To all Members of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association Boys' Competition

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The thirteenth annual report and financial statement for the year ended 30/4/70 is submitted on behalf of the executive committee for your approval and adoption.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON

The '69-70 season saw a change in the executives of the Association, as Jim Daly retired as President, and Mort Edson as Secretary. Due to the devotion of the previous executive and the help of the continuing members of the committee, the transition was managed without major disruptions. The Club officials and delegates also ensured that the Association operated effectively by their generous assistance.

The clubs entered 89 teams and registered 1,225 players in the boys' competition. Despite difficulties with grounds, the season was successful, with little loss of play and many outstanding performances by the boys.

A high point in the history of the Association was reached during the season with victory in the Shell sponsored N.S.W. Junior Union inter-district competition.

The boys selected to represent the Sutherland Shire played excellently and won the Shell Shield for the best overall performances.

The social activities of the season were highlighted by the cricketers' dinner and the end of season cabaret.

Social meetings were held with the executive committee of the St. George Boys' Competition, the Sutherland District Club, the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, and the Sutherland Shire Cricket Umpires' Association.

Once again boys' cricket continued due to the efforts of the club officials and delegates. Without the help of these devoted people and the work of the team managers, coaches, scorers, parents, friends and supporters, our Association would not flourish as it does.

GROUND AND WICKETS

We appreciate the efforts made by council during this season to provide grounds for the use of the boys. The new grounds provided at Kareela, Box Road No. 2 and Lincoln Oval, were very successful. It is hoped that the wickets at Heathcote No. 2 and Anzac Oval No. 2 will be used to better advantage when these grounds are fully developed.

The wickets at Carlingbah North and Seymour Shaw No. 3 were not used at all this season, while those at Sylvania Oval and Jannali Oval were not used after the Christmas break. The available concrete pitches at Anzac Oval, the Captain Cook grounds and Shell Point were used for about half the season. These grounds will be examined closely next season to see if the rest from summer sport has resulted in the expected improvement.

Several changes to the draw were necessary to cope with the annual top dressing programme. Grounds had to be withdrawn at short notice, but co-operation by the clubs concerned enabled the necessary alterations to be overcome in all but one instance.

The Sutherland Shire Council has decided to set the top dressing programme after consultation between the Chairman of the Parks, Playgrounds and Golf Course Committee, and the Shire Engineer. It is hoped that the effect of this decision will ensure that the 1970-71 season is not disrupted by ground withdrawals and every effort will be made to keep deviation from the draw to a minimum.

Following joint meetings of the Shire cricket bodies, it was decided to appoint a Cricket Co-ordinator. One of the functions of the co-ordinator will be to negotiate with Council on ground problems which arise during the season. We hope that this appointment will lead to greater co-operation with council during the coming seasons resulting in better use of the available grounds.

Despite the advances made this season one outstanding problem remains—larger sized grounds are urgently required for the older age groups. Fields with full sized boundaries must be provided.

We must thank Council again for their efforts, in particular Councillor Skluner, the Shire Engineer, Mr. Wood, and our "contact" man, Mr. Eugene

Morris. We hope that continued co-operation will lead to improved sporting grounds on which the Shire can be justly proud.

TREASURER

Finance. As income does not commence until playing fees come to hand, expenses at the beginning of next season have to be met from funds in hand. Sufficient funds are held to meet these expenses which will be approximately \$1200.

It is considered necessary to levy a capitation fee of 25 cents per team next season for affiliation with New South Wales Junior Cricket Union.

At the Annual meeting your committee will recommend that a nomination fee of \$2.00 per team will apply at the commencement of the season to meet our needs in these days of ever increasing costs.

Matting. Your Association was able to contribute towards the heavy cost of matting and repairs on a half share basis with the senior association, and our contribution for the coming season is estimated at approximately \$400. As this is one of our largest expenses it follows that matting should be treated with a great deal of care.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

The 1969/70 Season showed an increase in teams and players. This season there were 15 Clubs with a total of 1,225 boys, who went to make up 89 teams. This represented an increase of two teams and 65 players. Club totals were as follows:—

The Club Secretaries were very co-operative this season and certainly made my job easier.

