Ladies and Gentlemen,

I now present to you the eighteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 1973/74 season for your approval and adoption.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON.

Players for the 1973/74 season were down on the previous season, though we were able to maintain the same number of grades, thereby making the competition keener. Many results hinged on the final day.

Although there were not as many wet days in this season as compared with the previous one, it came at a bad time when the heavens opened up on the last day and caused some major upsets.

Delegates' meetings were once again well attended by most of the clubs, but some delegates did not always take back all relative information to their clubs and many points were lost. The general, all-round interest of the delegates in the meetings was most gratifying to the Executive.

OUT OF THE PAST.

The Annual Report for the season 10 years ago stated:- "One disappointment, however, was that the Miranda Magpies Club, with a great tradition of past Association performances and achievements did not take a prominent part in Association administrative affairs as it has done in the past. It is hoped that this will be remedied."

This club can now boast several members on the Executive as well as a member on the trophy committee, surely a good achievement. Perhaps the very successful Engadine Dragons Club could take up the call now and provide some Executive members.

GROUNDS AND WICKETS.

The graunds and wickets this season were on the whole very good and here we must thank the President of the Sutherland Shire Council, Mr. Kevin Skinner, and Mr. Joe Starkey, for their untold assistance and co-operation during the season.

FINANCE.

From a financial point of view, the Association did not fare well this season. The continued rising costs of matting and repairs always manages to take a large percentage of our funds. Trophies once again will be a major expense, as also will be the Annual Report, the cost of which is fast approaching the stage where it will be priced beyond our means. Although our expenses for the season will be approximately the same os the previous one, our receipts were less as we had fewer teams and players.

One of the greatest causes of concern this season seemed to be the failure of some fieldsmen to signal fours. Managers should instruct their fieldsmen that the boundary is defined from an imaginary straight line from flag to flag.

Another cause for concern was the bad sportsmanship shown by some players when given out. Never question the Umpire's decision and never blame your fellow batsman, we are all entitled to make an error.

CAP PRESENTATION.

Cap Presentation was held at Caringbah Oval on Sunday, 2nd December, 1973, and as the weather was fine, we were able to hold it in the open. After the Presentation by our Official Guests, the teams had their photographs taken by Mr. David Robertson, the teams then left to play in the Rob Allen Series.

ADMINISTRATIVE CENTRE.

The Administrative Building has started to take shape and if the success of our 'Get Together' with St. George and Georges River is any guide, we can be assured that this Centre can be put to good use. Our visitors commended us on having our own hall and made the Boys' Association see just how necessary this building is.

Perhaps we might all pull together and make a success of any function held, to raise money and so make the future of this venture come to pass. Our special thanks to Mr. Ken Prendergast for his untiring efforts in this regard.

PRESENTATION EVENING.

Presentation Evening was once again held in the Port Hacking High School Auditorium, on Saturday, 23rd June, 1973, with a capacity crowd. The programme flowed smoothly and considering the large number of teams, finished at a reasonable time.

The excellent array of trophies for Premierships, Special Awards and Representative Certificates were presented by our fine line-up of Special Guests.

During the evening two Life Memberships were bestowed on Mr. Jack Rutty and Mr. Ron Hilditch, each of these men received silver trays.

Jack received his presentation after serving six years as Publicity Officer, a job he coupled later with that of Registrar. He relinquished the job of Registrar at the commencement of the 1972/73 season to take on that of Secretary.

A fall-off of teams was only to be expected after last year's record of 134 teams. The number of teams was down by 34, but it was pleasing to note that only 6 of these were in the Under 16 Division and we were still able to field 3 grades of 6 teams in this age group.

Grading this season resulted in the same number of competitions being run as last season. It was pleasing to note that teams were fielded after the competition started, to take up the byes in the 16C and 12D grades—in fact, Cranulla R.S.L. and St. Patrick's Clubs joined forces and fielded a composite team in the 12D grade.

Quite a number of premierships were decided on the last day and 2 play-offs were necessary—in the 16C and 12D grade competitions. Strangely, the largest margin in the premiership points occurred mostly in the "A" grade competitions, namely the 16A - 11 points; (this being the largest); 14A - 10 points; 12A - 7 points and 10A - 8 points—these competitions together with the 14E - 10 points; 10C - 10 points and 12B - 8 points.

Eight competitions were decided by three points or less—more than 50% of the competitions.

PREMIERSHIPS.

Engadine took honours in this department, taking out 4 premierships from 8 teams, notching the 12A, 10A, 12E and 10C. Not far behind was Gymea Bay who claimed the 16A, 14D and 12C. Then followed Miranda Magpies, St. Patrick's and Heathcote, 2 premierships each and with one each to Caringbah Sports, Sylvania, Januali and Boys' Town, the list is complete.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP.

Engadine won the Club Championship for the third time, when they streaked away by 23 points from a close group of 4 clubs, Miranda Magpres, Caringbah Sports, Sylvania and Gymea Bay.

Engadine's great strength lay in the four premierships they secured in the U/12 and U/10 age groups. They entered 5 teams in these two divisions and only missed out with their 12B side. Also they were one of only two clubs who fielded "A" grade teams in each age group.

Runners-up, Miranda Magpies, scared more points than last season, when they were successful with 93.5 points.

Caringbah Sports moved up from 4th to 3rd, whilst Sylvania slipped further down the ladder to 4th place, the lawest position they have accupied since the Championship commenced in the 1965.66 season.

St. Patrick's Club had a dramatic rise up the list, rising from 12th last year with 61 points to 6th this year, a great effort with 2 premierships.


