HONORARY RECORDER'S REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen.

It is my pleasure to submit for your approval and adoption, my report pertaining to team and individual awards.

I would like to record my congratulations to Premier Teams and winners of individual awards.

Engadine Dragons had a well deserved win in the A.1 Grade, but before emerging as Premiers were closely pressed by Southern United and Sutherland United Services.

Caringbah Leagues came from behind to take out the A.2 Competition and Sylvania Heights with an eight-points lead up to round 7 could not sustain their effort and lost six successive matches.

Caringbah De La Salle eventually emerged as B.1 Grade Premiers following a close tussle with Caringbah Sports and Sutherland Grays Point who finished very strongly, winning the last three matches.

The B.2 Competition was the most closely contested and St. Patricks (Premiers) virtually played a Grand Final in the last round defeating second place-getters Kirrawee, to take out the competition by the narrow margin of one point.

Caringbah Sports had no difficulty winning the B.3 Competition, losing only two matches, and amassing 100 points, a clear lead of 33 points over their nearest rivals, Willarong Rovers.

Fifteen years old Ian Stephen from the Willarong Rovers Club recorded a fantastic batting average to take out the B.3 average. His full figures were - 670 runs, 7 ins. 4 n.o. fo an average of 95.70. He also secured 23 wickets including a hat trick, and had he taken another two wickets would have qualified for the ALL ROUNDER Award.

"Evergreen" Ray Noakes from Engadine Dragons again figured prominently in the awards, taking out the batting average, and All Rounder Award. A batting average of 67 from 739 runs is a most noteworthy achievement, particularly in the A.1 Grade.

Ken Strong, Sutherland United Services also recorded a meritorious effort with an aggregate of 783 runs, including the highest score of the season of 164.

Southern United A.1 Team established an Association record for the fifth wicket of 162 (5 sundries) in 84 minutes with Niel Last 104, and Graham Chudliegh 53.

I am very pleased to report the vast improvement in the 'phoning of results of matches to me each week. I realise that members often had to wait for long periods when my 'phone was encaged and I would like to record my thanks for their tolerance and courteous manner. The allosted times for the 'phoning of match results had to be seriously curtailed in order to forward "copy" to the Sunday Telegraph before 8 p.m. each Saturday evening and at times it became rather heetic, but the effort was well exercise weekle.

The publishing of the results in a National Newspaper was a great sucess (publicity wise) and met with the approval of all members.

On behalf of the Association our sincere thanks are recorded to the Sporting Editors of the Sunday Telegraph and St. George and Sutherland Shire Leader for their cooperation.

In conclusion I would like also to record my thanks to Committeeman Alan McKillop for attending to my duplicating requirements, and also Alan Grover, of the Gymea Bay Club who delivered all copy to the offices of the St. George and Sutherland Shire Leader.
