SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow Cricketers,

Again I am pleased to present to you a report on the principal events of another successful season.

MEMBERSHIP

The 1975-76 season produced an increase in teams and players well beyond that expected. Registered players' numbers jumped from 980 last season to 1315 this season and the number of teams leaped from 52 in 1974-75 to 68 in 1975-76. Affiliation was accepted from 5 new clubs, Caringbah Inn (2 teams), Engadine Hotel (1), Atomic Energy Commission (1), Port Hacking Rugby (3). Kirrawee, a club of some strength in years gone by, disbanded, though most of its players were taken in by other clubs.

The extra teams necessitated the introduction of two extra grades in our competition.

Indications for the season soon to arrive are that three new clubs will seek affiliation and several existing clubs will submit new teams. Though this increase in popularity of our chosen sport is welcome, its continuation is limited to the availability of wickets or perhaps alternatively the introduction of a Sunday competition - the latter not a happy thought from the administrative point of view.

GROUNDS

With 68 teams and 35 pitches available for the senior competition, the grounds situation was tight throughout the season. Co-operation by Sutherland Shire Council officers ensured that disruption for maintenance purposes was minimal and understanding among association members enabled necessary changes to be effected smoothly.

The association is indebted to Boys' Town for the use of their area at Engadine and we are pleased to have been instrumental in having council assistance made available in relation to this area. We are indebted also to the Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club for allowing association competitive use of the Endeavour II field. Additionally, good use is made of the wicket at Woollooware High School.

We offer our appreciation and thanks for the use of these playing areas.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

Our relationship with the Sutherland Shire Council has always been a good one and the past season saw co-operation and sympathetic understanding to a degree even higher than before. Our principal liaison with the Council is with Denis Walker and Eugene Morris, and their patient counselling and assistance is invaluable. Shire Engineer Eric Hirst and Parks and Buildings Engineer Brian Baker are always unstinting in their willingness to advise and assist. Council's Parks

supervisor Joe Starkey and Caringbah groundsman Garry Lowther worked tirelessly to enable our inter-association finals to be played and their effort was also appreciated. 5.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

At its final council meeting the association bestowed life membership upon two dedicated workers for our sport, John Bannon and Lance Handley. This honour was well earned.

John Bannon has been associated with cricket virtually all his life. He played as a boy in associated school competitions and subsequently in the Sutherland competition. John was co-founder of Caringbah de la Salle cricket club sixteen years ago with boys' teams and eleven years ago with men's teams. He has held the offices of president and secretary of this club and during all this time has been delegate to the association, as well as to the boys' competition. John has been a member of the association executive for some years and was the association delegate to the boys' competition. For the past few years he has been the popular and effective master of ceremonies at our annual presentation dinner. John Bannon has truly earned the honour which the association members have bestowed upon him in making him a life member.

Lance Handley played with the Churches Association until the mid 1960's, when he joined Gympie Bay, where his administrative abilities saw him soon in the position of President. He has occupied in recent years executive positions as Senior Vice-President of the Boys' Association and Committee-man of both the Grade Club and our association. Lance's greatest contribution to the game has been the dedication he has shown in fostering boys' cricket, in which area he has coached and managed teams at all levels.

Lance has given outstanding services to cricket.

GRADING

Always a difficult subject but one which I can assure members is given diligent and long consideration by the executive. The problem is heightened when one becomes aware that after grading, though before the commencement of the second competition match, 200 new players were submitted for registration. This number of players constitutes 18 teams, or an extra 2 grades. Obviously the achievement of fair and equitable grading is virtually impossible under these circumstances if the executive is to pursue its policy of encouraging the advancement of the game and keeping registration refusals to a minimum. I have put some proposals to the executive which have been considered and accepted and will be implemented in the forthcoming season. Details of the new requirements as to gradings will be given, probably at the annual general meeting.

1. FINALS

Prior to the commencement of the season a full council meeting decided that finals would be played for the 1975-76 season, and the draw was arranged accordingly. In the result, no less than four minor premiers were defeated in the finals. Unfortunately most pitches were affected by extremely heavy rain during the preceding week.

