To these gentlemen I express my thanks, particularly to our Secretary - Rex King, our Treasurer - Russ Luxford, Assistant Secretary - Ken Broughton, and Recorder - Sonny Cooper.

In conclusion, may I state that I have thoroughly enjoyed the past year and appreciate your confidence in me by electing me to such an honoured position.

I give me much pleasure to offer on behalf of all, congratulations to all the Competition winners of each Division for season 1963-64. Of all Divisions decided I think B1 took pride of place for the main interest as a conclusion.

The game in question was Miranda Rangers, the ultimate winners, vs. Engadine Hotel, who put up a mighty performance, going down fighting as they did last season, in a game such as this.

Engadine have become renowned for a great fighting team, it will not be long before they receive their just rewards, and take a lower Division grade, plus offering plenty of opposition in the main grade.

In A1 Engadine ended up fairly easy winners, as their superiority gained the ascendancy, with name bowlers such as J. Phillips, and Ray Dunn, they will be a formidable side for another few seasons to come. B. Bain proved a very astute Captain, well supported by Ray Noakes and a very good fielding side.

I predict Southern United as the likely team to upset the present Premiers, the season just concluded in A1 will fit them well for another solid season, they had some mighty performances to their credit last season, and will be around the money next year.

The new teams in this season had I feel, a good time in their respective divisions, Sutherland Cronulla Methodist had some good games, were well received, and a credit to the game here.

Good to see a member of this team take an Association trophy, R. Wishart took out the all-rounder of A2, a commendable performance with 97.4 points, just beating our President Mr. Jackson by a small margin.

Another new-comer in the Caringbah Church of Christ won the B2 division rather easily, but state many of the opposition had them in the bag occasionally, only to let them escape.

M. Titterton performed with great distinction, scored 731 runs, taking the Association aggregate, whilst R. McDonald took the bowling average with 10.6, and as the other Church team, attended the monthly meetings regularly.

Cronulla R.S.L. in their first season performed creditably, and with a little more luck, would have given the B3 division a bit of a shake.

J. Willis attended the Association meetings, and kept the Club well informed, and did a good job with this young side.

W. Evans playing for the Sylvania Congs, scored 855 runs most in any grade for the season, quite a good performance, and continues to show good form with the bat.

A lot could be said of the Jannali B3 side, capably handled by N. Druery who scored 674 runs, at the very good average of 61.27 well backed up by young P. Morris, who captured 62 wickets at the very good average of 7.32 a young side and really excelled in the field.

N. Hickson performed well for Como in the B1 division, captured 56 wickets at the very good average of 10 per wicket, is not untidy with the bat either, has been a big help as a Committeeman also, attended some meetings with me to the N.S.W.J.C. Union, thanks a lot Nev.

To all the Association trophy winners for season 1963-64 congratulations from the Executive and all members, I sincerely hope that the trophies purchased were to your liking.

I am indebted to Mr. and Mrs. Frank Jackson, who so capably at a very short notice took on the big job of purchasing the Association trophies, I feel all will join me in saying these were well chosen, and must have brought delight to the lucky winners.

I take this opportunity to apologise for not being able to attend, my wife tenders herapologies also, and thinks it was very inconsiderate of her operation to play up at such a late hour, thus keeping me at her side, whilst awaiting the doctor.

It is a pity that the evening lacked the support of the Clubs again, this is unfair to the ones who endeavour to organise something, accepted at a Council meeting, then not supported, I doubt that anyone would be interested in running another Presentation night.

Our heart felt thanks to Mr. Merv Smith who again ran the function successfully as the M.C. I heard from some who attended, and said they had a wonderful time.

To the Committee of the Junior Association and the delegates, may I express on behalf of my Executive and members, our sincere thanks to you all for the completion of yet another successful season - 1963-64.

To all the Clubs and their hard working secretaries our humble thanks for a job so well done, to the men who go with the lads on each Saturday morning, Umpire, lay mats in all ensure that the game will be played, many thanks also.

The resignation of Mr. Jack Moodie so regretfully accepted, was a big blow to the Junior Committee, we ourselves could not see how this responsible position would be filled, but I am thankful to say that Mr. Mort Edson, is filling the position very capably, our good wishes to you Mort in this important executive spot.

We hope that Jack and his wife are enjoying better health now.



FROM AROUND AND ABOUT:

A1 ENGADINE HOTEL a good Premier-ship side, and the top laurels will be hard to wrestle from them in the next couple of seasons, ask them.
