PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Well, this past season could be very easily described by the phrase: "it had its highs and it had its lows".

While I do not wish to dwell on the lows in great detail it should be mentioned that the Executive had to waste many hours in hearings that involved misconduct by a number of players and the "ringing-in" of unregistered well performed cricketers in our lower grades. As a result of these hearings a whole team incurred a substantial fine and the Captain was suspended for three matches. Another team had three players suspended for three matches and four players suspended for the rest of the season. Subsequently, the latter team was withdrawn from the competition. All these matter dealt with occurred over the first three matches of the competition and the hearings took place in October and November at a time when the Executive had a much more important agenda. There is no excuse for "ringing-in" players when all should be aware how co-operative the Executive is in assisting teams in fulfilling their commitments.

After these traumas the season settled down and ended on a very high note with all competitions and finals being well contested. We were blessed with fine weather for the finals and I take this opportunity to congratulate the premiers and individual trophy winners whilst extending a word of comfort to the runners-up.

Also, congratulations to our three representative teams - Martin Shield, Telegraph Shield and Durham Shield for their fine efforts during the representative season. Although they all just missed out on the finals their overall performances have won the New South Wales Junior Cricket Union Searle Shield for the best performed Association in Senior cricket. This is the first time our association has achieved this honour. We formally acknowledge the players, the managers and the selectors for their fine efforts.

After the completion of the season we were saddened to learn of the passing of Noel Ziems. A stalwart of the Caringbah Sports Cricket Club, he was an aggressive wicket keeper/batsman who served that club with distinction. Then in May Vic Dwyer, formerly of the St Patrick's Cricket Club and one of the finest players to ever grace our association, passed away quite suddenly. To the families of Noel and Vic we extend our deepest sympathy.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the Executive during the tough administrative season and commend them for their courageous decisions on difficult matters.

To all members and their families I wish you all the best for the 1992-93 Season.

Vic captained the St Patrick's Club to two Al Premierships and was an inspirational leader who led by example. He continued playing Al till he was well in his forties and then took up umpiring duties which he performed with distinction. He served a couple of terms on the executive as a committeeman but his profession as a pastry cook, which required very early morning starts, curtailed his desire for an administrative career.

For his services to cricket in our Association - as a player, a representative player in Martin Shield, an umpire and a committeeman to the Executive, Vic was rewarded with Life Membership.

Vic epitomised all that was good in cricket, he played hard but fair, never denigrated his opponents and was a gracious winner and a sporting loser.

Vic Dwyer was a good man.

We are particularly interested in information about the Gymea Bay team that played before the Second World War.

A lot of people have probably read the article on page 3 of the Sydney Morning Herald describing the cricket match played by our social team at Tilpa. Tilpa is a small town on the Darling River half-way between Bourke and Wilcannia and consists of a small pub and a community centre. The plight of the Tilpa Cricket Club was described in the S.M.H. earlier in the season - Tilpa being unable to field a team due to the drought and wool crisis. Gymea Bay CC wrote a letter of encouragement to Tilpa CC and offered to send up a social team to help foster the interests of cricket in the Tilpa district. It's history now but Tilpa gladly took up our offer and then a lot of organisation occurred in order to send an expeditionary social team 1000 kilometres to the outback.

On Friday morning, 27th March, the expedition assembled and boarded our coach and headed off along the Great Western, the Mitchell and finally the Barrier Highways to our overnight stop, Cobar. Saturday morning saw us once again board the coach and after a tour of Cobar conducted by the Mayor, we began the 200 kilometre drive into Tilpa. For most of us who had never been outback before, the country was spectacular and beautiful in its own way. The soil is a deep red ochre colour with the occasional saltbush. We saw plenty of kangaroos, emus and of course sheep.

When we finally arrived at Tilpa we went straight to the Tilpa Sports Ground where introductions took place and the official toss was conducted. Anyone who saw the ground would never again complain about the Sutherland Shire Council as the ground consisted of red clay soil (not one blade of grass) with the only green being the freshly cleaned synthetic grass pitch which dramatically contrasted with the surrounds. Gymea Bay batted first and scored a respectable 242 off the allotted 40 overs against a very competitive bowling attack. Tilpa in reply started off with all guns ablazing and they seemed to adopt a much more uninhibited and flamboyant style of batting. Tilpa were well ahead of the required 6 runs per over when they made one of the most fundamental mistakes in social cricket: they tapped the keg too early. Gymea Bay's bowlers were able to put the brakes on the middle order greatly assisted by a good spell from that ageless warrior Lance Handley.

As the sun went down over the horizon, under a spectacular sunset, the game was drawing to a close. The crowd had swelled to well over 100, with people coming from all over. With 8 runs required off the last over and with massive crowd support, the Tilpa batsmen just failed and Gymea Bay were the inaugural winners of the Sydney Morning Herald Ashes. After a number of cleansing ales to wash down the dust, we all headed off to the Royal Hotel for dinner and the official speeches. After all the formalities and the presentation of the SMH Ashes by SMH journalist, Asa Wahlquist, the rest of the night was spent celebrating and swapping stories. Eventually we set off with our hosts for the various properties at which we were billeted.

On Sunday morning we were all shown around the properties where we were staying. Most of them were well in excess of 100,000 acres and some ran around 20,000 sheep in good times. The drought had taken a massive toll with some stations recording 80% losses. We met at lunchtime at the community centre and the afternoon was spent at tennis, volleyball and the ladies played a game of netball. Sunday night was back to the Royal Hotel for similar enjoyment to the night before. Eventually our hosts took us home again to their various properties.

Monday morning saw us all meet in at Tilpa where we all said our farewells. As we headed out wecollected our members from the various properties along the road and began the long trip home to Gymea. Everyone had a fantastic trip as we met the people of the outback and experienced the vastly different life that they lead. Our own lives are certainly richer for this great experience.
