INTRODUCTORY CRICKET

Introductory, or Tabloid Cricket as it was previously known, was commenced in the Sutherland Shire in 1979.

Introductory Cricket is restricted to the under 10C and D grade boys playing their first year of competitive cricket. The original purpose for this scheme was to introduce boys to the game by a series of Tabloid Cricket skills exercises, coupled with average cricket and traditional cricket competition. The scheme has been gradually refined over the years, with modified rules and equipment to suit boys of this size and age group. For instance, 12 boys per team, a smaller ball, shorter length of pitch, restricted overs and rotating batting order. All of which go towards making the task of getting used to the game a lot easier and more enjoyable for the boys.

The 1981/82 season was the most successful to date. The competition was divided into two parts. 5 rounds of average cricket and 5 rounds of traditional cricket. Competition points were awarded for each round and premiers declared at the end of the year. Coaches were encouraged to use the Tabloid Cricket skills exercise method at their practice sessions, using special equipment such as batting tees, bowling machines, catching, trampolines, etc.

The format of Introductory Cricket has retained the spirit of a competitive activity, whilst at the same time promoted the need to have all players participate.

I congratulate the Association for having their wisdom and courage and for being the first of many Cricket Associations throughout Australia, to introduce this scheme.

Looking forward to the coming season.

SUTHERLAND SHIRE LEADS WORLD IN BOTTLE RECYCLING STAKES

When 1,000 Bundeena households began having their empty glass bottles, jars and flagons collected in May, the service virtually completed the shire's bottle recycling programme.

The service which is run by Council in association with Australian Consolidated Industries Ltd. is now enjoyed by almost 50,000 homes in the shire.

Bottle recycling experts acknowledge that in covering an entire region of this magnitude, the Council-backed ACI scheme is unmatched on this scale anywhere in the world.

This achievement is attributable not only to the close co-operation of Council, ACI, and the local bottle merchants, but to enthusiastic acceptance by Sutherland Shire residents. The merchants are Southern Suburbs Industries and Caringbah Bottle and Glass Merchants.

In fact, most of the region was covered with this personalised door-to-door bottle recycling service over a period of six months in 1980. This was about half the time originally scheduled for the programme.

In the first three months of the programme alone, more than 170,000 bottles were collected, with some areas yielding up to four tonnes of glass in a single day.

Household bottle recycling enjoys a high acceptance rate elsewhere in Sydney's southern region. In addition to Sutherland's impressive performance, the neighbouring municipalities of Kogarah and Rockdale have also recently completed their door-to-door bottle recycling services, with a combined coverage of more than 50,000 homes.

These council-backed ACI programmes now reach more than half-a-million homes in suburban Sydney and in selected country areas of N.S.W.

In pioneering these services, Australian Consolidated Industries has confirmed its position as the leader and pace-setter in glass bottle recycling in Australia.

RAY TOZER: 1961/62 - MIRANDA

Ray holds the honour of being the first recipient of the highest individual honour available to boys in this Association. Fittingly, his record since then is second to none. As grade cricket did not come to this shire until 1965-66, Ray has played his grade cricket with the St. George District Cricket Club. He has played 1st grade cricket for the past 18 seasons as a wicketkeeper/batsman. In that period he has captained the team for seven seasons and has been a member of premiership winning teams on four occasions. Ray is currently a N.S.W. State Selector, evidence of the high esteem in which he is held in cricket circles.

MICHAEL KING: 1962/63 - ST. PATRICKS

Michael played for the strong St. Patricks team in the early 1960's, achieving great success as a deceptive swing bowler and sound batsman. He played in the city and suburban team for Sutherland which was a prelude to the entry of that club into the Grade competition. In later years, Michael achieved good results with the Cronulla Workers Club in the tough A1 competition. Unfortunately, a severe back injury has curtailed Michael's career in recent years, but there can be no doubt that he was an excellent cricketer prior to this injury.



BARRY DAVISON: 1963/64 - MIRANDA

Since leaving the junior ranks, Barry has continued his cricket career with the Sutherland District Cricket Club, except for a short stint in the country town of Inverell. He has enjoyed considerable success in 1st and 2nd grade and he is currently the official playing coach for the club. Barry is a member of the State Coaching Panel and this Association has enjoyed the benefit of his experience with his coaching sessions being very successful. In the couple of seasons Barry has acted as selector, coach and manager of our representative teams, he has achieved good results in this area. He continues to be an asset to the Association.