With the advent of the six team competition, the standard of cricket for the season was lifted to the highest we have seen to date. Some clubs are, however, still overloading teams and this shows in the general standard of play. After only three rounds of the season there were no vacancies left in the U/12 and U/10 Divisions, so boys are reminded that registrations should be made early in order to avoid disappointment.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The Sylvania Club, winners in the 1968-69 season, were again successful and will hold the Laurie Pender R.P. Jannall Trophy for another year. Sylvania finished well clear of the field with an eighteen point margin over the second club, Jannall. Only four clubs finished with more than 100 points: Sylvania 122.7, Jannall 104.3, Gymea Bay 104.3, and Cronulla R.S.L. 100.8. The continued success of Sylvania is a tribute to the quality of the officials of that club. The hard working officials and supporters of Sylvania are to be congratulated—their knowledge of cricket and their organisation led to their achievements.

The club championship point scoring system is designed to encourage clubs to enter more teams and to enter them in "A" grade competitions. The match points scored by "A" grade teams are multiplied by 5, "B" grade match points by 3, "C" grade match points by 2, "D" and "E" grade match points by 1. The sum of the points calculated in this way are divided by the number of teams in the clubs plus 1. Sylvania had

teams in three "A" grade competitions and won the 15A and 10A divisions. Our congratulations to Sylvania.

TROPHY COMMITTEE

The Trophy Committee met on several occasions and after due consideration of all performances decided that the following players were worthy of the special trophies awarded by the Association.

Cricketer of the Year.

John Dyson, of the Jannall Cricket Club, was selected by the trophy committee to receive the John Woodhouse Memorial Trophy.

In club cricket John scored 796 runs (an Association record) at an average of 72.38 and took 57 wickets at an average of 8.15 runs per wicket. He represented the Shire in the Watson Shield team. John is an excellent fieldsman, batsman and bowler. He is well liked by all and thoroughly deserving of this honour.

Worthy of Mention.

Robert Jordan and John Prendergast, of the Miranda Magpies Cricket Club, performed well with the bat; Chris Gardner, of the St. Patrick's Sports Club, excelled behind the stumps, while Graham Eke, of Jannall Cricket Club, is to be commended on his bowling achievement. Robert, John and Graham represented in the Watson Shield team, which was captained by John.

Best Performance 14A Grade.

The Sutherland District Cricket Club award goes to Andrew Hilditch, of Caringbah Junior Sports Club.

Andrew turned in an all round performance in club cricket, scoring 427 runs at an average of 61.0, and taking 38 wickets at an average of 7.92 runs per wicket.

Other players who performed creditably and scored high marks were Simon Oxley, of Cronulla R.S.L.; Colin Radford, of Sylvania Youth Club; Lance Howes, of Engadine Dragons; and Greg Seymour, of Miranda Magpies. All boys represented in the Moore Shield team, which was captained by Andrew.

Best Performance 12A Grade.

Bruce Handley, of the Gymea Bay Cricket Club, was selected to hold the Sutherland United Services Club Trophy for his all-round performance in the 12A grade competition.

Bruce scored 374 runs at an average of 34.9 and took most wickets in the grade, 62 at an average of 6.2 runs per wicket.

Three contenders from Jannall Cricket Club turned in commendable performances. Keith Dyson had another solid year with the bat, Warren Moodie scored well with bat and ball, while Brian Moodie scored 281 runs, and took 26 wickets behind the stumps. All boys represented in the successful Cawsey Shield, which was captained by Warren.

Best Performance 10A Grade.

Gary Whatley, of the Miranda Magpies Cricket Club, was the choice of the trophy committee to receive the Len Gillam Trophy.

Gary scored 446 runs in club cricket at an average of 74.33, and captured 67 wickets at an average of 4.13 runs per wicket. He represented the Shire in the Foster Shield team.

Steven McGowan, of Woronora Cricket and Baseball Club, and Mark

Standen, of Miranda Magpies Cricket Club, are highly commended. Both boys gained selection in the Foster Shield team, which was captained by Gary.

THE MORT EDSON SHIELD

This shield was presented for the first time last season. It is for annual competition between the Sutherland team, which represent the Shire in the Junior Union inter-district series.

