A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I extend my congratulations to these two men and to the individual team members.

I also wish to congratulate the Telegraph Shield Team on reaching the semi-final. They, too, enjoyed a successful season and were a credit to the association. We will hear more of them in the future. The success of our representative teams begins with the selectors and our thanks go to them for their efforts.

The finals, thankfully, were conducted in beautiful weather and our appreciation goes to the council for mowing and hosing most of the wickets during the lead-up week, which coincided with particularly bad weather. All games were well contested and I would like to offer my congratulations to the Premiership winning teams. Commiserations to the unsuccessful finalists, but, hopefully, they will take heart in the fact that they gave of their best on the day. Congratulations also to the individual trophy winners, for their success in our competitions.

With all this good news, it is disappointing to have to mention a couple of matters which some team captains should rectify in future. On two occasions this season, reports were received by the Executive of team captains being involved in slanging matches. In both cases verbal abuse was involved and was brought about by captains who were not aware of the laws of the game. It should be possible for mature adults to discuss differences without losing control of the situation. Captains, please carry your Rule Book to matches so that you are able to check the laws on matters of dispute which may arise.

The second matter is that some matches were played on the second day of the last round in appalling conditions. In cases like this, captains must consider the danger of injury to their players and damage to the fields. They should bear in mind also that our injury insurance of players with NSW Sports Injury Insurance Scheme could be voided by continuing to play in dangerous conditions.

It is sad to record that Wal Croucher passed away during the season. Wal was a great worker in junior cricket and in our own Umpires Association for many years. We extend our sympathy to his family.

Finally, I suppose most people are aware that I have announced my retirement from the Executive. After 27 years, seventeen of which I served as your President, I decided that I had run my race and it was time to pass the baton to younger men. We have an excellent executive; youth blended with experience and ready to accept challenges. The Association financial position is solid, so what better time to bow out?

I have enjoyed seeing the Association grow and the changes that have been effected over the years. I stayed longer than I first intended, and in partnership with the executive, achieved more than I ever expected. Over the years I have enjoyed the rapport with executive officers, delegates and individual playing members, and I thank them all for their cooperation. I especially want to thank the members of the executive with whom I have developed a close and lasting friendship over the years, in particular, Bob Davey, David Dee, Lance Handley, Leon Bunker, Graeme Thornley, and from the past, Jack Edwards, Jim Field and Martin Taylor.

IN APPRECIATION

At the 48th Annual General Meeting of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association held at Gymea Bowling Club on 24 July 1995, we will see probably the most significant administrative alteration in the history of our association with the retirement from the Executive Committee of Bob Davey and Vince Ridge.

Bob has been Honorary Secretary since 1973 and was Assistant Secretary for three years before that, while Vince has been President since 1978, Senior Vice President and Committeman throughout the seventies after having first been elected to the Executive in the 1958-59 season. In total, they have devoted over 50 years of service to the well-being of cricket in our Shire.

Their service has been selfless, their mutual aim being the advancement of cricket, not any personal gain. They have worked together tirelessly and the winners have been the cricketers of the Shire.

They have not always agreed; I, for one would have been disappointed if they had - for that means that one of them would have been superfluous. However, they have always presented a united front to the world outside the committee room. They have supported decisions of the executive, even if they personally held reservations about them, and I know we all agree that the stability of the association for the past twenty years has been in no small way due to their efforts.

Let us consider some of the innovations introduced during their period in office -

Duty Umpiring - a novel concept to enable more teams to play on a restricted number of grounds Introduction of synthetic wickets

Sunday cricket - soon dropped because it was too unwieldy

Incorporation of the SSCA - a necessity in these litigious times

A "listed player" system - to foster relations with the District Club

A limited overs scheme to allow more player participation

The Association Award concept - to allow achievements of lower grade players to be recognised

Fairer ground allocations so that all grades had access to more grounds

Constant care to ensure maintenance of good relations with Sutherland Shire Council

Closer ties with the Umpires'Association

Closer ties with the Junior Association

The list goes on and on.

The professionalism which they have brought to the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, the personal effort and enthusiasm which they have demonstrated and their fearlessness in decision-making have made the Association a body which is respected by all those involved with it, including the NSW Junior Union, the Shire Council, neighbouring Associations and the Clubs which comprise our own, as well as administrators of other sporting groups within the Shire.

I, personally, have enjoyed a long connection with both men, have worked briefly as Vince's Vice President and for a considerably longer period as Bob's Assistant Secretary. I know only too well, the countless hours that they have both given to ensure that the game we all play and love is an experience to be enjoyed and not merely endured.

Although they are retiring from the executive, it will not be possible for either of them to abandon cricket totally, and I am sure that if their advice is needed to assist us in the future, it will be only a telephone call away. I hope that they will maintain contact with us.

On behalf of all members of our association, I would like to thank Bob and Vince for their service to cricket and wish them a long, happy and fruitful retirement.

Their wisdom, experience and devotion will be difficult to replace.

DAILY TELEGRAPH SHIELD REPORT

The 1994-95 Telegraph Shield season started with a lot of promise as we had a very good team. We went through the competition losing only one match to the eventual winners, Georges River, whom we met again in the semis to be again narrowly defeated. We had a great bunch of young blokes who all got on well and who all liked to "party", which unfortunately proved our downfall as some of them partied too hard on the night before our semi-final. We really had the team to win the competition as we were blessed with a number of all rounders who could bat or bowl anywhere in the order.