GLEN BAILEY: 1965/66 - JANNALI

After beginning his career with Caringbah Sports Club, Glen took out this coveted award as a member of the Jannali Club's premiership winning 16A team. He was an exceptionally talented cricketer being a powerful batsman and deceptive medium pacer with the ability to swing the ball either way in the air. Glen continued his career with Sutherland and is one of the most successful cricketers to have played for that club. He is currently playing 1st grade with Balmain.



BARRY McMANUS: 1964/65 - ENGADINE

Surprisingly, Barry McManus is the only player to date from the extremely powerful Engadine Dragons Club to have taken out the title of Cricketer of the Year. Barry was a forceful opening batsman, excellent runner between wickets, slow off spin bowler and brilliant fieldsman. His performances in his final year in junior cricket were exceptional. Since leaving the Association, Barry played with the Sutherland Grade Club for many seasons and also has been playing A. Grade cricket in the local senior competition.



PAUL VENN: 1966/67 - ST. PATRICKS

Paul Venn was one of the most successful cricketers ever to play in this Association. His all-round efforts, especially in his last two seasons in 16A's, were nothing short of amazing. After leaving the boys ranks he continued his career with the Sutherland District Cricket Club, where he played several seasons in 1st Grade as a punishing batsman and an exceptionally talented cover fieldsman. Paul also played approximately 180 1st grade games with the Cronulla-Sutherland Baseball Club. He hopes to return to grade cricket in the forthcoming 1982/83 season.





After playing all of his junior cricket with the Caringbah D.L.S., Mark Ray played with the Sutherland District Cricket Club for a couple of seasons prior to transferring to the University of N.S.W. Cricket Club in 1972/73.

University's gain has certainly been Sutherland's loss, as in the last decade Mark has proven himself to be one of the finest allround cricketers ever to be produced by this Association. A left hand opening batsman and orthodox off-spin bowler, Mark has played with two premierships winning 1st grade teams (1976/77 & 1980/81).

As well as being an exceptionally talented cricketer, Mark has also proven to be a skilful and astute leader of men, having captained his team to its win in 1980/81 and to second place in 1981/82. Sydney 1st grade cricket is a harsh test on a cricketer's ability and Mark's has been evidenced by the fact that he has taken out prestigious awards in two seasons. In 1976/77 he won the "Australian Cricket Magazine's" Sydney Grade Player of the Year Award, whilst in 1980/81 he took out this award again and the prestigious "Sydney Morning Herald" Cricketer of the Year Award as well.

During the past season Mark achieved the distinction of becoming the third cricketer produced by this Association to play first-class cricket when he was selected to play for N.S.W. against the mighty West Indians at the Sydney Cricket Ground. This honour has not come easily to Mark as many good judges believe that he should have attained this honour many seasons ago. It is to Mark's credit that he has finally received due recognition and it is to be hoped that he can prove to the selectors that he has much to contribute in the first-class arena.



After finishing his career with the Boy's competition, Phil played three seasons with the Sutherland District Cricket Club, during which he achieved considerable success as an opening bowler. Since then, however, the demands of two university courses have necessitated Phil to substitute "Park" cricket for Grade cricket. Phil has played for several seasons with the Penshurst Club in the Georges River- Penshurst competition. He is currently employed as a mathematics and computing consultant in the Liverpool region.

Stephen was one of the many fine cricketers who played with Sylvania in the late 60's and early 70's during a golden era when that club took out four consecutive 16A competitions. Stephen was a forceful middle order batsman and clever medium pace bowler and he supplemented these skills with sound displays of captaincy. After leaving the Boy's Association he performed well with the Sutherland District Grade Club for several years before leaving the district.



BOY CRICKETER OF THE YEAR 1969/70

JOHN DYSON

Playing all his boyhood cricket with Jannali, John completed his "Junior" years by being named "Cricketer of the Year" for the 1969/70 season.

Graded with Sutherland, the maturing John Dyson progressed to 1st grade and was chosen to make his first-class debut with New South Wales in the 1975/76 season.

When India toured Australia in the 1977/78 season, John was chosen to represent Australia in December, 1977 at the West Australian Cricket Ground in Perth. The still maturing John Dyson had arrived in Test Cricket - The ultimate dream of a boy cricketer!

