SECRETARY'S REPORT.

THE SEASON UNDER REVIEW

The 1982/83 season was another very successful one. Our representative teams performed well, with the Moore (1) side winning the "Harold Moore Shield" after a very exciting game against Gosford.

GROUNDS AND WICKETS

It is a credit to the Sutherland Shire Council for their preparation of the grounds throughout the season. Any problems were attended to immediately. As always, the staff were most helpful and we thank one and all for their assistance.

The "Cricketer of the Year" went to the popular and talented Kevin Tuite. Kevin works hard at his game. He was playing 2nd Grade at the end of last season. He is without doubt one of the up and coming stars of the future. He presented the replica to the previous Cricketer of the Year, Jeff Steed.

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

"JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

ANTHONY QUINN - ST. PATRICKS.

We are pleased to announce that the "Cricketer of the Year" for the 1982/83 season is Anthony Quinn of St. Patricks.

Whilst Anthony has followed many good wicketkeeper/batsmen through the grades he had the distinction of playing in all "Shield" teams - Foster, Cawsey, Moore and Watson, gaining selection in a 'Southern' Districts touring team organised by the Junior Union in 1980/81.

Climaxing a distinguished career in boys' competition, Anthony was chosen to captain Sutherland's Green and Watson Shield sides in which he figured in 16 dismissals for 19 byes and 17 dismissals for 19 byes respectively. This excellent performance led to his selection in the South Harbour combined

Green Shield side and the Sydney No. 2 team in which he secured 5 dismissals against N.S.W. country.

During the season, Anthony was given valuable experience through being selected in 4th and 5th grade for Sutherland and perhaps his only disappointment for the season was narrowly missing selection on the N.S.W. schoolboys Under 16 team after performing well in all the trial games.

Although he didn't commence his career as a 'keeper', Anthony originally started playing with Miranda Magpies as a 6 year old. He then "rested" for three seasons before making his "comeback" in St. Patricks 10A team in the 1976/77 season. Chosen as the team's keeper in Round 6, Anthony made an auspicious debut against Caringbah Sports by securing 4 out of 5 dismissals

In his club matches with St. Patricks, Anthony has spent 7 seasons behind the stumps to produce the following statistics:

63 bowlers
2882 overs
20,638 balls bowled
8505 runs scored by opposition
219 byes allowed
664 opposition batsmen dismissed of which
136 were caught behind or stumped.

A career in which a keeper allows 1 bye every 94 runs scored and catches or stumps a batsman in every 4 wickets to fall is deserving of the highest reward.

As a top order batsman Anthony scored 2314 runs (including 4 centuries) playing with St. Patricks, an aggregate which ranks him second place to the 1981/82 cricketer of the year, Kevin Tuite.

The following players were also considered for this award: Colin Grimble, Kyle Thompson, Matthew Lawler, Tony Clark, Jonathon Clark, Michael Clift, Davyd Berry and Phillip Weatherall.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A GRADE "SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

A close win to Jude Hennessy from the De La Salle Cricket Club. Jude has had an outstanding season, breaking the batting aggregate record by scoring a remarkable 717 runs at an average 179.25.

He captained the successful "Moore (1) Shield" to victory and was co-captain in the Under 14A De La Salle premiership team. Jude is a right-hand opening bat and a useful bowler.

He will without doubt make it to the top. Also considered were T. Harvey, T. Young and M. Duff.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A GRADE "SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Peter McGee - Cronulla Leagues. A player of the future, has a lot of potential and is a keen learner. Was a member of the "Caussey Shield" team beaten in the final. Also considered were D. Kent, T. Woodhill, A. Craig and D. Batten.

TREASURERS REPORT

The financial report itemised later in this report shows a General Account balance of \$4,679.40, and an Insurance Account balance of \$59.33. In addition we have opened two Investment accounts presently earning 14% interest. The investment from the General Account is \$4,000 and from the Insurance Account is \$1,500.00.

Three synthetic wickets were laid this season with costs being shared with the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association and our finances now allow us to continue with further coverings in the next season.

The cost of balls and equipment for the representative teams was \$700.00 less than last season due to a sponsorship by Steeden, who supplied the cricket balls used in the representative series.

I would like to thank all clubs and their delegates for their co-operation during the season.

- (g) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

PENALTY:

For an individual — \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment.

For a corporation — \$50,000.
