PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

At the end of last season I reported that I had found my first term as President both rewarding and challenging. I was not to know at that time just how much more of a challenge I was to face in the second year.

This year has been a long hard grind for the Executive because of the extra work associated with the introduction of innovations at the commencement of the season. Additionally there have been many more hearings involving misconduct of players.

Many will be aware that the Executive decided to stand for reelection on a platform of reform of cricket within the shire. Principally these concepts were

* Introduction of Duty Umpiring

* Limited overs for bowlers in lower grades

* Continuance of standardization of cricket balls and sponsorship of the Association.

Those members of the Executive who were making themselves available once again and had clearly stated their commitment to the concepts mentioned, were re-elected unopposed. Subsequently at the Adjourned Annual General Meeting, a move was made by some of the delegates present to influence the Executive to either water down or abandon the scheme of Duty Umpiring. This the Executive refused to do, and after lengthy discussion involving a motion of no confidence against the Executive, the motion was lost 38 to 19. With the decks cleared, arrangements proceeded with the introduction of Duty Umpiring.

It is now most gratifying to report that Duty Umpiring was well received by most clubs and players, and, as far as the Executive is concerned, has been a great success. It is interesting to note also that many of the clubs/delegates who opposed its introduction at that fateful Adjourned Annual General Meeting have since conveyed publicly their support for the scheme and congratulated members of the Executive for their stand.

The limited number of overs for bowlers in grades from B6 to C3 was also applauded by most players. It afforded young players and players with less talent the opportunity to develop their bowling skills, which possibly in the past had been denied.

For my part I would like to thank the clubs and players for their tremendous support in bringing these ideas to reality. It is your success.

The sponsorship deal with Charlie's Sports and Toy Store, Gymea, continued successfully with most clubs benefitting from the bulk purchase of cricket balls at a very reasonable price. The Association benefitted by Charlie presenting us with another kit for our representative teams. We are most grateful.

On the debit side of my report: it is most disconcerting once again to mention the problem of misbehaviour on or in the vicinity of the field. Some fifteen players were suspended from cricket for periods ranging from one to twelve matches because of misconduct. The Executive has to spend a great deal of time on these hearings to ensure that they are fair and just. This time could be put to better use in dealing with administrative problems. However, since it has to be done, clubs and players alike should take note that the Executive is committed to stamping out the type of behaviour that brings discredit to the game. Players and/or officials who are found guilty of a second offence can depend on receiving a much more severe penalty than that normally applied to first offenders.

Gentlemen, your cooperation is urgently needed in regard to this serious problem. Club executives cannot afford to sit back and ignore what is taking place in the ranks of their own teams. It is your responsibility to deal with offenders before it becomes necessary for your opponents or the Umpires to report them to the Executive. Team captains also must take more positive action on the field to quell hotheads who threaten to disrupt a match. A person who cannot control himself and his players on the field should not be the Captain.

As to the future, our major plan is to produce a booklet which will include the current constitution of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association together with the laws of cricket with all the amendments included. This work is very close to being printed.

In conclusion, may I take this opportunity to thank all members of the Executive for their support and loyalty. Without fear of contradiction I can say that it is the best administrative team I have been associated with.

To clubs and members I wish you every success in the 1980 - 81 season.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow cricketers,

I am pleased to report yet another successful season, though one not without its problems and controversies, particularly at the beginning.

MEMBERSHIP

Season 1979-80 saw two clubs Gymea Footballers and St John Bosco disbanded, and two new clubs - Kurnell United and Kareela admitted. In addition, Bulldogs joined Sutherland Royal and Heathcote split forming a new Club, Illawong. The number of affiliated clubs stayed at 38. Team entries dropped from 94 to 89 and player registrations dropped to 1600, 100 fewer than 1978-79.

GROUNDS

As always, grounds were a problem, with repair and maintenance work necessary to all, in some instances major projects involving lengthy lay-offs. The association cooperated with Sutherland Shire Council's policy of running repairs and transferred games in all grades where necessary. Again, despite the shortage of playing areas the Association made available three grounds to the NSW Protestant Churches Cricket Union.

Were it not for Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club, Port Hacking High School and Boys' Town making available their privately owned areas for our use, the competition, as we know it, could not have been effected. We are most grateful to those organisations for their assistance.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

Our continuing good relationship with the Sutherland Shire Council and its officers has undoubtedly allowed for better running of our Association. Shire Engineer Eric Hirst and Parks and Playgrounds Engineer Brian Baker were most helpful in programming their necessary work andin advising on grounds problems. Eugene Morris and Denis Walker were helpful as always.