Australia didn't actually perform brilliantly against the then world's best spin attack of Bedi and Chandra. Unfortunately, selectors are harsh on "Rookie" test players when the whole team plays badly and John Dyson's name "disappeared" for a time from the test lists. It was a period of drastic change in Australian Cricket, but the determination and dedication of John Dyson remained unchanged.

Sheffield Shield Bowlers soon found out that "Test discard" John Dyson had decided he wanted to climb that hill again and play cricket once more in the test arena. Runs rolled off his bat so prolifically that selectors once again bowed to his skills, selecting him to play against New Zealand in November, 1980.

Since returning to Test Cricket, John has played against India (in Australia), toured England, played against West Indies and New Zealand in Australia and has just returned from a tour of New Zealand. In all, he has played in nineteen tests, scoring just on 800 runs in 36 innings at an average of 25.12.

One of the problems of a budding cricketer is to be "labelled". If a batsman has great attacking flair and scores plenty of runs, he is the "next Bradman". If he has an excellent defence, dedication and patience, he is "another Boycott". John Dyson plays his game in between defence and attack in Sheffield Shield where the demands on his skills can be varied to the situation of the game. In Sheffield Shield, he has shown bowlers and opposing Captains that he can punish the ball as well as he can defend. His more than 4,000 runs in 69 games (eight centuries) testify to this.

Test Cricket has yet to see the best of John Dyson, although his 127 not out against the West Indies in January this year, gave notice that he should be a "permanent fixture" in our Test side. Perhaps the hot and cold attitude of selectors towards John has affected his confidence when he wears green and gold. It may be a good idea to tell him that Michael Holding and Joel Garner play for Victoria and Bob Willis and Ian Botham are South Australians!

Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association is proud to list John Dyson as one of its favourite sons and in twenty five years hence, we hope that several cricketers have been produced who can proudly boast being labelled as "another Dyson".

ANDREW HILDITCH: 1971/72 - CARINGBAH SPORTS

The elevation of Andrew Hilditch from Cricketer of the Year in 1971/72 to Vice-Captain of Australia's Test team in 1979 came as no surprise to the many people who had followed his career in junior cricket. From the time Andrew first started playing cricket in Under 10's he has been the perfect example of what hard work and dedication to practice can achieve.

In his final year in boy's cricket, Andrew captained both the Watson and Green Shield teams, and had great success as an opening batsman. After joining the Sutherland District Cricket Club he progressed rapidly, quickly reaching 1st grade (to date he has scored over 3,000 runs in that grade).

Andrew made his first-class debut with N.S.W. in the 1976/77 season and remarkably in only his second season in first class cricket, he was appointed captain of N.S.W. in 1977/78. His astute leadership contributed greatly to the improved performance of N.S.W. that season.

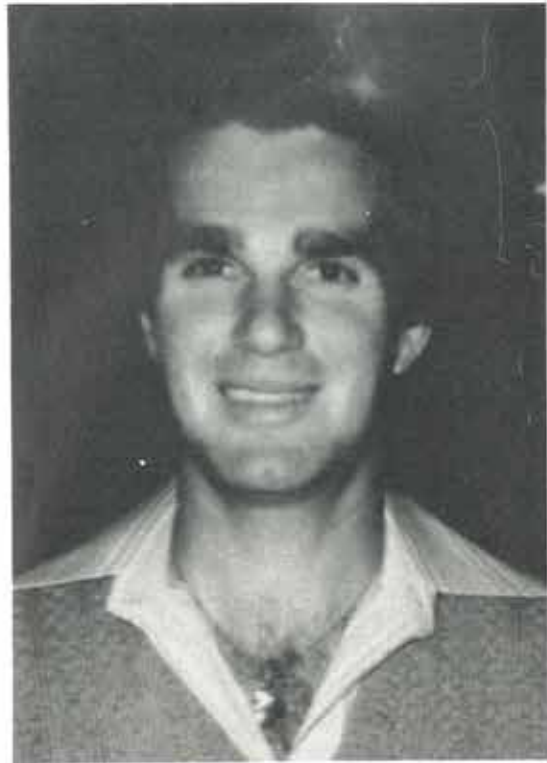
After good performances in Shield cricket, Andrew gained his first Test cap in 1979, playing against Mike Brearley's English team. Later that year he played in both Test matches against the strong Pakistan team. The Second Test in that series provided a sensation when Andrew became only the second player in the history of Test cricket to be dismissed "Handled the ball". Andrew was also selected to tour England to compete in the World Cup one day international series and also later on the tour to India. His Test Match record currently stands as follows:

Unfortunately in recent seasons Andrew has been unable to recapture the form which gained him Test selection. However, knowing his great determination, it will not be too long before Andrew Hilditch again resumes his representative career.

