Claverie performed the most unique statistics for this Association, in 1964-65 season for Gyma Rexonians in taking 116 wickets, embracing three hat tricks, also with 7 for 1 versus Woollooware two hat tricks, the side being dismissed for 14 runs. He bowled 3.4 overs in doing this. Took his 10 wickets in 8.5 overs. Versus Jannali 9-38 including the hat trick off 9 overs, in the 1st innings and 6-15 including the hat trick in 6 overs, in the 2nd innings.

W. Wakely Trumwey v. Sylvania, secured the 14 wickets which fell Season 1930-31. On first day he took 10 for 40 and scored 110 runs in the same afternoon. On second day he took the 4 wickets that fell, before rain stopped play. This is without a doubt the greatest performance ever recorded in the history of the Association.

In ten matches, season 1930-31, W. Wakely scored 579 runs at an average of 41.35, and took 76 wickets at an average of 9.79.