Engineer Eric Hirst and I have had several discussions on the construction of a second synthetic wicket and other innovations in an effort to improve the general condition of playing fields and reduce the cost of maintenance. The results of these discussions may become evident prior to the commencement of the 1980-81 season, and if so they will, I am sure, be appreciated both by cricketers and ratepayers.

GRADING

The grading committee, hardened by previous bitter experience, did not fall for many hard luck stories either in the initial gradings or late registrations. Consequently some "sharpies" turned into "would-be-sharpies" and they or the players they nominated found themselves not accepted. It is not the aim of the committee to prevent people from playing cricket, but it is its aim to prevent

cricketers - the association and its affiliated teams - from being dudded by such pleas as the "crook back and can't bowl any more" syndrome. In fact one might say that the hard line attitude adopted by the Executive in this respect has effected ailment cures the like of which those of the medical profession might well be proud. At least one player, whose club requested grading on the basis that he would not be available for many matches (a request not acceded to by us) has won an award.

FINALS

Good weather allowed completion of all finals and saw four minor premiers beaten. Early in the season the subject of whether or not finals should be played was discussed and the decision in favour was overwhelming.

SELECTION COMMITTEE AND REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

Again headed by Committeeman Jim Field, the selectors chose strong and personable Durham and Telegraph Shield teams. Regrettably, insufficient players nominated for the Martin Shield and consequently, we were not represented in this inter-association competition.

SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO SUTHERLAND SHIRE COUNCIL

I represented our association at these meetings and cooperated fully with other sports, bearing in mind our own needs. At the most recent meeting it was necessary for me to defend vigorously our need to maintain custody of playing areas allocated to us in previous years, following a strong attempt by the Churches Association to gain extra fields for their competitions. Our argument, logical, factual and basic, won the day.

Without loss to the Association, it was possible to abandon the allocation of the Forest Road, Kirrawee ground in favour of the NSW Women's Cricket Association. This area has been a bone of contention for many years and the Association has not made effective use of it. The ladies, growing ever stronger and therefore confirming my predictions of previous reports, gladly took up the opportunity to use this centrally located ground.

STANDARDIZATION OF BALLS

The use of a standard ball for the second season proved a cost saving move for most teams and again offered an equality that did not previously exist. Again negotiations with Charlie's Sports Store at Gymea Bay Road, Gymea produced a sponsored kit valued in excess of \$500. This was allocated to our Telegraph Shield Team.

Following recommendations from the final council meeting of club delegates, the Executive decided to adopt Steeded balls for the coming season, with liberty for clubs to use existing stocks of Kookaburra balls during the first few weeks.

In the past few weeks a committee of four, headed by President, Vince Ridge, received quotations from at least four local retailers for supply of Steeden balls for the coming season. At the executive meeting on 21st July a tender was accepted from Charlie's Sports Store for the supply of balls for the 1980-81 season, again with a sponsorship arrangement.

KULES

There have been numerous major changes to the rules of cricket. The association is in the process of printing 2000 copies of the rules incorporating MCC, NSWCA, NSWJCU, and SSCA, with a view to issue prior to the oncoming season.

SUNDAY CRICKET

To the relief of most, if not all, Sunday cricket on a competitive scale has been abandoned without eliminating teams or competitions. This has made available recreation grounds for general use and has afforded the council an opportunity to gain letting fees for hire of grounds.

THE INNOVATIONS

Sunday cricket has been eliminated, as previously mentioned.

White balls were given a fair trial, and the consensus was that
they favoured the batsman and lost their shine very quickly. The extra
cost involved was also a factor in the decision not to persevere with

this experiment.

Duty Teams - teams allocated compulsorily to umpire other grades - have come to stay. The principal purposes of this innovation were (a) to enable all games to be played on Saturdays; and (b) to have games controlled by neutral officials and reduce the number of reports and complaints that arose out of incidents involving batting side umpires. To implement this policy, stated prior to the election of officers for last season, the executive was met with a vote of no confidence, which was more a tongue-in-cheek protest, and was soundly defeated. I think I can say that without exception, those who originally opposed the proposal have commended and complimented the executive upon its stand and have stated that they enjoy their cricket more with the responsibility of officiating taken away from them during games and the advantage of participating in teamsmanship while their batsmen are at the wicket. The duty team system has received much publicity and requests have been made by the NSWJCU and many associations for details of it with a view to adopting it.