BRUCE HANDLEY: 1972/73 & 1973/74
GYMEA BAY

Bruce is the only player in the history of the Association to win this coveted award on more than one occasion. This achievement is understandable when one refers to his remarkable performances throughout his career (These performances are outlined in other sections of this report). Bruce played for the Sutherland District Cricket Club for several seasons before transferring to the University of N.S.W. Club, where he has established himself in 1st Grade as a hard hitting middle order batsman and outstanding close to the wicket fieldsmen. He played in the successful 1980/81 team which took out the 1st grade premiership.



GARRY WHATLEY: 1975/76 - MIRANDA

Garry Whatley, son of the current President of this Association played with the Miranda Magpies Cricket Club throughout his distinguished career in junior cricket. After leaving the boys competition he played with both Sutherland and St. George District clubs. As well as being an outstanding junior cricketer, Garry was also a state baseball representative. Recently Garry has turned to playing golf and he has displayed his great sporting versatility by playing off a handicap of 5.

KEN HUDSON: 1974/75 - MIRANDA

During his year in junior cricket Ken proved himself to be an outstanding batsman. He still holds the record for the highest aggregate of runs in the toughest grade of all - 16A's; considering the number of high quality batsmen to have played in this Association in the past 25 years, this is indeed a noteworthy achievement. Ken played for Sutherland for several seasons, quickly progressing through the grades. Unfortunately, as is the case with too many of our top cricketers, Ken is now playing for another club, having done very well with Randwick in the past season.



PETER BISHELL: 1976/77 - GYMEA BAY

In his years playing with this Association, Peter displayed great ability as an all-rounder. In his last season in junior cricket he captained the Watson Shield and he was the team's leading batsman in the Shell Shield matches. As well, his economical bowling reaped many valuable wickets for his team. Since leaving the junior ranks Peter has achieved considerable success playing in the South Coast competition.



KEVIN RYNNE: 1977/78 - CARINGBAH
D.L.S.

Kevin is another of the very dedicated and talented cricketers to have achieved the ultimate of all awards. Kevin displayed plenty of patience and determination in his approach to batting throughout his club and representative career in boy's cricket. He has now been playing with the Sutherland grade club for several seasons and has proven to be an excellent club man. We look forward to bigger and better results from Kevin in coming seasons; his great ability with the bat makes this inevitable.



MARK GARDINER: 1979/80 - MIRANDA

Mark is one of the best allround cricketers which this Association has produced in recent years. He enjoyed considerable success in club and representative cricket throughout his career in the junior ranks. This success has continued in the short period of time that Mark has played grade cricket with Sutherland. Early in the current season Mark was called up to 1st grade. A left arm spinner he has dedicated himself to learning the variations of his art and the experience which he has gained this year will undoubtedly be of enormous benefit in the future.



JEFF STEED: 1980/81 - CARINGBAH SPORTS

Jeff is one of the few players in the history of the Association to have played representative cricket in each and every season of his career in the boy's cricket (Foster Shield U/10 - 1973/74 to Watson Shield U/16 1980/81). In his last season in boy's cricket Jeff achieved the honour of being selected as captain of the Combined Sydney Green Shield No. 2 team. Jeff has now had a couple of seasons in Grade cricket and through hard work and dedication to improving his game he has now reached 2nd grade. With such a good attitude to the game, it is only a matter of time before Jeff achieves further honours with the club.



GRAHAM ARNOLD: 1978/79 - GYMEA BAY

There is little doubt that Graham is one of the best wicketkeeper/batsmen that has been produced by this Association. He achieved considerable success with the bat in representative and club cricket and won the award for best wicketkeeper in his grade on several occasions. In the short period of time in grade cricket, Graham has progressed rapidly through to the higher grades. At the end of last season Graham capped a fine season with his selection on 1st grade. Graham has also done very well in his winter sport; soccer - he is a current 1st grade player with Canterbury.





