everyone's satisfaction, so in conclusion, we are extremely grateful for the support, we wish you all good health and good Umpiring for many more years.

To the Associate Members who were responsible for the election of the Executive Committee, and official office bearers, I must compliment you on your choice, your committee has worked as a very happy team throughout the year, with keenness and enthusiasm, handled the many upsets with the draw, changing of grounds, but must feel very happy about a job well done. I compliment the Executive as one for your co-operation, there were certainly some upsets, mainly the ground position but many thanks for the manner that all helped me to overcome these unhappy incidents to our cricket.

#### GROUNDS.

Firstly in my comment regards the playing areas in this Shire comes a shock I think to most enthusiastic cricketers, to the effect that I firmly believe our Council is endeavouring to rectify quickly the deplorable state of some of the cricket grounds in this Shire.

Forgetting the inconvenience to us during season 1961-62 when we lost ground after ground to the progressive step of top dressing of some Ovals, this will be of great benefit to our cricket in season 1962-63, for which we must at least be thankful.

Whilst any progress is considered worthwhile, it would help the Association in the early stages of the year, if when we tender for a ground Council could advise us that a particular ground may be required for top dressing or such improvement, so that a reservation may be included in our draw to meet such.

## JUNIOR ASSOCIATION

Once again on behalf of my Executive and members of the Association may I express and endorse all our humble thanks to your Committee for the successful season just concluded 1961-62.

Having the winning C.S. Watson Shield team proves what a good job you are doing for cricket in this Shire, we only hope for your continued support in this direction.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Initial registrations for grading were 432, this took place immediately in A Grade 6 teams and 73 made up from Engadine Hotel 11, Sutherland School of Arts 11, Miranda Rangers 11, Woolooware 16, North Cronulla 12, Cronulla 12.

A2 Grading 8 teams and 106 made up from Miranda Magpies 11, Southern United 12, Sutherland Evoca 16, St. Patrick's 13, Gymea Bay 11, Cronulla Caringbah Leagues Club 12, Heathcote 16, North Cronulla 15.

B1 Grading 8 teams and 114 made up from Miranda R.S.L. 11, Caringbah Baptist 13, Engadine Hotel 15, Miranda Rangers 14, Gymea Bay 12, Jannali 14, Southern United 16, Sutherland Tigers 19.

B2 Grading 8 teams and 139 made up from Sutherland School of Arts 14, Sylvania Heights 13, Sutherland U.S. Club 30, Woronora R.S.L. 23, Sylvania Congs 18, Miranda R.S.L. 16, Engadine Hotel 14, Carrington 11.

Further registrations throughout the season were 145, making a grand total of 557, coming from Al Grade 18, A2 Grade 52, Bl Grade 36, B2 Grade 39.

The St. Patrick's Club nominated a second team for grading, but owing to dissatisfaction with their Bl grading withdrew, and the Sutherland Tigers were accepted in this vacancy.

The addition of the 6 new teams in comparison to season 1960-61, is indeed heartening, as any one likes to see progress made and in this growing Shire it is something we look forward to.

W. Wakely Tramway v. Sylvania, secured the 14 wickets which fell Season 1930-31. On first day he took 10 for 40 and scored 110 runs, in the same afternoon. On the second day he took the 4 wickets that fell, before rain stopped play. This is without a doubt the greatest performance ever recorded in the history of the Association.

In ten matches, season 1930/31, W. Wakely scored 579 runs at an average of 41.35, and took 76 wickets at an average of 9.79.

In the 1929/30 season the first three batsmen for Sutherland all scored centuries in the same innings: W. Wakely 103, A. Eagles 126 n.o., and J. Baker 103.
