

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

THE SEASON UNDER REVIEW

The 1983/84 season proved a most successful one. The Foster (1), Moore (1) and Watson (1) teams won their respective finals, therefore giving Sutherland three out of four shields.

The Causey (1) side was narrowly beaten to miss out on the finals. Sutherland also won the most sought after "Shell Shield" for a record seven years.

GROUNDS AND WICKETS

Two competitions, namely the 15s and 12s were played on synthetic pitches using leather cricket balls. This will be of great assistance to these players in the future.

Once again the Sutherland Shire Council personnel were always most helpful. The grounds and wickets were always well prepared and any problems that arose were attended to immediately. Many thanks to one and all at the council for their continued assistance throughout the season.

PRESENTATION NIGHT

Another outstanding success. Approximately 800 people were in attendance and the house full sign went up at 7.00 p.m.

The "Allan Ward Memorial Shield" incorporating the "Mort Edson Shield" was presented to the "Arch Causey (1)" team managed by Claude Mann.

The "Cricketer of the Year" was won by the very talented Anthony Quinn from the St. Patricks club. He is nature's Gentleman. Anthony will without doubt be a player to watch in the future. He has tremendous ability.

C&P PRESENTATION

As usual was held in Breen Park (Caringbah Oval), Caringbah. A huge crowd was in attendance to witness the excited players receive their representative caps.

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

"JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

MALCOLM CONDON - JANUARY

Jannall Cricket Club has now produced its third Boy Cricketer of the Year in Malcolm Condon. For the record, the two previous winners were outstanding cricketers, Glen Bailey (1965/66) and John Dyson (1969/70).

The blending of individual loyalty, dedication and application, family/team commitment and support, with a diet of Boys Cricket, Men's Cricket, School Cricket, Grade Cricket and backyard cricket with Dad and three brothers has resulted in Malcolm being awarded this ultimate in Boys Cricket in Sutherland.

Malcolm commenced his career in 1974/75 with Jannall 10s age 6 years plus. In 10 years he has amassed the impressive record:

3050 runs, 117 innings, 20 n.o.'s, Average 31.44,
214 wickets, 893 overs, 216 maidens, 2510 runs, Ave. 11.73.

54 catches and one hat-trick added to 5 centuries (equal to J. Dyson's record) rounds off a fine career in Boys Cricket. Two seasons highlight his career:

1977/78 - In 10s Malcolm scored 766 runs with an innings of 146 n.o., 41 wickets and 16 catches.

1983/84 - 16s where his all-round ability resulted in 460 runs and 29 wickets

His friendly, unselfish, yet firm leadership guided the 'Mataon Shield' team to success this season. Previously Mal had played in Foster, Cawsey and Moore Shield teams for Sutherland Junior Cricket.

In 1983/84 he played both Green Shield and Grade Cricket for our local Sutherland Club and we know he will do well in the future.

In wishing Malcolm a fond farewell to Boys Cricket, the Association can boast in its choice of 1983/84 Cricketer of the Year - Malcolm Condon.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A GRADE "SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

This award goes to John Paddy from Comp Cricket Club. John was chosen from a group of brilliant performers for his all round achievements over the season with both bat and ball. He won the batting aggregate for the grade as well as being high in the bowling lists. A century and a hat-trick were included in his versatile performance.

Also considered: J. Smith, L. Hennessey, G. Frearson, G. Gerraghty and M. Haran.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A GRADE "SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Peter Gardner completes a good season's performance in taking out this award. He served his club, Miranda Magpies well with bat and ball, finishing equal first in the grade's wicket takers and well up in the batting lists.

Engedine's Nathan Morendo is recipient of this award due to consistent performances with bat and ball. As a batsman, Nathan likes to hit the ball for miles and can destroy an attack with a whirlwind innings. On the other hand he bowls with guile and skill to worry the best of batsmen.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

COMPETITION SECRETARY

The 1983/84 season saw 135 teams take part in the competition, an increase of 5 teams over last season. A pleasing aspect is that we appear to have solved most of our teething problems in the introduction of modified rules for the lower grades and I congratulate the managers on the way they presented the result sheets and thank them for making our job a lot easier.