KEVIN TUITE: 1981/82 - ST. PATRICKS

It is fitting that in this, the Silver Jubilee year of this Association that Kevin Tuite from the St. Patrick's Club should win the Cricketer of the Year Award and accordingly receive the "John Woodhouse Memorial Trophy". John Woodhouse was a highly respected official from the St. Patrick's club and his untimely death shocked the Association. Kevin has illustrated over the past eight years great determination and a burning desire to succeed. He is a gritty left hand opener; the type of player that all teams need in order to give a sound start to an innings. This year he captained the Watson Shield team and also became the first player from this Association to be selected in a N.S.W. Under 16 team which played in the Australian Carnival in Adelaide. The success which he achieved in Adelaide clearly indicated a big future ahead for Kevin Tuite.

FOREWARD

At the conclusion of the 1967/68 season, an excellent publication entitled "Gateway to Cricket" was circulated to cricket lovers throughout the Shire. The booklet was edited by Mort Edson, the Association Secretary on behalf of the then President, Mr. J. A. Daly and executive officers.

In our Silver Jubilee Souvenir Yearbook we have attempted to up-date the history of boy's cricket within the Sutherland Shire and hereby acknowledge the invaluable assistance provided by Mr. Edson's diligent work.

Gateway to Cricket's analogy of "Early Beginnings" (Large oaks from small acorns grow) through "The seed is sown" - "The sapling grows" - "The foliage spreads" to finally "Solid Oak" into which the "Association Today" (1967/68) had grown, provided interesting reading.

Since 1967/68 the "Solid Oak" has been well cared for by its ensuing "foresteers" in the form of past Presidents, Secretaries and Executives up until the Jubilee year. The tree has turned into a SILVER OAK and shows no sign of woodworm or any other malady which could stop its natural growth to Golden Oak.

Much time and effort has been expended in preparing this up-dated set of statistical records and, whilst this yearbook already contains the names of two ex-boy cricketers who have donned the Green and Gold cap of Australia, rest assured that there are others lurking in the teams listed in this book.

Our Association has dominated the Shell Series Representative competitions over the last few seasons and, provided this trend continues, Sutherland Shire must and should dominate cricket in New South Wales in the not too distant future.

Whilst this 25 year old "Solid Oak" association of ours grew from the small acorn of the 16th of September, 1957, through tender love and care of its administrators - the "Seedlings" we are now producing from this nursery called the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association MUST be handled with the same tender care when "transplanted" to their new gardens (District Club and Men's Competition) for future growth. The game of cricket cannot afford to let these "seedlings" wither and fade away through lack of watering in this fertile cricket area.

It is disturbing when reading "Gateway to Cricket" to note phrases throughout the years such as "shortage of grounds force 2 matches on each weekend" (1959/60) - "Waratah ground developed" (1960/61) (one pitch!) - "ground position acute" (1962/63) - "ground shortage still a problem" (1966/67) - "promise of new playing fields" (1967/68). Sutherland Shire, unfortunately still lacks a large area in which anything up to sixteen medium to large sized cricket fields could be accommodated. Other districts still under development provide these large areas which could be used by winter codes to conduct their whole competition in the one area. What a boom this would be for sport in the Sutherland Shire!

The previous paragraph should not be taken as a criticism of the Sutherland Shire Council, its councillors or its town planners. Perhaps all sports administrators should learn to band together in an attempt to utilise the available lands in the shire to universal sporting use, with a break of possibly two to three weeks between winter/summer competitions to allow time for the grounds to recover.

Due to the vast area embraced by the Sutherland Shire, the family car is used almost exclusively to transport players to and from junior sports of all types throughout the year. This means that parents must be available to drive their offspring to their games. Obviously, some families with two or more children spend their weekends racing from ground to ground, often

several miles apart. A break between seasons would therefore be welcomed by parents and would avoid the "drop-out" rate experienced by some sporting codes (thankfully not cricket!) from 14 years and upwards. The increasing quest for independence stressed by this age group is encouraged by travel. Tired parents who suggest that these players organise to get themselves to their own games. If the player does not have sufficient dedication or keenness towards his or her code of sport to organise independent attendance at games, that code has a potential "Drop-out". Surely the time has come when all codes must get together to avoid the now obviously over-lapping between summer and winter codes?

We trust the statistical content of this journal makes interesting reading to cricket lovers throughout the shire and our junior cricketers follow the inspirational request of the English poet, Henry Newbolt!

