In my first year as President it took me some time to work my way into the position vacated by Vince Ridge, but with the help of the senior executive, Dave Dee, Lance Handley and Kevin Richards and the younger willing workers on the committee, things soon fell into place and I can't thank them enough for their support.

I would like to take the opportunity to congratulate the District Club on winning the First and Second Grade Premierships, the Junior Association on winning the Creak Shield and of course, our own Daily Telegraph Shield side who took out that prestigious competition.

I would not only like to thank Peter Friend, President of the Junior Association and Geoff Coleman, President of the District Club, but also their hard-working executive committees with whom I have had the pleasure of working on many occasions during the season.

I must also express my appreciation to Jim Lynch, Sid Edwards and the committee of the Umpires' Association for the cooperation and support shown to our association during the year. Although our dream of a full complement of umpires has not yet been fulfilled, I look forward to its fruition soon.

My thanks also to Sutherland Council and especially to John Gordon and Murray Halls from Sport & Recreation. With the loss of Sylvania Waters Field, Council helped with negotiations for the sharing of Yarrowarrah Oval with Junior Baseball and it is this sort of cooperation from Council that has helped with the resolution of ground difficulties during the year.

This season we were able to lay three more synthetic wickets, leaving us with only three to complete in order for every grade to be played on synthetic wickets. With the help of the Junior Association and the Council, we expect to complete this task in the coming season. We also hope to re-cover certain wickets and repair others to raise the standard of all grounds for the enjoyment of all our members.

It is my sad duty to inform you of the passing of two life members of our Association. Don Masters, Secretary of the Junior Association for 10 years and a tireless worker for cricket in the Shire died in December 1995. Jim Field, whom I had the pleasure of knowing and playing against since I first played in the Association 29 years ago died on July 1st. Jim served many years on the executive as Committeeman and Vice-President. For most of those years he was Chairman of Selectors for our representative sides. July also saw the passing of Howard Townsend, a very fine A grade fast bowler in the earlier years of the Association and Dulcie Jackson, widow of Frank, a past President of the Association. Our sympathy is extended to their families.

The 1996-97 season sees the 50th anniversary of our association and I would like to be able to present to our members something special to commemorate this occasion. Noel Taplin has been researching our Association since its inception and it is hoped to produce an informative and interesting publication covering the history of cricket in the Shire.

In conclusion, may I wish all members a great and enjoyable 1996-97 season. Let me remind you that the game of cricket is bigger than the individual and that's the way it should be played.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The competition was conducted in 12 grades each of 7 teams, an increase of 4 on the previous year. Despite poor weather during the finals weekend, which saw 5 minor premiers defeated, only 2 draws resulted. Congratulations to Premiers and award winners who are listed elsewhere in this report.

Close cooperation with Sutherland Shire Council, especially John Gordon and Murray Halls, resulted in difficulties with grounds being speedily resolved. I would like to thank these two men for the great job they do to provide venues for all sports in the Shire and to attempt harmonious solutions to cater for the often unreasonable demands of all sporting administrators.

Unfortunately because of negotiations being entered into by a cricket club in the western end of the shire, we were not included in planning discussions until too late and the outcome was the loss to senior cricket of the fine new ground at Lucas Heights. I stress that only the Association can be aware of the needs of all clubs and urge all club contacts to get us involved at an early stage when plans for grounds and ground developments are being discussed. This season we expect to complete the laying of synthetic wickets on the remaining three grounds needed to run the entire competition on synthetic surfaces.

On behalf of all members I would like to express appreciation to Leon Bunker for the tremendous amount of time and effort he invested in his first and successful year as President. He was ably supported by an executive who are a group of willing workers.

Congratulations again to Lance Handley for providing so thoroughly the statistics which make up most of the Annual Report. Graeme Thornley again kept a firm grip on the purse strings and is a fine and reliable Treasurer. He revealed again a talent for prose (or was it poetry?) in the report he compiled on the Telegraph Shield team. In addition to his literary inclinations, he capably managed the Telegraph Shield side who won that Shield comprehensively. Congratulations to them on a fine performance.

Congratulations too, to the Sutherland District Club on their brilliant season, which in addition to the 1st and 2nd grade premierships saw the completion of the Pavilion at Caringbah Oval, a wonderful asset for cricket.

We have often discussed sponsorship of the Annual Report, but this is the first year that a prospective advertiser contacted me as it was being compiled. Thus, former Executive member and player, Col McElroy, the proprietor of Engadine Sports has assisted with the printing costs of this report and he will be happy to assist clubs with equipment needs.

In the President's Report, Leon has undertaken the sad task of reporting on the passing of several cricket stalwarts. Jim Field and I worked closely as selectors and fellow executive men, played as opposing captains and became firm friends. To his family we express our deep sympathy on the passing of a great SSCA cricketer. At his funeral, Vince Ridge delivered an eloquent farewell address and with Vince's permission, this is reprinted elsewhere in this report.

At the moment of going to press I was informed of the serious illness of John Bannon, Life Member and former Assistant Secretary of the Association. We pray for his recovery.

