Special thanks must be offered to those early Executive Officers and dedicated cricketers who started our association in those early years. From their efforts we have achieved our ambitions of having a District Club.

Congratulations are extended to all trophy winners and clubs who have attained their goal by winning the various premierships.

Finally my thanks to my executive committee members who had a very trying year due to bad sportsmanship and some teams not playing the game as it should be played.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow Cricketers,

Again it is my pleasure to present to you a report on the principal events of another season.

MEMBERSHIP

The 1976 - 77 season saw yet a further increase in the number of clubs, teams and players making up our association. Registered players increased to 1363 and teams to 77 - 9 more than last season.

Applications were accepted for affiliation from three new clubs - Bulldogs C.C., Durraneer C.C. and Engadine RSL C.C., each fielding one team. Two clubs, Southern United C.C. and Sutherland District Trade Union C.C. disbanded, though most players went to other clubs.

In just two seasons team strength has increased by no less than 25 and player strength by 400. The nine extra teams this season required an extension of the grades to ten, embracing A1 to A5 and B1 to B5.

Already there are indications of new clubs and extra teams from existing clubs for the coming season. Though this expansion is welcome, it involves real problems in relation to the availability of wickets.

GROUNDS

The availability of wickets was again tight. Co-operation between the association, teams and the council enabled draw alterations - always necessary - to be made smoothly.

Once again the association is indebted to Boys' Town, Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club and Woollooware High School for allowing use of their playing fields.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

The relationship between our association and the Sutherland Shire Council has always been good. Without co-operation, advice and sympathetic consideration from council officers we would not be able to play ten grades involving 77 teams in 14 or 15 rounds plus finals. Denis Walker and Eugene Morris, as always, gave continuing assistance. Shire Engineer, Eric Hurst and Parks and Buildings Engineer Brian Baker provided practical help and invaluable advice. Parks supervisor Joe Starkey and groundsman, Garry Lowther did more than their share to enable our representative matches and inter-association finals to be played.

GRADING

Following continued problems with gradings, due primarily to submission of players' names for late registration, the executive requested clubs to grade their players realistically and informed them that teams would be graded on the ability of the best six players nominated and that players not registered on the original nomination forms would not be eligible to play until

round 4. Members will recall that in the 1975-76 season more than 200 new registrations were submitted after team nominations and before the commencement of round 2, and that a further 250 late registrations were received during the season.

Wet weather, ground conditions and the sun eclipse seemed to combine early in the season to prove the new grading format to be a failure. However, in the result, competitions were closer than in previous seasons and the strict application of the grading requirements was commended by even those who earlier had voiced objection to them.

FINALS

As required by our constitution, prior to the commencement of games a full council meeting decided that finals would be played for the 1976-77 season, and the draw arranged accordingly.

In four of the ten grades minor premiers were defeated in the finals. At a recent extraordinary general meeting notices of motion involving playing semi-finals, not playing finals and providing a right of challenge to defeated minor premiers were all defeated.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

Chaired by executive committeeman Jim Field, this body selected excellent representatives for our Martin, Telegraph and Durham Shield Teams. Each of the teams performed well, though not well enough to win or retain any of the Junior Union's coveted trophies apart from the annual double wicket competition.

REX KING TROPHY

The 1975-76 season saw the association, for the first time since its innovation seven years earlier, win this local series against the Sutherland District Cricket Club. The association's glory was shortlived, as our brother organisation played strongly to win the 1976-77 series quite convincingly in all three games.

NSW JUNIOR UNION TEAM

Sutherland was again represented in this State team by Greg Fletcher of the Taren Point club. Greg performed well in this series played in Adelaide and should be an automatic selection for his third successive cap in the coming season.

SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

This committee offers the forum for friendly discussion between all sports and again cricket was able to agree to requests from other bodies, with only minor inconveniences.

MIRANDA RANGERS CRICKET CLUB

I was pleased to be invited to attend the thirtieth birthday of the Miranda Rangers C.C. some few weeks ago. This strong club, as old as the association since its reformation in 1947, attracted many former players, some originals, to this celebration night. It is perhaps quite fitting that the Rangers have gained A5 premiership honours in this year so important to them.

Congratulations Miranda Rangers !!!

BILL WAKELY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This new and worthwhile perpetual trophy, to be awarded annually for the most outstanding performance in our Martin Shield team, has been made available by the Wakely family in memory of W. (Bill) Wakely, who was a Life Member of our association. Bill's absorbing interest was cricket, and when his playing days were past, he worked on the Committee enthusiastically. His great interest in his later years was in the Martin Shield team, and it is fitting that his family should continue this interest. Players who were too young to have enjoyed the pleasure of Bill's company on the field will at least have the honour to know that he is still with them in spirit.

Bill's performances with both bat and ball, and his way of playing the game were legendary and should inspire young players to try to emulate him. To my knowledge, no other cricketer has scored a century and taken ten wickets on the same afternoon in recent times.

The trophy this year will be presented by Bill's widow, Mrs Gwen Wakely, and the initial recipient will be Robert Jordan.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Last year I wrote: "As usual, our executive proved to be a combination of strong personalities gathered together in the administration of our chosen sport. Members may remain assured that every possible point of view is represented on their executive committee and that points of view are put forward and considered without fear or favour". I have no reason to add to or subtract from that statement.

Unfortunately the executive had occasion to invite several club officials, team captains and players to appear before it for a variety of reasons. Several inquiries were conducted and disciplinary action, involving suspension, severe reprimand, reprimand and warning was taken where necessary. It is not the policy of our association to publish details of these matters. However the executive is concerned that persons holding responsible positions in clubs should have to be called before it for other than formal club-related matters.