Regrettably most of the finals displayed a lack of sportsmanship and the application of what has become known as gamesmanship to an extent hitherto unknown in Sutherland. A continuation of this approach is not, and I am sure that all cricketers will agree, acceptable to us. Because of my direct administrative involvement with these incidents I am personally of the view that finals should be dispensed with and the system of first past the post reverted to in our competitions.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

This important committee, comprising Jim Field as its chairman, David Curtis and Don Stewart would probably agree that in the past season it had better talent one way or another in all three shield groups from which to choose than has been offering for quite some years. In the result the Durham Shield team was strong, though its achievements were not indicative of its real potential; the Martin Shield team missed out on a final place by only 0.02 on a count back; the Daily Telegraph Shield team was successful in winning this highly prized trophy as joint winners following numerous washouts of the final.

REX KING TROPHY

For the first time in seven years - since competition for this trophy began - in the series of matches between the Martin, Daily Telegraph and Durham Shield teams and equivalent teams from the Sutherland District Cricket Club, the association was successful. This breakthrough will no doubt bring added interest to future competition for this trophy.

N.S.W. JUNIOR UNION TEAM

Sutherland was well represented in this team by Greg Fletcher of the Taren Point club. The interstate competition this season was held in Sydney, thus robbing Greg of an interstate trip. However, I have no doubt that his performances in the NSW team will stand him in good stead for further selection in the coming season. Congratulations to Greg and best wishes for more honours in the future.

SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

I am again pleased to report that cricket's voice has been heard at these important meetings. Cricket has co-operated with other sports, both winter and summer, and conciliatory negotiations have occurred wherever possible. However, when necessary, we have stood firm and received welcomed support from the large majority.

The 1976-77 summer season should see less disruption to Saturday competition cricket than has been the case over the past many years. This advancement is due to co-operation between the various sports and an understanding by Sutherland Shire Council of the problems encountered by major organisations such as ours and the need for continuity of field usage and early advice of possible alterations to the availability of grounds.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

As usual our executive proved to be a combination of strong personalities gathered together in the interests of the administration of our chosen sport. Members may remain assured that every possible point of view is represented on their executive committee and that points of view are put forward and considered without fear or favour.

The executive found occasion to invite officials from two clubs and several members from various clubs to attend meetings during the season in order that problems or potential problems might be straightened out.

APPRECIATION

The co-operation received from most clubs has again been excellent, though a minority of clubs have shown a serious lack of internal communication. I offer my thanks to club officials and players for their assistance and look forward to a continuation of this happy relationship.

HONORARY RECORDED'S REPORT

From the players' point of view, the 1975 - 76 season was an enormous success.

Nine grades, 68 teams, 1315 registered players - the figures speak for themselves.

When I took on the job at the beginning of the season, I had no idea of the enormity of it. However, throughout the season I have endeavoured to keep players informed of results, outstanding performances and point scores. No matter how hard I may try to do this, I can only collate and pass on material supplied to me by others.

Most clubs did as I asked and submitted results as required each week. To them, my sincere thanks. To the others who did not bother to co-operate, I would suggest that though you may not be interested in a particular result, I am, and so are many others, as all results have a bearing on the overall competition. In addition, from an administrative point of view it is absolutely essential to be punctual and accurate with information necessary for compiling progressive reports on the competition.

Many scorebooks were kept excellently, especially in the A3 grade, but others were inaccurate and incomplete. Two teams did not submit their books at all, and several others were late in arriving. I am well aware of the amount of time and effort needed to complete a scorebook, but I would remind you of the work involved in checking 68 (66?) of them. This is a pleasure when books are complete.

I would like to thank the members of the executive who gave so willingly of their time to assist with the compilation of this annual report which we present to you tonight. I would like to be informed of any omissions, for which I apologise in advance. We have altered the format slightly to include in the personal performances section the efforts of all players who scored 250 runs or took 25 wickets. We would like also to hear suggestions for future reports.

Congratulations to all premierships winners and to those who gained trophies - in many cases the competition was very keen.

The method of submission of results proved quite satisfactory, and I would like to thank the management and bottle department staff of the hotels where results were left last season, namely Taren Point, Caringbah, Miranda, Boyle's Hotel, Sutherland Royal and Engadine.

I would like to thank the St George and Sutherland Shire Leader, in particular Allan Kelso of the editorial staff for the regular publication of match results.

In conclusion, I would like to say that I have enjoyed my first stint for some years on the executive, and would suggest to all who are critical of this body that you have every opportunity to stand for any position you wish for the 1976 - 77 season, which I trust will be as successful as the one just concluded.