DIARY OF HIGHLIGHTS

- 1957/58: "C" Grade competition under control of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association, 26 teams, 385 players.
- 1958/59: 32 teams - Jack Moodie as Secretary - Wally Croucher, Recorder.
- 1959/60: Association under its own control - Jim Daly becomes President. Finalists in Watson and Cawsey Shields - caps presented to representative teams. Shortage of grounds force 2 matches on each weekend.
- 1960/61: 47 teams - card registration system in operation. Waratah ground developed - Allan Fallins offers assistance from N.S.W. Umpires Association - Clubs grade own players.
- 1961/62: "Cricketer of the Year" award presented for the first time to perpetuate the memory of late treasurer, John Woodhouse. Association wins Watson Shield, captained by Ross Longbottom and managed by Kevin Kelly (snr.) - 67 teams, 1,150 players.
- 1962/63: Wes Hall lectures boys and gives cricket demonstration. Ground position accute - special deputation to council and prominence in local press. 89 teams, umpires school in operation.
- 1963/64: Resignation of Jack Moodie - subsequently elected life member - Mort Edson takes over as Secretary. 97 teams and 1,362 players. Printed fixture book. Association wins under 10 representative competition. Rob Allen Shield commences with St. George - N.S.W. Umpires Association assist 30 members qualify as official umpires.
- 1964/65: 114 teams, 1,594 players. St. Patricks field 16 teams - 3 hours of play for most teams. £130 donated to Senior Association for mats.
- 1965/66: Grade cricket comes to the Shire. District club win 4th grade premiership. New grounds relieve maintenance problem. 95 teams. Jack Ruddy prominent with publicity - Fred Mallion as recorder. Life membership to Rex King, Wally Croucher and Jim Daly. Club championship to Jannali - Michael Phillips takes 10-0.
- 1966/67: 102 teams, ground shortage still a problem. Presentations to Eric Hilzinger and George Merritt for services rendered. Social committee active. Successful cabaret and presentation.
- 1967/68: Association wins Moore Shield. Seven official representative teams. Many new records set - Shire record year - four senior and two junior titles. Another successful cabaret and promise from Council for more playing fields.
- 1968/69: Jim Daly retires after a record 10 years as President and Mort Edson retires after six years as Secretary. Allan Davidson attends reunion dinner. "Gateway to Cricket", a history of the Association was printed.
- 1969/70: Sutherland win Cawsey Shield, Watson Shield, Shell Shield (for best overall effort in representative cricket). Sylvania win second successive club championship - John Dyson selected as Cricketer of the Year. Sutherland 1st grade boasts eight local juniors.
- 1970/71: Engadine begin their reign as club champions. Sutherland win Green Shield for the first time - Cricket Administration Centre becomes a reality.
- 1971/72: Sutherland win Moore Shield - "Snow" Davies elected life member. Andrew Hilditch selected as Cricketer of the Year. Guidelines for selection of representative teams altered. Snow Davies and Ron Hilditch retire.
- 1972/73: Huge increase in teams. "Womens Lib" comes to cricket in the Shire with the election of three ladies to the Executive Committee. Caringbah Sports field 19 teams and win five premierships.
- 1973/74: Association again takes out Shell Shield - Watson Shield team successful. Jack Ruddy and Ron Hilditch receive life memberships. Bruce Handley becomes first player in the history of Association to receive Cricketer of the Year twice.
- 1974/75: Frank Pattinson retires as President - Association again wins Watson and Shell Shields. Ken Prendergast and Irene Ruddy receive life memberships.

CLUBS.

Clubs have varied in size and structure since the inception of Boys Cricket in September, 1957. Of the fifteen clubs that established the Saturday morning competition, only four have participated in the 25 seasons, namely Caringbah Sports; Gynea; Miranda Magpies and St. Patricks.

These clubs have contributed greatly to the success of the competitions by ensuring that teams are competing in the majority of grades and providing a significant number of executive members to administer cricket. Perhaps it is fitting they have been successful in winning 134 competitions (44%) of the 308 contested over 25 seasons.

The four seasons, 1958/59 to 1961/62, was expansive with the following clubs nominating teams - Boys Town; Caringbah D.L.S.; Caringbah R.S.L.; Cronulla R.S.L.; Engadine; Kirrawee; Sylvania; Sutherland (Tigers) and Sutherland/Grays Point.

