I think we gave notice of what we required at each Council meeting so no belly-aches.

My thanks to my executive Committee who in my opinion did a sterling job, although some people did try to hoodwink us.

My congratulations to Bob Davey on being elected as a Life Member of the Association. He has proved a very diplomatic person with Council and other Associations. On behalf of all Cricketers thanks Bob.

## HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow cricketers.

Again it is my privilige and pleasure to report to association members and others interested in our great game. The executive committee had a busy and interesting season and was gratified with the close results for premiership honours, occurring in all but one of the finals.

## MEMBERSHIP

The 1974 - 75 season saw our ranks increase from 920 to 980 players compared with the previous season. However the teams playing in the various competitions decreased by one. The association accepted affiliation from four new clubs, Bundeena R S L, North Engadine, Sutherland Trade Union Club, and Heathcote Services Club. Unfortunatley, it was the reluctant but necessary duty of the executive to remove the North Engadine club from the B4 grade early in the season, and it was fortunate that the Cronulla R S L C.C. was able to enter a team to take up what otherwise would have been a bye.

Indications so far suggest that the coming season will see at least three new clubs and extra teams from existing clubs affiliating with us.

#### **GROUNDS**

The number of teams involved and the grounds available again meant an extremely tight schedule, with few grounds available for emergencies. New grounds at Woolooware High School, Boys' town and Bundeena eased the presure somewhat. The continued co-operation of officers from the Sutherland Shire Council has been the means whereby our competitions have been kept to schedule and our real appreciation is extended to them, especially to Mr. Denis Walker, without whose help a restructuring of games would have become necessary on several occasions.

During the coming season all previous grounds are available, with re located wickets at Captain Cook and Gwawley South and a new ground adjacent to Endevour Field. This ground is owned by Cronulla-Sutherland Leagues Club and has been made available to the association for use in our competition. We are grateful to that organization and our members will certainly put the area to good use. The fibro trial wicket at Bundeena is to be replaced with a concrete wicket.

#### GRADING

Again a difficult task, made even harder by some clubs not getting their teams in until reminded on the night of grading. Three complaints were received from clubs, suggesting that their teams had been graded too high. The executive considered at length the representations made, but did not alter the original assments. Of those three teams, one was a finalist, one missed out on the final only at the last round stage, and the other team performed in a respectable manner, running somewhere in the middle of the point score. These results were most gratifying to executive committee members who had deliberated long in assessing a fair group of gradings.

# SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

I am pleased to report that I attended every meeting of this important body and ensured that crickets! voice was heard in discussions concerning our sport and the general development and running of sport in our Shire.

#### MATTING

Over several seasons matting has become increasingly a major problem. Suitable safe storage has been most difficult to locate in most areas, and continuing problems with keys, removals etc has been encounterred. The loss of mats by stealing caused heavy expense to the association. In a real attempt to overcome these difficulties the executive dicussed the whole matter, and eventually met with representatives from the boys competition. A general meeting of our association referred the matter for discussion to a committee and subsequently a joint recommendation was put to the boys competition, involving the allocation of one mat to each team playing in this Shire. However, the whole executive of the boys' competition rejected the recommendation and instead resolved that all boys games for the coming season should be played on concrete, using plastic balls which simulate turf conditions.

The association will continue with its decission to issue one mat to each team in the afternoon competitions and will make mats available to the boys competitions if and when required for representative matches.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The executive committee, as usual, for the past season was quite strong. The matters requiring deliberation and consideration by executive members were many and varied and engendered some interesting debates. Members may be assured that every point of view is represented on the executive and that these views are put forth without restraints. An executive of this calbre offers excellent administration for our sport.

Assistant Secretary John Bannon was again always available and his council in many matters being considered by me on behalf of the committee has been valued and appreciated.

## APPRECIATION

Again I have received good co operation from club officials, though unfortunatly, there were some exceptions. Communication is vitally important in any organization, and club secretaries who fail to keep their members informed on what is occurring in the association are affecting our efficiency. Club representatation at council meetings has been excellent and more often than not every club had had a voice. I offer my thanks to club officials for their cooperation and assistance.

Appreciation and thanks mst go also to Jim Field, chairman of selectors and Lindsay Joyce, chairman of the mat committee, both of whom have been tireless, interested workers, taking a lot of the load from me. Their efforts and success have been made known to the executive committee and I am pleased to convey these remarks to all cricketers.

Yes! it was the same bloke, and we talked a lot and played many of those old games over many times during the rest of my stay there.

The Young competition was played this year as one day limited over games, including the finals and grand final, the grand final being two innings of 35 overs for each team played over two full days.

John is presently captain of the "Blues" one of three teams of the Services Club of Young, is the President of the Young Cricket Association and the very popular local chemist. He is chairman of the Young Aged Peoples Homes, a very active member of Apex (many a good night spent here) and an A grade squash player; and a friend of almost everyone in the town, so therefore I did not have a dull moment.

