It is once again a pleasure for me to present to you for your information, consideration and adoption, this our TWENTY - FIRST Annual Report and Financial Statement, of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association 1967 - 68.

Just TWENTY - ONE years ago this association was re-formed after a lapse of some ten years, the original association being founded in 1921. Between 1912-21 many matches were played between residents of this Shire against teams from the St. George area and it is on record also that the Sutherland Shire made approaches to the N.S.W Cricket Association to accept a second grade side, but these were unfortunately rejected. There-in lies another story, one which I would like to see recorded in a book some day.

To my Executive who have given me the greatest of co-operation may I say THANK YOU one and all. Of our President Frank Jackson may I say how much I appreciate his interest in cricket in general. Ken Murphy, terrific service to the association. Jack Edwards who has for many years given outstanding assistance in so many matters which arise in a growing association as ours. I value representation on our behalf at Junior Union meetings is one we should appreciate and we look with interest to his reports. It has been my pleasure to nominate Jack as a Life-member of this Association for his service to this Association during the past ten years. Russ Luxford as always gives great service sometimes without the assistance from some Club secretaries, Dave Collins, Les Fisher, Vic Dwyer, have also given good service sound judgement as Executive Officers.

The Executive sincerely hope the new Clubs that joined us for the first time had an enjoyable season, we congratulate the winning teams and trophy winners, we express our thanks to many people who in some small way gave the Association their support, which all in all made it the successful season that it was.

In the Boys Competition our congratulations on a very successful season. Our winning of the Harold Moore Shield was indeed great satisfaction to us and the Associations congratulations to this team and to all your lads who supported the Inter-association Competition. Mums and Dads who travelled with the team, a big thank you from this Association and its Executive.

Our inter-association teams competed for the Martin Shield, Daily Telegraph Shield and John Durham Shield in what I may say was possibly our most successful season. The Martin Shield team won 2 matches and lost 2 matches but performed much better than this result indicates. Stars there were, but their greatest attribute was that they played as a team. The Final Vs St. George at Sutherland did not portray the full ability of our side, so on that day we must say St. George was the better side, and were worthy Premiers. Individually it is hard to say one or another deserves special mention, yet we must congratulate Peter Keenehan in the manner he handled the side, Brian Gorman a courageous bowler taking 30 wickets in four matches, Jimmy Allen a dashing century, Phill Cawre magnificent in every department of the game, Andy Cover a brilliant performance at Eastwood 73 n.o. 1st inns; 32 n.o. 2nd inns; including three sixes, K. McIlveen always solid, Greg Dunstan did well, but really a team effort.

The John Durham one of the best inter-association sides ever put together played as a team, Captained by Barry McManus a great sportsman and a credit to the Association, as were all his supporting players, Robert Rushbourne more than a handy cricketer this fellow (a terrific 90 in the final) who performed well throughout the series, Kel Symons a beautiful 100 n.o. We were more than pleased with your come back after injury. K. Edson kept faultlessly, got some runs when needed too, Col Sorrenson had a good series also got runs, Barry Griffin provided solid support, Johnny Brayne keeps them all in a happy mood, his spinners upset the opposition though, Jimmy Williams quite a handy lad in any way that's required, Grahame Winson unable to be with us all the series still had a good match taking 7/41 1st inns; 3/29 2nd inns against Manly, Geoff Hiltzinger played some good knocks, Ken Edmunds did all that was asked of him, has a pretty stiff defence if a little awkward to look at. The team was well handled by Ken Murphy their Manager. Congratulations from Association Members and the Executive.

Finally may I add an expression of thanks to Jim Goulder recently retired from office, for those years of service to the Junior Union also to the office bearers of the Junior Union and to the Shell Company for the conduct of the Inter-Association fixtures.

HON. RECORDER'S REPORT

Mr. President & Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure I submit for your perusal and adoption my report dealing with averages and statistics.

My congratulations to the Premier Teams and winners of averages.

It is pleasing to note the excellent performances of our younger players, many of whom figured in the averages. Most of these boys are members, or former members of the Boys' Association.

Seventeen years old Leon Bunker of the Kirrawee Club joined the rare band of players with a hundred wickets in a season. He captured 104 wickets including a hat trick, seven wickets in an innings on four occasions, scored 408 runs including two unbeaten centuries, and figured in two highest wicket partnerships. He capped a fine all round performance by taking thirteen catches.

I feel this report would not be complete without offering my thanks to those members who phoned results of matches to me each week. The response was much better than in previous seasons. On the debit side many scorebooks were not complete, and only fourteen books showed details of highest wicket partnerships, and those published in this report are not necessarily the highest. In addition many books gave no indication or details of the wicket keeper.

Our efforts to have results published in the Sydney Morning Herald despite requests to the Sporting Editor met with little success, and it was reluctantly decided to discontinue this avenue of publicity.

The St. George & Sutherland Shire Leader, and The Observer were most co-operative, publishing full reports each week, and our thanks are recorded to the Sporting Editors of these newspapers.

The Leader in conjunction with the Daily Telegraph donated a cricket bat each week for any player under the age of nineteen who recorded any outstanding performance. Although several players were nominated, none were successful.

In conclusion, I feel the past season will be noted for the very closely contested competitions, and the abundance of talent displayed by the growing number of younger players.
