PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

It gives me much pleasure to present this report as President of your Association.

Reflecting on the 1978/79 season, although I feel we can say it was successful in many ways from both administration and players point of view, it is evident that we are being affected by our modern society. The saturation of cricket in our homes by way of T.V., radio and newspapers, is having a marked effect on young players and sadly not always for the good of the game. The querying of decisions, "sledging", and bad sportsmanship that is a big part of first class cricket is being copied by many young players instead of learning from the splendid cricket that has at times been played. Unless we, as officials and parents, discourage this quickly then the sport known as the "gentlemen's game" will be lost forever.

Another area of concern is the dress of young players. It has always been a rule of your Association, that players wear all white, including shoes, and if available, your Club cap. It was very evident this last season that parents were not insisting their sons look the part, so please assist this year and thereby show you are proud to play for your club.

There are strong recommendations from some clubs to alter rules for lower aged and graded teams so that more boys are participating in each match, but I sincerely question whether rule changes are the answer. I agree that cricket should be available and provided for every boy who wishes to play and they should be encouraged to stay in the game, but surely it is our responsibility to teach them "real cricket" and what the game means. Too many times these days, in all spheres of life, rules are changed to suit the society, whereas perhaps with cricket we should be trying to change society to meet the rules that have been in existence since cricket began and which have produced many great players. Rule changes are the easy way out and will not bring brighter cricket. Only the managers and boys themselves can do this and it is up to each club to train, assist and encourage their managers to play in the interest of all boys and instill that desire and right to win. It should not be forgotten that we are running a competition and awarding trophies and the responsibility is the clubs with the Association acting only as a watchdog.

My report would not be complete if mention was not made of how proud this Association is of the Australian Vice-Captain, Andrew Hilditch. Like all our present boys, Andrew started his cricket in a club side (Caringbah Sports) and went through to be Cricketer of the Year in 1971/72 and then played all his senior cricket with our local Grade Club. He has shown what hard work and dedication can achieve. We will follow his future with interest.

I congratulate your Club Delegates on the choice of my executive, for a President could not wish for a more willing and dedicated team. The "behind the scenes" work takes a tremendous amount of time and it was pleasing for me to see each member so ably attend to his or her duties.

Finally I thank you for the support shown to me as President this season and wish each club and player success in the future.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Executive of your Association, I now present to you, the Twenty Second Annual Report and Financial Statement for your approval and adoption.

THE SEASON UNDER REVIEW

Despite the drop of thirty one teams on the previous season, the 1978/79 season proved very successful. The number of players who register each season seems to be governed by the amount of publicity cricket receives in the months prior to the commencement of our season, and on how the Australian Team performs as a whole. Most of the publicity for cricket in the last season seemed to be on the N.S.C., while a lot of publicity was given to any errors made by the Test Team. Coverage for the Sheffield Shield Side was very poor and on many occasions it was difficult to locate the results of the games in the sports pages. This was the time when the publicity should have been at a peak as the N.S.W. side performed the best it had for many years, under the guidance of Andrew Hilditch.

OVER THE PAST DECADE

With the advent of Andrew Hilditch being selected as Vice-Captain of the Australian Team, I would like to print the 'Foreword' from the 1968/69 Annual Report as tribute to Andrew and an inspiration to the younger players. It is now ten years since Mort Edson included this in that report.

"THE BLOKES ON THE PARK"

'Test Cricketers they call themselves, crikey, I'd sooner watch the blokes on the Park'. We've all heard this remark at one time or another even in the era of the 'Golden Years', but although a mere expression of a cricket follower, it is in itself a tribute to Junior Cricket.

'The Blokes on the Park', the matting wicket cricketer, from six to sixty, the setting has remained practically unaltered over countless years, from the far outback to the inner cities. Open fields, hard wickets, hot days, the odd passer by, the scorers chatting together and the player padding up.

'The Blokes on the Park', so many play, so few are called to the turf. Some of the greatest have played on the park, literally cut their 'teeth' on the concrete, Trumper to Bradman, O'Reilly to Lindwall. How many have been denied the opportunity? How many are playing for sheer enjoyment? How many will stay in the game? Around the grounds you see them all. The tearaway bowler, the dedicated Umpire, the prolific rungetter, the 'also rans' who make up the number. Their Test Match is a week-end affair, their publicity is a score in a 'Local Rag', their reward is perhaps a small trophy, or many memories.

'The Blokes on the Park' despite scant recognition from high circles, play a major role in keeping cricket alive, they are the foot soldiers who form such a solid rock that they will continue to show the flag. Somewhere, in some park, in some Junior Fixture, will emerge a champion that will bring us to our feet. Junior Cricket is giving him opportunity, senior cricket must capitalise on it. 'The Blokes on the Park', cricket needs them.

I print this because ten years ago, Andrew Hilditch was playing Saturday morning Junior Cricket with Caringbah Sports in their 14A Side, he was a first year 14A, he played in the Moore Shield No. 2 side the same year, he had previously played and captained the Foster Shield Team and continued to play representative cricket through to the Watson Shield, and at the end of the 1971/72 season he was selected as the Association 'Cricketer of the Year'.

Congratulations Andrew on your selection, with the same dedication and will that you have shown over the years, perhaps more of the boys will follow in your footsteps. May we wish you every success that you deserve throughout the remainder of your cricket career.

GROUNDS AND WICKETS

The grounds were generally good as was the co-operation from the council at times. The winter codes respected our wishes of not watering the grounds on the Fridays, prior to our games on the Saturday mornings which was much better than previous.

