It is with pleasure I present to you the twenty first Annual Report and Financial Statement for the 1976/77 season for your approval and adoption.

SUMMARY OF THE SEASON

There was a very slight decrease in teams this season after the withdrawal of one team and a new club which had intended to enter and through lack of experience sat the season out with occasional social games with other teams. We hope to see the in the coming season.

Weather, which plays an important part in the competition was only fair. The plastic ball being used for the second season certainly proved to be successful for players and was appreciated by the managers as they no longer have the time consuming task of laying mats.
