In our suburban environment there are no longer paddocks and fields or back streets for these children to express their likes and dislikes for the various sports, and the only alternative is to journey to the local park to participate in organised sport which hopefully ensures that all ages obtain their true and rightful share of these playing fields.

In cricket we have an unwritten Law that "The benefit of any doubt must go to the batsman". It is the tolerant and fair attitude demanded by this phrase and accepted without dissent by players which has helped to make cricket the top national sport of Australia. If club officials, parents and spectators could apply such tolerance so that "the benefit of any doubt must go to the opposition" all sport would be far more enjoyable and many of the squabbles and incidents which build up the ornament of those who oppose organised sport would disappear.

It must be remembered that we are assisting in moulding the future of thousands of Young Australians. I ask all officials to consider this grave responsibility wisely, and to act accordingly.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure I present to you the nineteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 1974/75 season for your approval and adoption.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON.

We saw yet another drop in teams and players and were unable to field the same number of grades as in previous seasons. The competition was well fought in most grades with many 'cliff hangers' played on the final day. Weather wise, this would have been one of the best seasons to date with only one day being completely washed out giving us a full season of cricket.

Most clubs were well represented at Delegates Meetings, having at least one delegate at each meeting. Clubs would do well to remember that having a delegate at each meeting is most important if they wish to know what is going on within the Association.

GROUNDS AND WICKETS.

Once again grounds and wickets were good considering the amount of work these grounds get. To the outgoing President of the Council, Mr. Kevin Skinner, who has been a good stalwart over the seasons and the incoming President, Mr. Peter Lewis, who we feel can be relied upon for the same support. Also, to Mr. Bill Sibley, the thanks of the Association are extended.

FINANCE.

The major expenses again this season will be our Annual Report and Trophies. The cost of the Annual Report, however, will be kept to a minimum due to a different method of production. The trophies, considering the rising costs, will be on the same par as last season.

Another major expense to the Association was matting and with the cost of this soaring higher still, further ways of protecting this costly item are being looked at.

CAUSE FOR CONCERN.

The teaching of gamesmanship by managers should take precedence over the attitudes of some through the season of win at all costs. We should primarily teach the boys how to play cricket and how to be good losers as well as winners. If all points are followed then all players can say we enjoyed the game.

Remember, when umpiring, if there is any doubt in the mind then the benefit of that doubt must go to the batsman, regardless of which team is batting at the time.

If the grass grows over the edges of the pitch, it will only take a short time to do it yourselves. It takes very little time to get to and do the job but takes ages to talk about and discuss the matter.

CAP PRESENTATION.

Cap Presentation was held on Sunday, 3rd October, 1974 at Caringbah Oval and was well attended by official guests and supporters. The weather for a change was perfect for this day. After the presentation the boys had their photographs taken and proceeded to their games in the Executive Shield.

PRESENTATION EVENING.

Presentation Evening for the 1973/74 season was held for the first time at the Gynea High School Auditorium. For the first time since I can remember we held our crowd to almost the end and this may have been due to the fact that we were able to heat the hall.

The evening was well attended by our official guests who presented the trophies for Premierships, Special Awards and Representative Certificates.

A highlight of the evening was the Presentation of Cricketer of the Year to Bruce Handley of the Gynea Bay 16A's. Bruce created a record in that

season by being the winner of this excellent award for the second season in succession.

At the conclusion of the Presentations our official guests were entertained at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Lance Handley and the thanks of the Association is extended to them for this fine gesture.

TROPHY COMMITTEE.

The decisions of the Trophy Committee, after careful consideration on special trophies, were as follows:-

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR. "JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

The Cricketer of the Year for the 1974/75 season is Ken Hudson of the Miranda Magpies 16A's.

Ken has been playing with the Magpies Club since he first started cricket in the U/10's and had his best season to date in scoring in excess of 2,000 runs for the season; he scored 805 of these in the 16A and broke the record which had been held by John Dyson since the 1969/70 season. Ken is an aggressive right hand batsman and very useful bowler. He captained his team in the 16A's and they finished as Premiers in their Division. He was also a member of the successful Watson Shield side.

Also considered for this award were John Wagner (Caringbah Junior Sports), Peter McMahon (St. Patrick's), Dean Ferguson (Engadine Dragons) and Bruce Nocker (Miranda Magpies).

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A GRADE. "SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

This trophy was won by Peter Bishell of Sylvania Heights Youth Club. Peter performed well in his club team as well as the Harold Moore No. 1 side. He has been playing cricket in the Shire for a number of years now and will be a force to reckon with in the years to come. Congratulations Peter.

Also considered for this award were David Steed and Paul Clark of Caringbah Sports, Malcolm McCool and David Craddon, Miranda Magpies, and Rodney Clarke of Sylvania Heights.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A GRADE. "UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Winner of this award was Graham Arnold of the Gynea Bay Club. Graham is a batsman and wicket-keeper. Although he performed very well with the bat throughout the season, he was outstanding in the wicket-keeping department. The 1974/75 Watson Shield continued the run of success of its predecessors, the 1973/74 side, by recording a convincing win over St. George in the Final. This side consisting of only two of last year's teams had great depth in both batting and bowling. The batting went down to number nine or ten, there were always seven recognised bowlers in the team. I feel that this great all round strength was the reason for the team's success.

Over the four shield games leading to the final, there was certainly some great cricket and good performances with each match producing something special. John, with the aid of Stephen Jones 44 and Ken Hudson 40, saw us close our innings at 4-186 in the smart time of 118 minutes.

The third game against Bankstown was another exciting finish with Stephen Jones hitting a four off the last ball of the day to give us an outright win. This was a bowlers match with Bruce Booker, our leading wicket, capturing four wickets in each innings and Stephen Kelloway and John Wagner each taking three wickets. John, getting his 3 in the first over, bowled in the second innings to start the Bankstown collapse.

The last match against Camden was a struggle all the way and it wasn't until thirty runs partnership for the seventh wicket between the consistent Stephen Jones and Bruce Booker that we were able to pass our opponents moderate score of 134 runs.

The depth and consistency of our bowling was never more evident than in the final where our bowlers sent down a total of 67 overs on a very easy pitch to dismiss St. George for 145 with Stephen Kelloway 20 overs, Bruce Booker 19 overs and Peter McMahon 16 overs, all putting in marathon spells of accurate bowling - they were well supported by the spinners Mark Freddy and Peter Noakes.

As good as the pitch was our opening batsmen Ken Hudson and Peter McMahon made it look even easier with Ken hitting a masterful 95, this followed his great century against St. George in the Robb Allen Shield and his 360 runs in the Representative season was an outstanding effort. Peter completed a fine double in scoring 48 not out. This talented all rounder playing in his first Representative series proved to be one of the finds of the season. Ken and Peter required only 29 overs to score the necessary runs.

The team was very capably lead by Peter Noakes and all players gave him their wholehearted support. His bowling changes and field placing in the final was first class. MANAGER'S REPORT ON MOORE NO. 1 TEAM 1974/75 SEASON.

During the season this team played three Shell Shield matches, the Executive Shield, the Bob Allen Shield and three practise matches, including one against the Watson No. 2 side.

The results of these matches were one outright win, four 1st innings wins and three 1st innings losses. One of the losses was on the second last ball of the day, whilst against Bankstown, two more overs would possibly have given us an outright win instead of a 1st innings loss.

In the Moore Shield, we came second in our division only 44 behind the winners and this was only due to some unexpected dropped catches in the last match because the boys were too over-anxious. Other than this, the ground fielding and catching throughout the season was exceptional for this age group.