Thanks are extended once again to Mrs. Jean Manuel, President, Mr. A. Andrews, Chairman of Parks and Playgrounds, Mr. E. Hurst, Shire Engineer, Mr. D. Walker, and Mr. E. Morris for their co-operation. A special mention to the staff who assisted when required to make the grounds more suitable for play.

CAUSE FOR CONCERN

One of the greatest causes for concern at the moment is the boys who will not accept the Umpires decision. Creeping into the game is the player who is making comments when being given out. This causes the executive of the association so much grave concern as it must also do to the umpires and officials from various clubs. A suggestion to the boys is, that when given out, learn to accept the fact that you are out, regardless of whether you consider otherwise. The decision of the umpire is final. Run-outs, L.B.W. and catches behind continue to cause the most concern and form the basis for most of the complaints. I again repeat, the services of the SUTHERLAND SHIRE UMPIRES ASSOCIATION is readily available to clubs, managers, coaches and players who wish to increase their knowledge of the game.

Another point that has to continually be brought to the notice of the players is that boys are expected to be dressed in all white which also includes footwear. No manager enjoys telling a player that he cannot bat or bowl if he is wearing coloured clothing or sandals, but the time has come when he must enforce this rule.

PRESENTATION NIGHT

The 1977/78 Presentation Evening was once again held in the Auditorium of Gynea High School with a capacity crowd in attendance. Various presentations were made throughout the night which included that of the Mort Edson Shield to the Harold Moore No. 1 team who narrowly defeated the Foster Shield for this award.

Premiership Trophies were presented to the various grades which included those to the Cronulla-Caringbah Leagues Club 14E and 12C Grades winning the first premier-ships for their club. They are to be congratulated for the manner in which they were dressed for the occasion. Other teams who are to be congratulated for their attire were:- Miranda Magpies 12A, Gynea Bay 12B and Caringbah Sports 10A.

One of the highlights of the evening was the presentation for Life Membership to Mr. Ken Whatley, a long serving member of the Association who has worked through various positions on the Executive of the association and is at present the Senior Vice-President. Ken is also the father of one of our former 'Cricketer of Year' winners, Garry Whatley.

As in past years the main presentation of the evening is that of the 'Cricketer of the Year' and the 1977/78 winner was Kevin Rynne, who captained the 16A Grade side for De La Salle, Caringbah and the Watson Shield Team. After his presentation Kevin made a speech which was a credit to both his family and his school. The previous Cricketer of the Year, Peter Bishell, was also on stage and paid tribute to Kevin while at the same time received his replica.

Thanks are extended to the Official Guests who made many of the presentations, to the Trophy Committee for their work before and after the presentation, to the staff of Gynea High School for their assistance in making the auditorium ready for the night. After the presentations the Executive and Guests attended the home of Mr & Mrs Ken Prendergast where supper was served, and our heartfelt thanks and appreciation go to them for the use of their home for this occasion.

A very disappointing part of the evening was the amount of people who left the hall after receiving their presentations and quite a few of the recipients were on stage to receive their awards to a very depleted audience. Quite noticeable was the number of representative players who left after receiving their awards.

CAP PRESENTATION

Once again in keeping with previous seasons, a large crowd of parents, players, supporters and Official Guests were present at Caringbah Oval for the presentation of Representative Caps to the various teams. The weather remained fine for this occasion after which the teams had their photographs taken and then proceeded to the various grounds for the first of their Inter-Association matches against the Illawarra Association.

FINANCE

This is a very important part of the running of the association, as unlike other sports we have no sponsors to keep us running. With the prospects that the N.S.W. Junior Union proposes to apply a much larger levy on all players this association may be forced to increase the fees to the various clubs in the forthcoming season this, will be done with regret.

The Association also plans to look at the State Government Insurance Scheme which is in operation to cover players and possibly cover the managers and officials at the games. All other aspects of the finance is covered in the financial statement elsewhere in this report.

TROPHY COMMITTEE

As in previous season the Trophy Committee worked long and hard in making their decisions for the various awards. This is never an easy task and is not made any easier when so many players turn in such fine performances. After careful consideration and much deliberation their findings were as follows:-

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR "JOHN WOOKHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

It is with much pleasure that we announce the Cricketer of the Year for the 1978/79 season is Graham Arnold. Graham has played all his cricket with the Gynea Bay club and has been playing since the U/10's. He is a wicket-keeper and strong batsman, he played 16A grade for his club as well as playing in the Watson Shield Team, the very unlucky Green Shield Team and was nominated for the Sutherland Award. Graham has played representative cricket since the Foster Shield and has always been a credit both to his club and the association.

G. Anderson, Engadine Dragons, R. Archibald, Gynea Bay, K. Dolan-Brown, Miranda Magpies and P. Welch, St. Patrick's, were also considered for this award.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A GRADE "SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKER CLUB AWARD"

Jeff Steed was the winner of this award, Jeff who plays for Caringbah Sports 14A was a strong contender for this award last season. Jeff was captain of his club's Premiership side and captain of the Harold Moore No. 1 Team. He is an excellent all rounder and a boy whose mind is working all the time on the cricket field.

Also considered were, S. Willis and D. Colley, Caringbah Sports, and P. Clift of St. Patrick's.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A GRADE "SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Anthony Quinn, St. Patrick's 12A, is the winner of this award, Anthony, like the Cricketer of the Year, is also a wicket-keeper and batsman who has improved each year. He comes from a cricketing family and was a member of the Arch Cawsey No.1 Side. Also considered were, S. Edwards, Grays Point and M. Lynch, St. Patrick's.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 10A GRADE "LEN GILLAM TROPHY"

The ultimate winner of the award was Christopher Ansell, Loftus, he is an all-rounder and once again comes from a cricketing family. Christopher has been playing cricket since he was seven years old and improves each year.
