RECORDER'S REPORT

The competition was conducted with 83 teams in 11 grades each of 7 teams and 1 grade of 6 teams.

Thanks to all Captains who made the effort to submit their results, filled in correctly, on time. There was continued improvement in this regard this season, which makes it possible to keep the point score up to date.

Congratulations to all Premiership winning teams. Seven Minor Premiers were successful in the finals and five were defeated. The results were:

Compared with last season, bowlers generally did much better than batsmen 49 centuries were scored including 4 in excess of 150. The highest score for the season was 162. Three batsmen scored 2 centuries each. On 23 occasions bowlers took 7 wickets in an innings, three of these in the finals, while the best was 9-26 by M. Fleming in B5 grade. Six hat tricks were achieved, two of them by H. Singadia in B1 grade.

One team, Engadine Dragons in B4 won all their matches, while two teams were unable to win a match. In five grades (A1, A2, A3, B1 and B3), all teams fulfilled Duty Umpiring and Captains' Meeting obligations. 14 teams failed to do Duty (a huge improvement on the previous season) and 8 captains let down their sides by not attending their compulsory Captains' meeting. Three of the 15 forfeits were by one team in B7 grade. Eventually I received 79 of the 83 scorebooks. Thank you to the club officials who spent time completing all sections, especially Sheets B, C and D. If these are done, all falls into place easily and a comprehensive record of the season is available. I find it hard to understand how a club can make awards to its players if it has no record of their performances. A copy of Sheet D is retained by the Association to assist with grading in subsequent seasons.

Scorebooks again were generally very poorly kept. In only 4 grades was the standard sufficiently high to merit a scorebook award. Congratulations to those 4 valuable members of their respective clubs.

Again, despite extensive searches, including cross-checks with opposition books, it was difficult to verify Wicketkeepers' performances; indeed in many books it was difficult to identify who the keeper was, especially if he bowled occasionally. Also, please try to get your teams to note the names of those who take catches just as they note the name of bowlers. The honour of taking most catches for the season should be highly regarded..

Martin Shield No 1

Round 1 Sutherland 186 (Nathan Fisher 63, Tim Reynolds 17, Stuart Magnay 17, Guy Stewart 14, Jamie Marr 13, Mitch Seeto 11*)
Def St George 167 (Dean Parker 4-40, Martin Graham 3-23) at Caringbah Oval 31.10.04.

This year is the 10th anniversary of Sutherland last winning the Martin Shield. That campaign was dubbed the "Road to Raby" led by the great man Ben "Dover" Connell. I was fortunate to be part of that team, an unforgettable experience for all concerned. What better way to celebrate it than to win it again.