I firmly believe and have done in all the years I have been with this Association, that the primary objective of the S.S.J.C.M. is to give kids a game of cricket, and to teach those kids how to play cricket in the true traditions of the game.

As a means of achieving this objective we run a competition, and I stress, that in my opinion the competition is only a means of achieving the primary objective. Unfortunately, there appears to have crept in, an attitude that competitions must be won, regardless. This attitude can, and does result in the kids being denied a game of cricket in order to ensure a competition win. This defeats the Primary objective of the Association and can only be detrimental to the Association and cricket in general.

TREASURERS REPORT.

The financial report itemised later in this report shows a general account balance of \$11,062.33 and an Insurance Account balance of \$679.74, whilst our Investment accounts have balances in the General Account of \$4,422.59 and the Investment account of \$1,652.54.

SYNTHETIC PITCHES.

Over the past two seasons, our Association has co-operated with the Mens' Association in installing synthetic surfaces on pitches within the Sutherland Shire.

At this stage we are able to run three complete grade competitions on synthetic surfaces - 16A, 12A & 12C. The original intention of the Association was to cater for all 'A' grade competitions to enable our Representative players to accustom themselves to synthetic surfaces prior to the Shell Series Shield games.

As we have reached the half-way mark of our objective, we hope to be in a position to select further grounds for the application of the synthetic surface and will therefore be approaching the Sutherland Shire Council and Mens' Association for their co-operation in this regard.

RECORDERS REPORT

The 1983/84 season, in our opinion, went very smoothly with liaison between club delegates and recorders at an all time high. The result being that most Game Sheets were correctly filled out. Rotating batting went off like clockwork and the fines were minimal.

It was good to see the 12A competition introduced to Synthetic Wickets and the Leather Ball, providing some very close and exciting matches.

With the amount of talented boys coming up through the grades, Sutherland will remain dominant in Boy's Cricket for many years to come.

To all representative competition and award winners, Congratulations to all the boys, an enjoyable winter and we hope to see your names on the books for the 1984/85 season.

REGISTRARS REPORT

In the 1983/84 season, 1731 boys were registered in the 135 teams playing in the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association. Boys playing with the Association for the first time numbered 586, of whom 293 were under 10 years of age and 195 were under 12 years of age as at 1st October, 1983.

It is pleasing to note the increase both in the number of boys continuing from the previous season and boys resuming cricket after a break of one or more seasons. A contributing factor to this could be in the greater involvement of boys in teams where rotating batting order and limited overs are applied. In 1983/84, 879 boys (51% of registrations) were involved in this type of cricket as compared with 793 (47% of registrations) in 82/83 season.

As a consequence of attaining the age of 16 years before the 84/85 season commences, 151 boys will be leaving our ranks and to these boys we extend our thanks and best wishes for the future and we hope that they will continue their cricketing careers with the Men's Association.

I wish to thank the delegates and officials of all clubs for their friendly co-operation throughout the season.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER

This position was first established by the Association for the 1983/84 season with no set guidelines or duties other than "To organise Sponsorships and that sort of thing".

Having virtually been given open reign on duties and responsibility, it became necessary to adopt an attitude of looking at the Association's actual needs from a boy players' viewpoint. The boys' and parents' response to week to week newspaper articles, complete with photographs naming best performances and use of Christian names, obviously improved and enhanced the Association's image throughout the Shire.

Most of credit for "Newspaper exposure" must go to the management of the Pictorial News and in particular, Ian Badham (Editor) and Mike Goodwin (Sports Editor). These people were most co-operative and willingly adopted suggestions about articles which had not been previously attempted (E.G. featuring Rep. teams under photographs of Team Captains and Full-page articles giving Shell Series results and individual performances.)