In the same Telegraph team that John played, were such names as John Phillips, Reg Courtney, Bernie Apps and a skinny wicket keeper by the name of David Dee. "Hambone" as John Hamblin was called in those days, recalled all these and many others he played with in the Shire and he asked me to convey his regards to all his old team mates.

Well, I have now done that, so it is very true that with all the hospitality afforded me by "Hambore" and his cricketers in Young, I surely never left home.

It will be seen if you compare the outstanding performances, the best of each club, and the individual trophy winners, that the best performer did not always win the trophy. H. Verity, for Yorkshire v. Nottinghamshire, at Leeds, in 1932, took all 10 wickets for 10 runs.

.G.Elliott, for Victoria v. Tasmania, at Launceston, in 1857-58, took 9 wickets for 2 runs.

C.Blythe and H. Verity have both taken 17 wickets in one day.

For the 1878 Australian Team, F.R.Spofforth took 764 wickets at an average 6.08. He took 281 during the preliminary Colonial tour, 326 in England, 69 in America and Canada, and 88 during the final Colonial tour. For the Second Australian Team (1880) Spofforth took 763 wickets at a cost of 5.49 runs each - 130 in the preliminary Colonial tour, 391 in England, and 242 during the final Colonial tour.

The greatest number of wickets taken by a boyler in first-class cricket in a season is 304, by A.P. Freeman, in 1928.

#### OUR COMMENTATOR

The younger members of our association, and indeed many of the older ones too, know the voice of, but not the record of our most famous of all commentators, A.aln McGilvray.

McGilvray was a former New South Wales captain, a left handed batsman, and right handed medium pace bowler. A brilliant close—in fieldsman in front of the wicket and a very safe slips fielder, he represented New South Wales more than twenty times in Sheffield Shield matches and played against overseas touring sides. He captained New South Wales Colts and New South Wales seconds as well. In the 1935 - 36 season, he captained New South Wales in all its first class matches, and played against the visiting English team. In the same season, he headed Sydney's Grade bowling with 32 wickets at an average of 9.43, and the following season he headed the batting, scoring 565 runs at an average of 80.71. At the time of his retirement, only two other men had ever topped both the batting and the bowling lists in Sydney Grade cricket, M.A.Noble and C.G.Macartney.

So now when you hear Alan describing what is going on, you will at least know that he is speaking with a lot of experience.

## Telegraph Shield Report contd.

Along with my team report I take the opportunity to report on some aspects of the team, the grounds and dates for fixtures.

It was a disappointment to the team and I of the non arrival at the ground of some players and not even a word from them. I was notified of the inability of 2 players to attend matches. Trevor Lynch on the 26.12.74 and Mark Johnson on 28.1.75. I did not hear from Trevor Paterson on 1.1.75 or 28.1.75 nor from Trevor Bailey on the 28.1.75. The match of the 28th was all important as our team still had a chance of being in the final, and had to take the field with only 10 players. I feel sure that the selectors warn players of their obligations and I myself stressed the importance to players that if they were not available to let me know as early as possible so that we could field a full team. In the best interest of your Association for future years I ask that this matter be given attention.

There was a general feeling of delight amoung the players of the issue of "caps" before the commencement of the first game. A good idea and hope that this continues.

The grounds available in the Sutherland Shire (Tonkin and Sutherland) were in good condition and earned praise from opposing teams and managers. The Roseville Park Ground was in fair condition with facilities neat and tidy. The Mascot Ground in the opinion of myself, the team and the opposition team was that it was not fit for Telegraph Shield Play. Two wickets side by side had been prepared...take your pick...The two Captains agreed on one and the two managers agreed with them from the point of view that it appeared likely to have less change of being dangerous. Some 35 wickets fell for 220 runs during the day caused mostly by the ball doing all manner of things off the bare ground, the green grass on the "tufts" of roots depending on where it was pitched. I feel that with some improvement the ground may be suitable for Watson Shield play not above.

#### THAT LUCKY TOSS

How many times have we heard that the winning of the toss is the key to who wins the match? Many say that is the case, however here are some interesting features about this subject.

There have been five captains in all Anglo-Australian tests who have won every toss in the series. The Australian captains to do so are M.A.Noble 1909 and A.L.Hassett 1953, both times in england. Noble's team won two tests, lost one whilst the other was drawn. Hassett and his men played four drawn matches and lost the other.

The English captains to do this feat were A.Shaw 1881 - 82, F.S. Jackson 1907 - 08 both in Australia, and W.R.Hammond 1938 in England. Shaw's and Hammond's teams played only four tests. Shaw lost two with two drawn, Jackson won one and lost four, and Hammond won one, lost one and two were drawn.

Australia won eight tosses in a row from the first test in 1909 to the third test in 1911 - 12. Australia won three of these, England won three and the other two were drawn.

England won seven tosses in a row from the third test in 1956 to the fourth test in 1958 - 59. If these, Australia won three, England two with two drawn. The seventh of these tests was won by Australia by ten wickets after being sent in by Peter May.