Points are allocated to each team in the following way based on the result of each match, the number of runs scored, and the number of opposition wickets taken: Outright win, 6 points; first innings win, 4 points; draw or tie, 3 points; first innings loss, 2 points; 5 points for each 50 runs completed; 2 points for each wicket taken. Additional points are added to this total for byes, forfeits or loss of play, based on the average points scored in other matches played.

The Watson Shield team are the 69/70 winners with a total of 232 points. Other teams recorded the following points: Cawsey No. 1, 177; Moore No. 1, 162; Cawsey No. 2, 128; Foster No. 1, 124; Moore No. 2, 112; Foster No. 2, 66.

Snow Davies: In his first year of office your new President brought an efficient business-like air to each meeting. He made it clear from the start that we were there in the interests of cricket. A very good start to many terms of office.

Lance Ray: Always available to negotiate with Council on ground problems, umpire, manage teams, or bring his wide experience in cricket to solve Association problems. A great help to "Snow" as Senior Vice-President. Lance managed the Green Shield team, and also accepted the position of Cricket Co-ordinator during the season. We wish Lance all the best in this important post.

Mort Edson: Mort contributed as much as ever to cricket in the shire. He became Deputy President of the District Club, provided publicity for cricket in general and gave every possible assistance to ensure that the change of executive officers did not inconvenience the operation of the Association.

Cam Taylor: A very efficient Treasurer, Cam played an important part by controlling the Association finances. He always went out of his way to help Clubs with any problems which arose. Cam is to be congratulated on his work for the Association.

Gordon Thomson: Gordon was called on to assist the new executive officers and his many years of experience stood the committee in good stead on many occasions. In recognition of his valuable contribution a new Association trophy has been named in his honour.

He is always sympathetic to club secretaries and their problems when registering players. His record of work is an enviable one. We are fortunate to have Jack with the Association.

Frank Pattinson: Frank served his first term as an executive official and proved a valuable asset to the committee. His experience with the Miranda Magpies helped in running the affairs of the Association. Frank has a charming manner which impressed officials from other Associations. We hope that he will remain with us for many years.

Rick Loomes: Rick rejoined the committee for a second term, and assisted with his experience gained over many years with the Gynea Bay Cricket Club. He takes a keen interest in cricket and sport generally. Rick always adopted an impartial viewpoint at all meetings.

SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB

Congratulations to the District Club on their splendid achievements in winning the \$500 Rothman's Knock-out Competition, and of contesting the finals in Third Grade and the Poidevin-Gray Shield.

The management committee was again headed by Bryan Hazell as President and John Smythe as Secretary. Thanks to their understanding and co-operation, a close, harmonious relationship was again maintained—this is vital for the advancement of cricket in the shire. Senior district officials were always in attendance at our functions and frequent discussions were held with them. Special thanks to Vic Dwyer for his help in providing umpires for the representative fixtures. All matches were controlled by officially appointed umpires and the usual high standard was maintained.

N.S.W. JUNIOR UNION

Once again we wish to congratulate the Union on the excellent manner in which the inter-district competition was organised and conducted.

The Association was fortunate in reaching the finals of the Watson and Cawsey Shields. For the first time the Moore, Cawsey and Foster Shield finals were played on turf wickets. This move to turf is to be applauded, but more notice would be appreciated so that the boys could be given more time to become accustomed to the new surface.

CRICKET UNITY

During the season several meetings were held with executive members of the Sutherland District Cricket Club, and the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association to discuss ways and means of improving cricket in the Shire. As a result of these meetings, Mr. Lance Ray accepted the position of Cricket Co-ordinator to liaise with Council, and act as a central source of information to co-ordinate dates of meetings and other cricket functions. This appointment was subsequently confirmed at meetings of each of the Associations.

These joint meetings have been ably chaired by the President of the Sutherland District Club, Mr. Brian Hazell.

This Association was represented by the President, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, Mr. G. Thomson.

These meetings have been very helpful and it is hoped that the

interchange of ideas will lead to effective action on such matters as forming a Cricketers' Club, providing adequate coaching for young players, advancement of players to the District Club, and other matters of mutual interest to cricketers in the Shire.

