Bruce was an active member of the Gynea Bay A1 side and this year won the bowling average of that grade. He was on the selection panel of the association, and always helped the association in any way he could. The loss to cricket at such an early age is a great blow to all. Vale Ed and Bruce.

HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow cricketers,

How pleased I am to report on a most successful season during my first term in office as Secretary. I soon learned that this position is vastly different to my former office as assistant secretary to Doug Bray.

The executive was called upon to deal with a variety of administrative matters and every member was forthright in putting forward his views and ideas. In the result our association has again offered well organised cricket to the game's exponents throughout the Shire.

MEMBERSHIP

Perhaps the saddest part of the season's start was the absence of the Woolooware club, formerly a strong stalwart of our sport. Business and other commitments called some of that club's long standing names and regrettably it did not offer a team after a long membership with our association.

Despite the loss of this club, the overall club affiliations increased with the addition of Gynea Footballers Cricket Club with a team in A2, and Sutherland Royal Hotel Cricket Club with a team in B3. The number of teams increased also with 54 compared with last season's 52. The number of registered players grew slightly from 913 to 921.

With the England team, currently showing some success at home, due to visit Australia during the coming season no doubt our membership will increase some more.

GROUNDS

The increased number of players and teams meant a tight schedule with all available pitches being utilized, though some of them were not as adequate as we should like for competition games. Headmasters of local high schools have intimated their willingness to make available school sports grounds for Saturday cricket and the Sutherland Shire Council has undertaken to carry out development and pitch laying in conjunction with Education Department representatives.

GRADING

Always a difficult task, but effectively and fairly carried out by the executive on the information made available to it by club secretaries. Strict compliance with registration details helped in the assessment of teams' and players' potential. Firm action taken in the preceding season has had the desired result and team affiliations and player registrations were submitted in accordance with the agreed timetable.

SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

I have the honour of being our association's representative on this important body. I attended every meeting and am glad to be able to report that cricket's voice was heard both in praise and criticism of the council, as the occasion demanded. The Sutherland Shire Council has co-operated with our association to the fullest extent and without that attitude prevailing it would not have been possible to complete our season as scheduled. The council's work programme heavily affected ground availability last season and the proposed work for the coming season suggests as many or more ground problems as in the past.

I pay a warm tribute to Mr. Denis Walker, a council officer, for his kind ear and tireless efforts to overcome not only the problems of our sport as they involve council but also every other sport in this area. The approach adopted by Denis is one which is worthy of his being hailed as a true public relations officer. Also cricket is indebted to Eugene Morris and Joe Starkey, also council officers, for their understanding and assistance.

The chairman of the Sports Advisory Committee, Councillor Bill Sibley, again let the meetings through many problems and assisted all sports and interests beyond expectations. Bill's representations and work on behalf of cricket have helped us immeasurably.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

It has been quite enjoyable working with all members of our executive and I can unhesitatingly assure all cricketers that their interests were in good hands during the past season. The executive comprises of members with varied interests and points of view, and collectively these outlooks provide maximum benefit for our sport.

I offer my thanks for real assistance given me by assistant secretary, John Bannon. His help and advice has been given willingly and was truly appreciated.

I enjoyed the privilege of visiting all but one of the finals and saw several exciting finishes. The results in all finals except B1 and A2 were amazingly close, indicative of hotly contested competitions. The finals were somewhat clouded by a dispute arising out of the A1 match and after protest and appeal considerations the matter was resolved by the New South Wales Junior Cricket Union and a joint premiership awarded.

1974 - 75 SEASON

In an endeavour to increase competition and broaden interest in cricket, I have approached our neighbouring St George Association with a proposition to amalgamate our A1 competition with theirs. That association accepted the proposal with keen enthusiasm and it is hoped that this coming season our top four A1 teams will merge with the St George top four A1 teams in a competition to be played on a home and away basis. If this proposal is successful it is thought that our second top four teams might similarly be matched next season.

There is no doubt that our A1 competitions will benefit by this innovation. Also, it will mean a mixing of other grades and inject additional interest into all competitions. All club secretaries have been notified of these possibilities and many have responded with enthusiastic support.

CLUB OFFICIALS

I have received full co-operation from club secretaries and officials and I am grateful to them for easing my task. On behalf of the incoming association executive I invite clubs to study the timetable set out under this report and adhere strictly to the dates and times therein, thus assisting at the busiest and most important part of the cricket administrators' year.