Somewhat early in the season, following information being conveyed to the executive from several sources, a club was called upon to answer allegations that a player, unregistered, had played under the name of a registered person. The club concerned admitted that the breach had occurred but its officials were unaware of the incident until after the event.

The executive regards "ringing-in" as most serious and fined the club \$20, imposed loss of points for the round, suspended the captain for two matches and deferred acceptance of registration of the player concerned until 31st December, 1976. The penalties imposed would have been more severe but for the frankness of the club concerned.

DOUBLE WICKET COMPETITION

Sutherland was invited to host this annual event held by the NSW Junior Cricket Union and a successful day was held at Caringbah Oval. Sutherland was represented by its two state

representatives, Greg Fletcher of Taren Point and Greg Miller of Sylvania Heights Youth and by a somewhat belatedly picked "scrat" team comprising Andy Cover of Cronulla Workers and Greg Davies of Gympie Bay, who took the place of a drop-out association.

The two young Gregs acquitted themselves well, but did not last the distance. Andy and Greg, on the other hand, beat all-comers, despite rain and darkness, and won the event for us. This was our only representative win for the 1976-77 season.

Congratulations to these winners who, I am sure, will be invited to team up again next season to defend their title. Thanks also to our wicketkeepers, Ken Whittingham, Keith Edson and David Dee for their good performances during this day.

SPONSORSHIPS

During the year the executive, in a practical acceptance of the existing financial situation of cricket clubs and teams, approved sponsorship by business houses, organisations, etc, subject to certain restrictions and requirements being approved.

FEEES

For the first time in 13 years the executive, most reluctantly, had to increase match fees, though only nominally.

Increased club and player strength, together with higher postal and telephone charges, have greatly lifted the association's administration costs.

ANDY ROBERTS

The association congratulated the Sutherland District Cricket Club upon gaining West Indian international Andy Roberts for part of the season. Andy offered his services as a coach to our Durham Shield side and his offer was accepted with enthusiasm and his efforts appreciated. Andy was a quiet, nice fellow who enjoyed the company particularly of young cricketers.

APPRECIATION

It is obvious that some clubs have secretaries and delegates who accept the position unwillingly and consequently the club's administration and communication are severely lacking. Rising numbers of clubs, teams and players have increased tremendously the administration in and from the association and, being done in honorary capacities, will continue only while club co-operation is forthcoming. Two clubs specifically were less than effective in their management during the past season and it is hoped that their efforts next season will be worthy of their club's name.

Again I offer sincere thanks to the club officials and players who gave assistance.

HONORARY RECORDER'S REPORT

COMPETITION

Four Minor Premiers were defeated in the finals,

- A1 Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club

Five clubs fielded two teams in the finals, Cronulla Sutherland Leagues, A1 and A4; Sylvania Heights Youth, A2 and B2; Caringbah Sports, A2 and B5; Taren Point, A3 and B4 and Caringbah DLS, B1 and B5, yet no club was able to win more than one final this year - the first time this has occurred since the 1972 - 73 season.

Sylvania Heights Youth's A2 side was the only team to remain undefeated throughout the season, while Heathcote Services in A5 and Cronulla RSL in B5 both failed to win a match in the entire competition,

Three new clubs, Engadine RSL, Burraneer Bay and Bulldogs, performed well in their respective divisions.

Engadine RSL finished fifth in A2, Burraneer Bay equal third in B4 only one point behind the second place-getters and Bulldogs also equal third in B4. Bulldogs began badly, losing their first two matches outright, but were not defeated again during the season. In fact they recorded more wins than any other club in B4 grade.

TROPHIES

The task of checking the Score Books is an onerous one, with 77 teams to be considered this year. The overall standard was appalling and in most cases amendments had to be made to the Form "D". In two grades, so low was the standard that the trophy committee was unable to find a book worthy of an award.

RECORDER'S REPORT (cont)

Apart from the usual complaint of books being incomplete one club included the performances in the final in their summary, another included a social match (which caused some consternation) and endeavours to check one player's performance revealed the following match heading:

Match Against	-	THEM
Loss won by	-	US
Test Innings of	-	THEM

Obviously the Trophy Committee's task was made more difficult by clubs inconsiderate in the attention they pay to the extremely important duty of keeping an accurate record of match results.

Even in the results of finals, published in detail in this report, there were glaring omissions, especially in recording names of fieldsmen taking catches.

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR NEXT SEASON

Lodgement of Results

The current system of lodging results at hotels within the shire is not completely satisfactory, as too many times last season, some results were misplaced at these locations.

A better system, possibly, would be to lodge the results at, say, four locations within the shire before 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, such locations to be private houses at, say, Fagadine, Corringish, Sylvania and Sutherland or Jannali.

This could easily be arranged with the cooperation of four of our players who reside in these areas, and the recorder could do a leisurely collection at 11:00 a.m. on Sundays, instead of the rush on Saturday night after a match.

Type of Result Sheet

The current result sheet needs to be improved. A better type would be one similar to that used by the Boys' Association. This would be suitable for the match results, while the current gross sheet - Form "F" could still be used for progress results on the first day of a two day match.

APPRECIATION

I thank the Sporting Editors of both The Leader and The Shire Pictorial for their cooperation throughout the season. Both of these publications printed match results without fail each week.

The cooperation of Club Secretaries and members of the Executive of this Association was greatly appreciated and in particular, I would like to express my appreciation of the help given by our Assistant Secretary, David Dee, who took over the duties of printing the draw and collating our Annual Report, both of which tasks appeared previously to have been the responsibility of the Recorder.

My thanks too to the members of the Trophy Committee, and in particular to Jim Field for the many hours he spent poring over Score Books and checking our errors as well as yours. The amount of work he put in had to be seen to be fully appreciated.