I remind members that all positions are declared vacant at the AGM and encourage interested persons to offer themselves for election to a position on the Executive Committee.

VALE JIM FIELD

James Charles Field was born at South Hurstville in 1923, the third of five children born to Annie and George Field.

Jim attended South Hurstville and Connells Point primary schools, Hurstville Boys High School and then trained as a wool classer. His leisure time was spent playing cricket with his brother Fred and he eventually played second grade for St George before being called up for military service in 1941. He was posted to Darwin during the Japanese air raids, serving in the army until 1946. Jim did not return to grade cricket after the war but played for many years in the St George Cricket Association before coming across to the Sutherland Association with Sylvania Heights Youth Club.

On his return to civilian life, he joined the Ex-Servicemen's training scheme as an apprentice carpenter. He finished his time and joined a building firm where he worked for 22 years.

Jim met Val through Val's brother Trevor, they married in 1951, built their home at Sylvania and had three children, Karen, Brian and Colin. Their family has now extended to 4 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren.

As a result of a recession in 1977, Jim was forced to begin his own business, which he ran most successfully until last year when he went into semi-retirement.

Over the years he sustained many injuries through his occupation as a builder, and he also had a big operation for the removal of kidney stones. Jim always fought back and regained his health, but this time he was up against a much more fierce and cruel opponent. After a brave battle he finally succumbed at noon on Monday 1st July.

This is only a short history of his life, but there is much, much more to Jim Field.

It is obvious that everybody here today enjoyed his friendship and we all have our own special memories of him. I would like to share my thoughts and reflections with you.

I first met Jim in the mid nineteen-sixties when we were opposing cricket captains playing in the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association A2 competition.

Jim Field was an astute captain who played it hard but always within the laws of the game and with sportsmanship. He never resorted to personal abuse nor did he denigrate the opposition. I didn't see the best of Jim as a cricketer as he was in his early forties when we first met, but it was evident that he was a good left-hand bat and a fine left-hand spin bowler - a keen student of the game. He continued to play until he was in his early sixties. Though we were opponents for a few years, we became firm friends.

This friendship blossomed when we were both elected to the Association Executive - Jim as a selector. It was not long before he was made chairman of selectors because of his expertise and experience. He guided the selections and fortunes of our representative teams until he retired from the Association in 1988-89. Many of our cricketers have benefited from Jim's guidance.

Jim was made a life member of the Sylvania Heights Youth Cricket Club when he retired from playing around 1982. A little later he was honoured with Life Membership of the Association. He continued to serve as Vice-President when he ceased playing and he retired in the 1988-89 season. Jim did a tremendous amount of good for cricket in the Shire.

Of course, since we were so friendly serving together on the Executive, it was only natural that I would ask him to carry out renovations on my home. I never did ask him for a quote, it was simply a case of - we had work we wanted done - would he come and do the job? He was fair and honest, a skilled tradesman who took great pride in his work and he only employed the best sub-contractors. This was evident as we never had any complaints with the work nor a single call-back. I was looking around our home the other day and there are only two rooms in the house where Jim has not done any alterations. Our home is a constant reminder of Jim and his skill as a craftsman.

He had a tremendous memory and could recall just about every job on which he worked. He would talk about RSJs, battens and noggins - half the time I didn't know what he was talking about - what did I know? - I'm a banker.

But it was easy to change the subject - just mention cricket - his eyes would light up and his nose would twitch! and off he'd go reminiscing about cricket matches. I enjoyed the times that Jim came to do renovations.

Jim was an uncomplicated man, a simple man, a family man. He had a good relationship with his brothers and sister, cared for his friends, took great pride in his work, loved sport - especially cricket and looked forward to going to Forster to do some fishing with Brian.

We, his friends, grieve with Val and all the family and pray that the passing of time will ease the pain of their loss. We shan't forget him.

Goodbye old friend - Rest in Peace.

DAILY TELEGRAPH SHIELD REPORT

After having the same core of players over the past 3 seasons and knowing we should have given it a shake the previous 2 years, we finally brought home to Sutherland the Daily Telegraph Shield. This is the first time Sutherland have been outright winners as the two previous occasions we were joint winners when the finals were washed out.

Blacktown were pretty cocky when they started to bat, but on a bouncy green synthetic pitch our pace attack was just too good for them. Will Hardman in particular bowled with great pace. (Will Hardman 2-17, Ralph Blackburn 2-22, Paul Tonkinson 2-18, Tim Lawler 3-2).

Match 2 v Hornsby. Hornsby 3-83 defeated Sutherland 80.

This was our annual debacle. On a day when rain set in all over Sydney and Berowra Oval was the only dry spot in 1000 square kilometres, we played. It was the only match played in Sydney on that day!! With only 8 players and the weather looking as though it would deluge at any time, it was tough to build an innings. We were all out for 80 (Geoff Phillipson 18, Peter Riccio 23, Arron Cadet 17). Hornsby had no trouble getting the runs with their opening batsmen smashing us all around the park. Five minutes after they got the runs, the heavens opened up. A day best forgotten.