HON. RECORDER'S REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

Once more I am pleased to be in the position to deliver the recorder's report, and again this report contains something different from other years. For the first time I have included partnerships for the season. I am not sure whether or not there are any records of partnerships in this association, so any claims to records must be made at a later date if it is the wish that they be carried on.

The teams trophies are as stated in the secretaries report, and the finals are set out in full in latter pages.

The individual trophy winners as set out may be seen to be different to the personal performances, as these trophies are awarded under terms of the constitution, and any scorebook handed in after the date set down by the executive is not considered in any trophy. R. Pallister of the Jannali A3 team was the most successful of the trophy winners taking three in all.

There were some fine performances in all grades as will be seen by study of the personal performances, but it would be amiss if I did not point out that the winner of the A1 bowling average Bruce Boxsell only played half the season, but won this trophy easily taking 31 wickets at the remarkable average of 5.67. As is well known by now, this fine cricketer died early this year, and his loss to the game both as a player and an administrator, will be felt by all who knew him.

It was difficult during the season to obtain maximum publicity, firstly because of change in attitude to junior sport of the Sunday Papers, and because of the paper shortage. However, we were kindly treated by the St George - Sutherland Shire Leader, and my thanks goes to the sporting editor of this medium.

On the whole the clubs did well in phoning in scores and handing in results, but as usual one or two teams had to be hurried on a bit.

In conclusion I wish to congratulate those successful in winning trophies, but in all cases these were keenly contested and all players had a fine season.

CRICKET

Cricket has been described as a marvellously devious, sometimes subtle game synonymous with chivalrous behaviour, in which patience often is more conspicuous than thrills and tension. Played in variable forms of daylight. Games last from half a day to several days, seldom starting before morning tea time. Venues range from roughly-mown cow paddocks to parks studded with matting-covered concrete or malthoid to vast enclosed stadiums. A game for two cream-clad -- plain white is frowned on -- teams of 11 players (single wicket games are periodically revived), men or women, infants or octogenarians. Australian blind men play it and so do the limbless and spastic. Cricket has a record number of records. For record purposes, a first-class match is "any match over three days or more between teams of 11 players, officially considered first-class."

YABBA

Yabba was for many years well known among cricket spectators, and radio listeners, as cricket's noisiest barracker. Yabba, a Sydney hawker who sold rabbits for a living from a battered two-wheel cart and held court at big matches on The Hill. His voice carried right across the field, rattling against the Members' Stand like a shot from the musket Yabba had carried in the South African war. Yabba died in 1942, aged 64. Many of cricket's standard jibes at players started with him.

ORIGIN OF "THE ASHES"

We have all heard of The Ashes, but how many of us know how this quaint term originated. In 1882, the third Australian team to tour England defeated England at The Oval by seven runs. England wanted 85 runs to win in the last innings. At one stage England needed only 34 with seven wickets left. Spofforth took seven wickets in each innings. The finish was so exciting one spectator dropped dead and another was said to have chewed through the handle of his umbrella. Next day the Sporting Times published the famous obituary notice in which it said the ashes of English cricket would be sent to Australia. Nobody thought much of the notion at the time but it caught the imagination of Ivo Bligh who took a team to Australia immediately afterwards. In a speech at Adelaide he mentioned the Ashes and Australians were puzzled. But the idea caught on and after Bligh's team won the Third Test of that series in Australia a group of girls presented him with an urn containing the ashes of a burnt cricket stump. (Nobody cared about the ashes for another ten years, when the term was revised. It has been in use ever since.) When Bligh died in 1927, his Australian-born wife presented the urn to the M.C.C., where it has remained ever since.

LONG PLAYING SPAN

The Cricketer with the strongest claim to this achievement is Sydney club player Clarrie Hogue, who played for 72 years straight. He began in 1887, retired in 1959, claimed he was never out lbw in that time. It is pretty apparent that some players called upon to umpire in the S.S.C.A. matches are following the same principle. Hogue played for North Sydney first grade from 1915 until 1926, taking 384 wickets at an average of 18.19. He then took charge of North's Shire XI until 1941 when he switched to North's City and Suburban team, for whom he took more than 50 wickets in a season three times.
