SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is my pleasure once again to report on another successful season.

MEMBERSHIP

The season 1977-78 saw yet a further increase in affiliated clubs, teams and players. Then 37 clubs affiliated at season's start, we found ourselves without the MFC club, although most players were absorbed by other teams.

Four new clubs, Cronulla Footballers, Menai Wanderers, Heathcote Juniors and Sutherland Footballers affiliated, each with one team.

Teams increased from 77 last season to 94, necessitating 12 divisions. The number of registered players increased from 1363 to more than 1700.

Perhaps it is interesting to recall what I wrote in this report in 1973 - "Clubs increased by 2 from 23 to 25; teams rose by 2 from 52 to 54 and players increased from 913 to 921."

In the light of our ever-increasing numbers, real consideration has been given to rearranging association-type cricket in Sutherland Shire. However, the lack of development of a large part of the Shire and the number of teams compared to the number of grounds available makes this impractical at this time. Undoubtedly several years hence some reorganisation will be essential, even if only to allow better administration.

GROUNDS

The inevitable had to happen, and this season there were fewer grounds than teams, requiring for the first time the playing of Sunday competition matches. Each division had an equal number of Sunday matches. Some teams were loud in their praise of this arrangement and took the opportunity to organise family picnic days for their Sunday draws.

Without the continuing cooperation of Sutherland Shire Council and its officers, acceptance of the number of teams involved would not be possible. Problems were encountered with draw changes and steps have been taken to overcome these difficulties.

The Association is again indebted to Boys' Town, Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club, Woolooware High School and Port Hacking High School for allowing use of their grounds.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

The good relationship between the Shire Council and our Association has continued. Denis Walker and Eugene Morris continued in their helpful roles. Shire Engineer Eric Hirst and Parks and Playgrounds Engineer Brian Baker again gave invaluable practical help and advice. Joe Sharkey, as Parks Supervisor, ran into problems with wet weather sabotage and booking confusions, but gave us every assistance.

GRADING

The strict rules relating to grading and registration allowed for better and fairer arranging of competitions. Clubs, however, by not grading their own players, did cause difficulties, though principally

to themselves. Late registrations were few, compared to previous seasons. Obviously this is a direct result of the rule relating to eligibility for the first three rounds.

FINALS

Unfortunately, a complete washout, giving minor premiers the titles. there is no way of avoiding this situation without ending the competition matches much earlier in the year - a situation not acceptable to cricketers.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

Again chaired by Jim Field, this committee gathered together strong teams in Durham, Telegraph and Martin Shield competitions. So much so, our Martin Shield won the final at Caringbah Oval, a feat envied by all other associations. Congratulations to Robert Jordan of Miranda Rangers C.C. on taking out the NSW/JCU wicketkeeping award for the Martin Shield competition.

REX KING TROPHY

In competition against the District Club, the Martin Shield team held them to a draw, the Durham team defeated them and the Telegraph team were soundly beaten by them, making the series tied.

NSW Junior Union Team

Sutherland was represented for the third year in succession by Greg Fletcher of the Taren Point club. Congratulations were conveyed to Greg on his third State cap. Unfortunately, age has caught up with him and made him ineligible for future consideration.

SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

This is a committee of give and take in the best interests of all sports-loving people in our district. Once again cricket won some and lost some, in cooperation with the requirements of other sports. Little inconvenience was occasioned to these bodies through the good will engendered among representatives who make up this committee.

TROPHIES AND AWARDS

This year for the first time and following a change in our rules, the association is awarding individual trophies only to winners of the various averages and aggregates over all divisions. The individual winners of these awards in the various divisions have earned cash payments of \$10 for their club in each case. This year the system has put about \$1000 back into the clubs.

With the introduction of the C grade competition, the association is seeking sponsors for two perpetual trophies. This is perhaps a cheap (\$40), tax deductible and continuing form of advertising for a local business house or industry. Suggestions from our members would be appreciated.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The executive committee is a strong one and has introduced many innovations for the betterment of cricket. There are no "yes-men" or "knockers" on the committee, and they offer a wide and varied range of viewpoints.

Regrettably, the executive committee was obliged to invite several players to appear and answer allegations and charges relating to various matters. Following inquiries players were warned, reprimanded, severely reprimanded, fined and suspended, as the particular case

necessitated. One player was suspended early in the season for one match. Subsequently he was dealt with again by the committee in relation to other matters and suspended until 1st January 1979. Another player from the same club was dealt with early in the season and severely reprimanded and fined. Subsequently he was again called before the executive committee regarding other matters, and he too was suspended until 1st January, 1979. Both players appealed against the second punitive actions to the NSW Junior Cricket Union. The NSW body after hearing the matters at length, dismissed the appeal in each case.

Evidence of "ringing-in" players and playing unregistered players was put before the executive committee and severe action taken in each case. Menai, in A2 and Como, in C1 were declared "non-competitive" teams when, in the second half of the season, they each forfeited several matches. No points were awarded for any matches involving either of these teams, in order to be fair to all other teams in those two competitions.

APPRECIATION

More than 900 individual letters or notices were sent out by the Association. This does not include financial statements, which were posted out by the Treasurer on a regular basis. This is a very big correspondence load, but is necessary for good communication in our association. It is the fact that information received by club secretaries is not passed on to club and team members which causes inconvenience to the association and players alike. Club secretaries or club contacts are forwarded multiple copies of association notices at least once a month during 9 or 10 months of the year.

I offer my sincere thanks to the club secretaries, officials and players who gave their cooperation and assistance.
