Mr. President and Gentlemen,

It affords me much pleasure to submit for your consideration and approval, this our Sixteenth Annual Report and Balance Sheet, dealing with as much of the activities of the Association during 1962-63 as is possible, and I hope your adoption.

It is my privilege to congratulate the winners of respective Divisions, on behalf of all members of the Association, according to the point score most of the Divisions were very keenly contested, this certainly gives some credit to the men who take on the thank-less job of grading. It is not every Club that gives sufficient information in the early stages, please assist here, especially where new men are joining your Club.

We must also take into consideration the upsets caused with the loss of grounds, some teams were effected much worse than others, Sunday fixtures took over from the required Saturday afternoons Cricket, our winning A1 team Woollooware stood up to this alteration many times, other Clubs had to fall in line also or give up the game, but we all proved the game is greater than anything else by our determination to play Cricket at all costs.

How we eventually concluded the competitions was only due to everyone doing the right thing when asked, sometimes things went a little astray, but you have your Executive to thank for overcoming these difficulties, and they always ruled rightly and wisely.

In A1 Grade the Police team performed very capably, finishing fourth in their first season against our more seasoned teams was a meritorious effort, and on many occasions were commended on their fine showing of sportsmanship.

A2 Grade - a tight tussle here with three teams, with the last Competition game to decide the issue, Southern United lasting long enough to gain a first innings win over the Leagues Club, and Gynea Bay right behind them. Caringbah Baptist up from B1 Grade in their second season proved a good side, and were always around the money, would like to see some improvement in Association Meetings here.

B1 Grade again three teams vying for supremacy and the last Competition game to decide the issue, and the first days play washed out, two leaders playing each other, what a situation, those who have played under these conditions know only too well the stress and strain required, Sylvania Heights' combining well under these conditions prevailed over Engadine Hotel, who accepted defeat still trying.

The Sutherland School of Arts team up from B2 last season and Premiers of that Grade, gave a very good account of their prowesses, earnt the respect of all their opponants, and with two good days of Cricket may have changed the position, but all respects to the ultimate winners. Sutherland United Services Club almost in B1 Grade in the initial grading held on tenaciously to their slender lead, and confused all speculators with an outright win in the

last day of the Competition, as the first day had been washed out, commiserations to Sylvania Congs, and Engadine Hotel, who provided ample opposition.

Here in this Grade a team was formed to offset a bye, Woollooware, Mr. Ken Murphy worked hard to gather a team together and they did a grand job, but in reference to the bye this was not avoided, as the De La Salle team withdrew at the last moment, we hope that they consider joining us in the coming season.

Caringbah C.Y.O. - first year with us although well down in this Grade would have given a much better performance in the lower Grade, with a year's experience, will be harder next year.

Miranda R.S.L. may also appreciate a drop in Grade, were always triers.

In B3 Grade Woronora R.S.L. just missing grading in B2 Division, proved too strong in most cases for their opposition, but can be readily said many of their games were keenly contested, and the point score amassed proved R.S.L. had plenty up in reserve.

Como Hotel acquitted themselves with honours, would be very hard to beat if left in this grade next year, could become a stronger combination after a season's cricket together.

Sutherland Tigers and Sylvania Heights' had a good tussle on each meeting, the teams were very even, but the matter of fact is they enjoyed the game. Gynea Bay the early Competition leaders, did not keep up the pressure, and finished much lower in the table than was expected.

Carrington on all reports was the unlucky team, being affected mostly with the continued upset of draw and Sunday cricket, being outside the Shire, but all teams have given credit to Carrington for their good showing of sportsmanship.

All Clubs did a good job by sticking to their guns, and playing cricket when and where it was possible, to all my sincere thanks for your full co-operation under extreme difficulties.

I feel it is here that I must offer my thanks to my wife who did a lot of work for the Clubs, and whenever they rang the message was generally conveyed resulting in the Clubs being able to make arrangements for their respective games, from all Clubs and members of the Association our heartfelt thanks for your assistance during a very upset season.
