In the 1985/86 season, 1803 boys were registered in the 143 teams playing in the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association. Boys playing with the Association for the first time numbered 551, of whom 266 were under 10 years of age and 170 were under 12 years of age as at 1st October, 1985.

UMPIRES REPORT.

This association has a current membership of 33 which some 8 are full time Umpires and the rest either players or part time members who participate in games where possible.

In 1985/86 some 13 new applicants attended our lecture series of which 3 sat for and passed our examination and have joined the Association. Two of our Umpires sat for and passed the N.S.W.C.U.A. examination and will be available to umpire some grade matches in 1986/87.

In a competition of 15 rounds in the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association competition (87 teams in 13 grades) we provided an average of 7 umpires for each round over the season. In addition 17 umpires stood for the 13 finals played on 22nd/23rd March, 1986. We provided 11 of our umpires to representative games for the Junior Shell series (Foster, Cawsey, Moore and Watson) and for the Durham, Telegraph and Martin mens representative series. These umpires carried some 53 games in various representative series.

Our lecture board in addition to our normal work provided lecture sessions to two (2) representative from each of the 87 teams represented in the S.S.C.A.

This involved 8 of our senior umpires in a number of lectures over the year to assist the S.S.C.A. In providing information on the laws of cricket intended to improve the quality of duty umpiring. S.S.C.A. competition is run as 7 team competition in which the team with the bye provides their players as umpires for another grade in that round.

This effort together with the appointment of 4 of our umpires to representative finals were highlights of our season in 1985/86.

N.S.W. JUNIOR CRICKET UNION DELEGATES REPORT.

The Junior Union, which is the controlling body for junior cricket in New South Wales, completed another highly successful season in its administration of junior cricket, culminating of course with the various age group inter-association competition series under the auspices of the Shell Company of Australia. Each year the Shell Company contribute generously to sponsorship of junior cricket.

It is most pleasing to report that all of our Association representative teams, of which special mention must be made to the No. 2 teams, performed with great credit. Our successful team was the Under 12 Arch Cawsey (1) side - hearty congratulations, and of course our C.S. Watson (1) side were runners-up, so all in all Sutherland were prominent competitors.

The success of our representative teams, and that means all the teams who participated, enabled us to gather sufficient points to again take out the coveted Shell Shield - for the 9th time since the inception of that trophy in the 1963-64 season. Our Association has held the Shield for 4 consecutive years now, which is an excellent advertisement for the junior cricket talent in the Sutherland Shire.