The 1962/63 season saw Jannali enter the competitions and since that time, nineteen additional clubs from all suburbs within the Sutherland Shire have at some time participated in the Boys Competitions. The Association has consistently attracted eighteen clubs, reaching an all time high in 1975/76 of 20 clubs and a low of 13 clubs way back in 1971/72. Over all, 26 clubs have shared in the 308 premierships.

- 1975/76: Coir matting discarded due to rising costs - competition reverts to concrete pitches with a plastic ball being used. Foster Shield team joint premiers with St. George. Cricketer of the Year, John Dyson selected in N.S.W. Sheffield Shield team.
- 1976/77: Andrew Hilditch selected in N.S.W. Sheffield Shield team. Engadine take out club championship for the sixth time in seven seasons; an exceptional performance.
- 1977/78: John Dyson becomes first Test player produced by this Association; Andrew Hilditch selected as Captain of N.S.W. Sheffield Shield team. An all time Association record of 152 teams and over 2,000 boys competing.
- 1978/79: Don Clark takes over as President of the Association - Andrew Hilditch rises to Vice-Captain of Australian Test team. Incentive scheme for our representative teams by Pizza Hut. Four competitions decided by play-offs and several competitions in doubt until final Saturday.
- 1979/80: Boys Competition becomes a separate entity, Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association, no longer under the control of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association. "Tabloid Cricket" introduced for lower graded Under 10 teams. Limited overs for bowlers in lower graded Under 10's and Under 12's introduced. Jack and Irene Ruddy retire after more than 16 years of active service on the Executive Committee. Como take out their first club championship. Foster Shield team takes title.
- 1980/81: Association changes name to "Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association". Honour Board erected in Administration Centre. Representative teams perform magnificently - Watson, Moore and Cawsey Shield teams are joint premiers and Association wins Shell Shield. One of the remaining foundation clubs, St. Patricks take out their first club championship.
- 1981/82: "Our Silver Jubilee Anniversary Year" - 25 Not Out and still going strong. Cawsey Shield team wins final - Watson Shield and Moore Shield teams finalists in their competitions. Another of the original clubs in the Association, Caringbah Sports, take out their first club championship. "Rotating Batting Order" system introduced for lower graded teams. Don Clark and Jim Lynch awarded life memberships.

ASSOCIATION RECORDS: 1957/58 TO 1981/82.

This section of the history of our Association is devoted to the recognition of the many outstanding performances which have occurred in the first 25 years of this Association. Whilst cricket always has been and always will be a game in which the best "team" will excel, great performances by individuals must be given due recognition.

The record book does not show everything, in fact, cold hard statistics do not reveal the team spirit involved and the many deeds of unselfishness and splendid fielding that materially assist a player to win trophies. Whilst "A Grade" achievements tend to take pride of place, other grades earn their distinction and no player can do more than head a division of players of his own ability.

It is dangerous to make comparisons of various players over a period of years as playing conditions and surfaces have altered greatly at various stages of our history. However it is interesting to note that in the 25 years of the Association, over 600 centuries have been scored and approximately 700 hat tricks taken. In this, our Silver Jubilee year, Todd Young (Cronulla-Sutherland Leagues Club - 12B) became the first player to score a double century - 217 N.O.

Unfortunately, in the early years of the Association records were not kept in the same detail as they are today. Consequently, the records shown are subject to this limitation. The writer apologises for any errors or omissions which are evident in the following section of the book.