COACHING

During the season the Sutherland District Cricket Club once again assisted the boys by providing coaching. The programme was extended this year to include five clubs, as well as groups from the Under 14 and Under 12 representative teams.

The clubs were selected by ballot and players from Caringbah Sports, Miranda, Gynea, Jannall and Como, were coached by members of the Grade teams. Mr. Grant Le Hurray ably organised the attendance of coaches, while the club executive arranged the grounds, kits of gear and attendance of players.

The District Club is to be congratulated on the effort that has been put into this venture. When we realise that many of the grade players are young and there is a need for an internal coaching scheme, their attempts to assist the boys indicates the thoughtful approach taken by the present executive. This help is fully appreciated.

Thanks are due to Mr. Lance Ray and parents of the representative players who assisted at the rep. team practice session. The nets were erected and the gear provided by the boys' supporters.

PUBLICITY REPORT

The Publicity times were varied during the season when the deadline was switched from the Sunday Letter Box to Saturday afternoon ringing in. This was brought about by the excellent response to the Sunday Telegraph Publicity.

Club Publicity Officers did well in the time limit placed on them and several ladies, too numerous to mention, were delegated with this honour. To these people I offer my thanks for your endless co-operation.

Not one club could be singled out for lack of co-operation as could be seen in the results. There were, however, two grades, U/16A and U/14C, who were lax in contributing results. 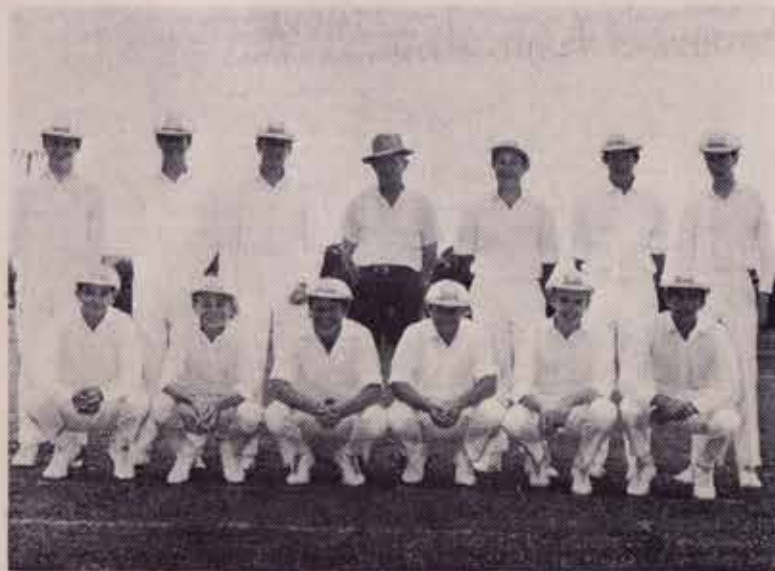

Competition Secretary's Report

COMPETITIONS

The 1968-70 season was played in good spirit and keen cricket resulted in most of the grades with quite a few competitions being decided late on the final day.

Most of the six team competitions were very keenly contested. In the 14A division the three leading teams were each defeated on three occasions. The 12A grade was very close — any one of three teams could have taken out the premiership on the last day. Two points separated the leading teams in the 12B grade, a play-off was required in the 12C's, the 12D grade was decided by 7 runs with the top teams playing a virtual final in the last match and a similar situation occurred in the 12E's. In fact the Under 12 competitions provided the major surprises with quite a few favourites being beaten.

The 10A and 10B provided the younger players with solid grounding in the game but the runaway wins of St. John Bosco 10C and Cronulla R.S.L. 10D may lead to some revision in grading, particularly in the 10D grade where boys who have only one year in the Under 10 grade tend to dominate the boys who have two or three years in the age group. Consideration could be given to making the 10D grade for boys with more than one year in the age group.

One drawback of the six-team competition is that in Round 11 teams play each other for the third time. Consideration could be given to ending the competition at Round 10 and having a final between the leading two teams with a redraw for the lower four teams. It is worth thinking about.