Another new concept introduced last year was the <u>limited over</u> competitions. This change was made in order that the <u>perhaps</u> not so good cricketer is given a go and so that no longer can the friends and relations method of using bowlers be followed. The limited over concept has been loudly applauded and is quite obviously appreciated

by the great majority of those involved.

Another innovation for the coming season may be that limited over matches will all be one day matches. Notice has been given by several clubs of a motion to this effect and it would seem that the obvious benefits that will flow-from this move are such that at least it should be given a trial.

ADMINISTRATION

Regrettably valuable time of the Executive Committee has been taken up in hearings of various nature, and in chasing up club officials who do not cooperate and display evidence of not really being interested in either their club or the association. This criticism does not apply

to the majority of club contacts, fortunately.

Three clubs have been written to and requested to show cause why they should be admitted to affiliation with the Association in the coming season. Other clubs are under close scrutiny, having regard to their lack of diligence in attending meetings, paying fees and communication among their players and with the association. A comprehensive report will be presented to the incoming executive committee for decision prior to acceptance of clubs/teams in August.

The Executive's policy of dealing severely with cricketer offenders has led to fifteen suspensions for varying periods ranging from one match to more than half a season. This policy will no doubt con-

tinue should the present executive continue in office.

LIFE MEMBER

David Dee, assistant secretary of many years and a long-standing attender of council meetings as a club official and delegate, has been elevated to life membership of our Association. This is a well-deserved honour for a cricketer who has excelled both as a player and an administrator.

I have been privileged to have had David as my assistant for the past four years. He has been a good sounding board, always helpful and

not backward in stating his views, which I value considerably.

David Dee has played cricket with our Association for more than a quarter of a century - not to suggest that he is so ancient, but he started as a boy with the St Patrick's Cricket Club. David was a foundation member of the Cronulla Workers Cricket Club and had the honour and good fortune (apart from his leadership ability) to captain that club's A1 team to the premiership in season 4974-75.

Though our Association has existed for a long time, comparatively few batsmen have scored a century in our A1 grade, David Dec is among these notables. Further, on several occasions he has won the association wicketkeeper's award for most dismissals.

David's reelection to the executive committee was by design. As a free-thinking and articulate delegate, former long-serving President, Jack Edwards said: "This bloke is causing us too much trouble. We will have to get him elected as one of us so we can control him. David was elected to the executive committee, but controlled: David is still as free-thinking as ever, and his contribution to the considerations of the executive is always valued as mature thoughts. Previously, in the early 1960's, David served some years on the executive as recorder and committeeman.

David has a long record of representative honours for the Sutherland Association in Watson, Telegraph and Martin Shield teams, where

he gave sterling service both as wicketkeeper and batsman.

Perhaps many nowaday cricketers are aware of David as the specially appointed M.C. of our Presentation Dinner, given the task of attempting to control during a series of presentation speeches, a crowd of 600 cricketers enjoying themselves at either Taren Point or the Civic Centre. His professionalism as a high school teacher enabled him to take charge and ensure a proper and appropriate atmosphere for the award giving procedure.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

It was a particularly hard year for executive members who were

regularly called upon to sit in a judicial capacity relating to incidents that should not have occurred. A recommendation will be made to the Association A.A.G.M. that a judiciary committee be appointed to deal with alleged offenders within guidelines to be determined. Early in the season, the executive was put to the test, but remained stead-fast and solid in the face of a motion of no confidence.

AUDIT OF ASSOCIATION ACCOUNTS

Harry Robbins, a life member of our association, has been auditor for umpteen years, and we appreciate his continuing efforts. Harry reports that in his experience all Association Treasurers have been first rate accounts men, but in Martin Taylor, present occupant of this office of trust, we have someone who keeps and submits books of accounts unsurpassed. All association members can be thankful that the often unpopular position of treasurer (unpopular only with those who don't conform) is filled by someone so dedicated, honest and competent. Well done, Martin.

APPRECIATION

More than 1000 mailings were necessary this season in an effort

to have proper communication among cricketers.

To those club officials who gave cooperation and assistance, I offer the sincere thanks of all members of the executive.

TROPHIES

Two new trophies are to be presented this year and sponsorship for them would be appreciated. They are, as yet, unendorsed other than season 1979-80 winning team.

COMPETITION

The competition was conducted in thirteen grades. As revealed earlier, four minor premiers were defeated in finals. They were: A2 Cronulla Workers, B1 Engadine Dragons, B5 Soccer and C2 Sports.