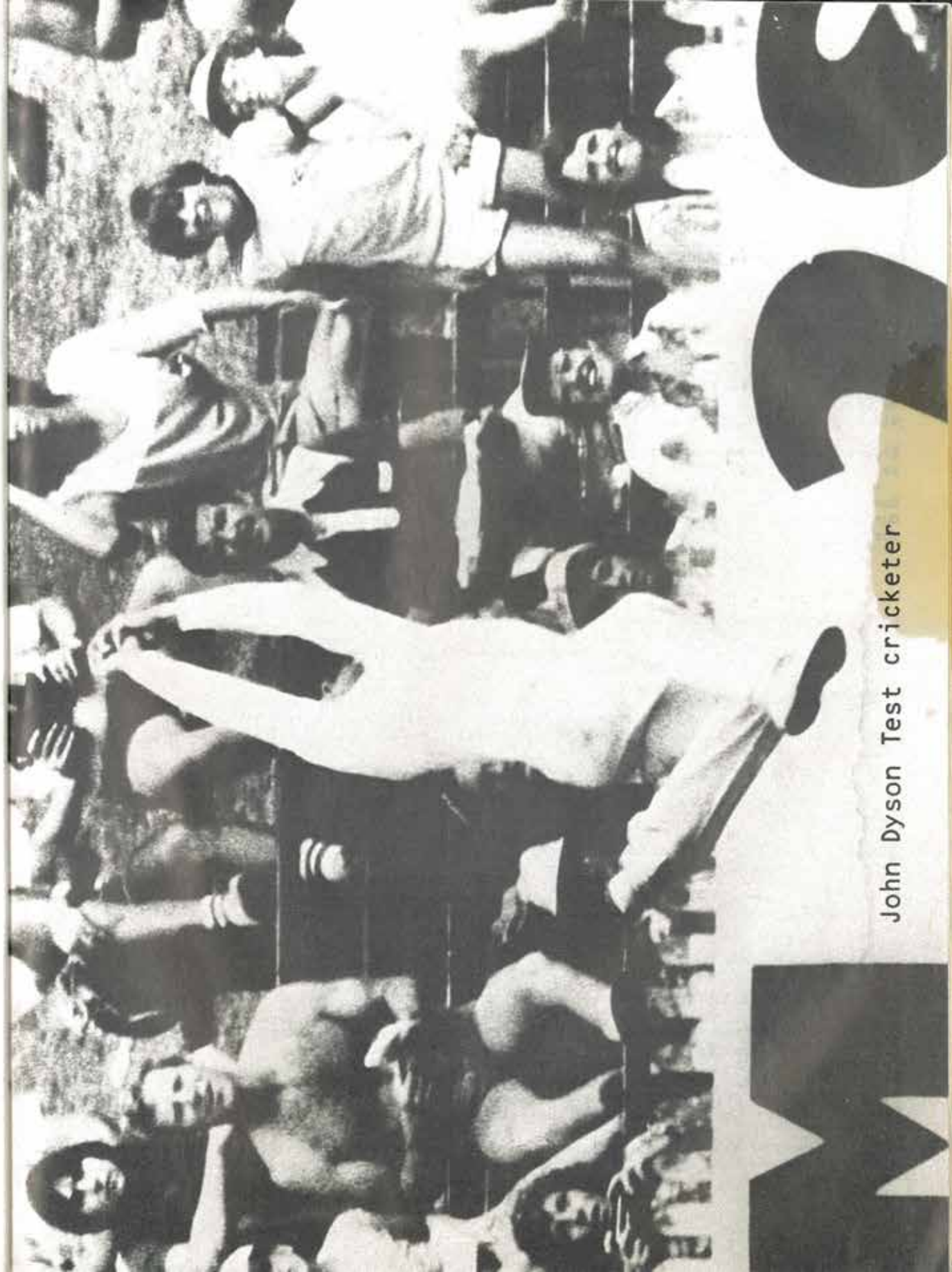

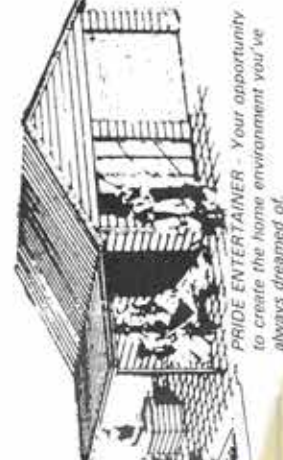
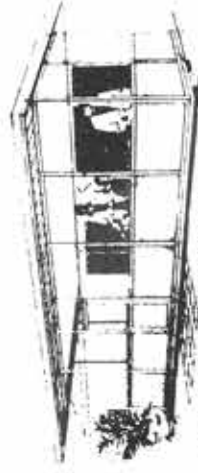

NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974 came into force on October 1, 1974. There are important new provisions in that Act which contain strict regulations on advertising and all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study those provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions from doing any of the following in connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion, by any means, of the supply or use of goods or services:

- Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade, or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- Falsely represent that goods are new.
- Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories, uses or benefits they do not have.
- Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation he or it does not have.

(e) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence of, or amounts of price reductions.

(f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.

(g) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

PENALTY:

For an individual — \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment.
For a corporation — \$50,000.

It is not possible for this company to ensure that advertisements which are published in this magazine comply with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisements for publication.
