#### HON. RECORDER'S REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen;

Herewith my report for the 1969/1970 season:

The season just concluded will be noted for the closeness of the competition particularly in the A2 Grade. With only three rounds to be played in this grade, anyone of six teams could have taken out the Competition. Caringbah Sports were in sixth position with three rounds to be played, at this stage being 16 points behind the leading team Miranda Rangers. The team won its last three matches outright to finish one point ahead of Miranda Rangers, beating the Rangers in the last round.

Three players stood out in the individual performances; Bruce Boxsell for the Gymea Bay team in the A2 Competition, Tom Squires for the Sutherland-Grays Point Team in the B1 Competition and Jim Williams for the St. Patricks team, also in the B1 Competition.

Bruce Boxsell is a forceful left hand bat and opening right arm bowler. He had one of his best seasons scoring 694 runs with an average of 46.2 to earn him the Batting Average and Batting Aggregate Trophies. He also took 39 wickets to clinch the All-Rounder Trophy with 108 points.

Tom Squires, who is almost reaching the veteran stage, had a fine season, taking 90 wickets for an average of 6.08. This fine achievement helped considerably to place his team at the top of the Competition. Tom won the Bowling Average and Bowling Aggregate Trophies in his grade.

Jim Williams took out 3 trophies in his grade, the Batting Average and Batting Aggregate Trophies and the All Rounder Trophy with 93.8 points. Jim is the opening batsman for St. Patricks and earns praise for his performance during the season.

Engadine Dragons "pulled off" a good double in winning the A1 and the E3 Premierships. The effort of the B3 team was meritorious as the team was composed almost entirely of lads 16 years and under.

Once again we received good coverage of match results in the St. George and Sutherland Leader and The Sunday Telegraph. Cur thanks to those papers.

My thanks also to those members who regularly phoned the results of their matches each week.