The player of the series came down to 3 players, Pete Kooner, Will Hardman or Arron Cadet. Pete had a great series; he opened the batting and looked classy - yet his quick off spinners were invaluable, as he enabled us to increase our over rate and also keep the runs down. Will Hardman had a strong series, too, top-scoring with 92 no against Parramatta, but it was as an opening bowler that he made an impact. Will is what you might call "rather quick", and opposing batsmen were more concerned with survival than scoring runs. Arron Cadet, however, was my choice as player of the series. He was a very handy first change bowler and was outstanding in the field. But it was his batting once again. He is an absolute joy to watch bat - the class batsman of the Telegraph Shield, and is capable of taking apart any bowling attack. His 77 against Hawkesbury was worth the 2 hour drive to watch.

Round 1 Sutherland 5 - 162 defeated Fairfield-Liverpool 160 at Sutherland.

We lost the toss and fielded. Following some loose bowling, they quickly reached 0-81 on a real batsman's paradise. Then a fired-up Will Hardman literally scared the living daylights out of them with a very hostile spell to gain 4-21 from 14 overs. One of their batsmen came back shaking his head and saying he was glad to get out of there!! Pete Kooner tied up the other end with 2-42 off 20 overs. Chasing 160, Pete Kooner got us off to a good start with a quick 32, Simon Goodger a solid 33, a fine cameo from Arron Cadet 35 (in about 10 minutes) and a quick 35 no from Andrew Clements sealed the victory.

Round 2 Sutherland defeated Western Suburbs by forfeit.

Round 3 Sutherland 7 - 242 defeated Parramatta 167.

We lost the toss and were sent in to bat. Arron Cadet got us off to a great start scoring 44. Pete Kooner 14 and Paul Tonkinson 19 gave good support. However, Simon Goodger 54 and Will Hardman 92 no put on a magnificent 114 to set the foundation for a good score of 7-242. A fine allround effort from the bowlers - Ralph Blackburn 2-53 off 8, Andrew Henderson 1-29 off 9, Tim Lawler 3-25 off 9 and Pete Kooner 1-29 from 8 overs.

Round 4 Georges River/Penshurst 7 - 218 defeated Sutherland 170.

This match was a debacle from start to finish. Half the team were away on holidays making a nuisance of themselves up at the Gold Coast. A few more players arrived showing obvious effects of the night before. GRP won the toss and batted solidly until we got the first wicket at 47. Wickets fell consistently and we were in a good position having them 6-97 at lunch. An unnamed player (hungover) dropped a straightforward catch in the first over after lunch, we let them off the hook and they finished with 9-218, some of their lower order batsmen showing real batting ability. Tim Lawler bowled a great spell, 14 overs for 5-45 and he could have had a few more.

It was always going to be a struggle to score the runs as GRP have 2 very sharp, economical bowlers who bowl virtually all their overs. Paul Tonkinson 23 and Simon Goodger 10 started fairly, Troy Colburt batted very well but wickets toppled after losing Tonko at 51. Troy finished with 59 including 9 fours and a lusty 6 - what could he have done without the hangover?? Tim Lawler played a fine rearguard knock scoring 39 not out.

Round 5 Sutherland 3 - 145 defeated Hawkesbury 144.

Simon actually won a toss, and after a pre-match tactical meeting at which all had agreed to bat first, Simon had a rush of blood and sent them in. Great pressure was applied by our bowlers Will Hardman and Andrew Henderson. Tim Lawler and Pete Kooner (4-24 from 11) continued the good work. A highlight was the freakish catch by Paul Vella at deep mid-wicket - you had to see it to believe it.

Chasing 144 and aware that a win would secure a semi spot Paul Tonkinson and Peter Ellis began determinedly. The wicket was still damp and the bowlers were getting a lot of assistance. At 2-31, Arron Cadet strode to the crease and scored 77, with a great supporting knock from Tonko of 41 no. Arron's innings was a treat to watch. He adapted to the conditions and though he really put his head down, he still took the attack apart. One shot will remain for always in my memory - a full-blooded hook for 6 off a quick bowler that never got above 10 feet and carried the huge boundary by plenty into the shop across the road.

SEMI-FINAL Sutherland 210 lost to Georges River Penshurst 221.

We trained very hard at the District Club Turf nets for this match. On the day of the match our two best batsmen arrived in a very ordinary state after partying all night. Luckily Simon lost the toss and we bowled. Well, it was a very similar story to the previous match - at lunch we had them 6-88, but they got away after lunch to finish with 221. In hindsight our downfall was probably our depth of bowling in that we tried to give them all a go instead of bringing our strike bowlers back after lunch. However, they seem to bat their best 2 batsmen at 8 and 9, as they are also their opening bowlers.

Once again, their opening bowlers put the screws on and we fell behind the run rate, soon lapsing to 5-67. We weren't finished, however, as our middle and lower order took up the fight. Craig Floyd anchored one end with a solid 30 while a quick 25 from Tim Lawler was followed by Matt Wood who came out swinging to score a rapid 42. When Matt and then Craig were dismissed we looked shot ducks at 9-171. But our two batting bunnies, Andrew Henderson and Ralph Blackburn continued to score runs and got to 210 before our hopes were dashed by a run out. Andrew scored 27 and Ralph was 10 no. It was a disappointing end for the team as we knew we had the side that could win the Telegraph Shield but we let ourselves down. Georges River-Penshurst finished up winning the final and no doubt their two opening bowlers contributed to this as they are both very good cricketers - congratulations to them.
