H. Claverie performed the most unique statistics for this Association, in 1964-65 season for Gymea Rexonians in taking 116 wickets, embracing three hat tricks, also with 7 for 1 Versus Woolooware two hat tricks, the side being dismissed for 14 runs. Versus Janali 9-38 including the hat trick off 9 overs, in the lat innings and 6-15 including the hat trick in 6 overs, in the 2nd innings.

W. Wakely Tramway v. Sylvania, secured the 14 wickets which fell Season 1930-31. On first day he took 10 for 40 and scored 110 runs in the same afternoon. On second day he took the 4 wickets that fell, before rain stopped play. This is without a doubt the greatest performance ever recorded in the history of the Association.

In ten matches, season 1930-31, W. Wakely scored 579 runs at an average of 41.35, and took 76 wickets at an average of 9.79.

In the 1929-30 season the first three batsmen for Sutherland all scored centuries in the same innings: W. Wakely 103, A. Eagles 126 n.o., and J. Baker 103.
