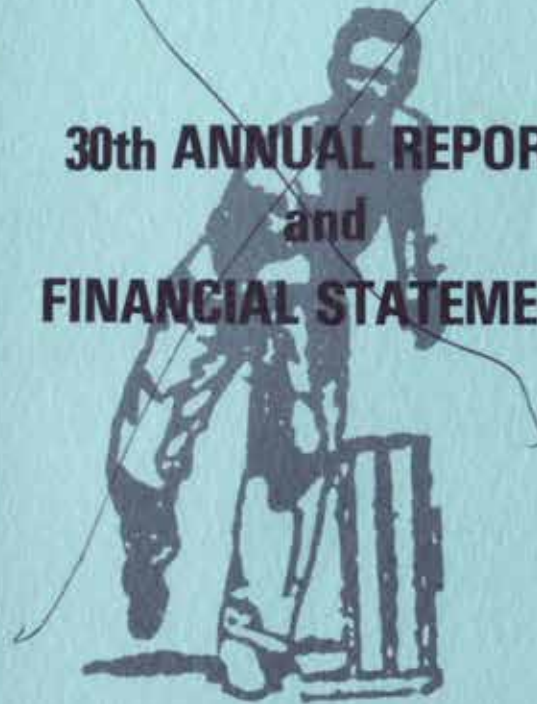

### CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

### "JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

#### DAVID WALLACE - ST. PATRICKS

David commenced his cricketing career in the 1981/82 season in an under 10B team. He was third in the batting averages.

He impressed keen cricket observers who even at this early age predicted that David had talent and would be one to watch as his career progressed.

The following two seasons David played in the under 12B competition and in 1983/84 won the Association Batting Award with an aggregate of 413 runs. In 1984/85 he played in the under 14B and scored 271 runs. In 1984/85 he was in the under 14A division, winning both the Association Batting Awards with an aggregate of 382 runs at an average of 42.44 and represented in the "Harold Moore Shield" team. In one match versus Eastern Suburbs he scored 117 not out.

In the 1986/87 season David played in the 16A competition and once again has won both the Association Batting Awards with an aggregate of 438 runs at an average of 48.66. He represented in the Watson Shield Team.

David is an opening or high order bat and a very useful 3rd or 4th change bowler.

As you will agree David has a lot of potential and is a credit not only to his Parents but to the Sutherland Shire.

Our Association has not been innovative of late, but is pleased to note all other senior associations catching up and adopting procedures that have been followed in this Shire for many years.

The 1986/87 season saw several minor premiers defeated in finals, thus maintaining added interest to the game.

The Executive Committee is strong and experienced and it is most gratifying that its members were not burdened with many disciplinary matters. Most clubs are efficiently managed and this eventually leads to more enjoyment of our chosen game on the field.

### SUTHERLAND DISTRICT GRADE CLUB

Sutherland had its most successful season ever in 1986/87. We won the Club Championship for the first time since 1967/68 and subsequently carried off three of the five grade premierships in winning third, fourth and fifth grades. Earlier in the season, our A.W. Green Shield team won the Competition for the third successive year (all but a joint premiership with Gordon after a draw in the final). Thus, with the Club Championships, three grade premierships and the A.W. Green Shield, the Club finished with five of the eight trophies, only missing out on first and second grades and the Poidevin - Gray Shield. First grade finished seventh out of twenty teams, while second grade just missed out on a semi-final position in finishing sixth. Our under 21 team finished equal first in our division, but missed out on a spot in the final on averages.

The S.S.J.C.A. can be justifiably proud of the part it has played in the development of Sutherland into the most successful Club in Sydney. During the season, we generally had about 80% of our players being local Juniors, with 50% being under 21. The effort of the A.W. Green Shield Team in completing its third successive undefeated premiership (the two seasons before that we were equal first in our division, but lost the final berth on averages) shows that the progression of talented players from the Junior Association is continuing. We look forward to this relationship with the Junior Association continuing for many years to come.

We also congratulate the Association on another successful season.

The season was a very hard one with a lot of complaints of bad umpiring decisions and managers not knowing the correct rules. In most cases it is caused by wanting to win at all costs, which is not what we want, remember it is for the boys to enjoy a game of cricket and not for managers and coaches to build up their egos.

Most grades were very close with eleven grades going into the last round without a clear cut winner. No play offs were needed this season.

## UMPIRES REPORT

The Sutherland Shire Cricket Association has a current membership of 43. This comprises 10 full time umpires and the rest either players or part time members who participate in games where possible.

In 1986/87 some 24 applicants sat for a full lecture series followed by a written examination. 11 passed this examination and joined the Association and 10 of them have already stood in matches this season.

In the S.S.C.A. Competition (82 teams in 12 grades) we provided an average of 10 umpires for each round over the season. In addition 21 umpires stood for the 12 finals played in March.

We provided 12 umpires to 56 Representative games embracing the Shell Series (Cawsey, Foster, Moore, Watson) and Durham, Telegraph and Marton Men's Competitions.

The Lecture Board in addition to their normal work load provided lecture sessions to two (2) representatives of each of the 82 teams represented in the S.S.C.A.

This involved 10 of our regular umpires in a number of extra lectures over the season in providing information on the laws of cricket intended to improve the quality of duty umpiring. The S.S.C.A. Competition is run as a 7 team group in each grade in which the team with the bye provided their players as umpires for another grade in that round.

The events summarised above together with the appointment of 5 of our umpires to representative finals were highlights of our season in 1986/87.

YE OLDE CRICKET

ANTIQUITY OF CRICKET

First dealt with as Club Ball, Handyn, Handoute and finally Cricket.  
 1272-1307 In the wardrobe accounts of Edward the First, mention is made of the following entry master of (air), John De Leek Chaplain as the son of Lord Edward for cricket and other games at Westminster.  
 1877 "Edward the IV" imposes a heavy penalty on playing Handyn, a game of cricket.  
 1548 In Russell's History of Guildford, John Derrick speaks of a piece of wasteland where he and his schoolfellows did play cricket.  
 1686 "King Charles Ship" HMS Assistance of whose crew played cricket when ashore at Antioch.  
 1700 Double wicket cricket known as "Cat & Dog".  
 1743 The growing taste for public cricket made anonymous scribblers in the "Champion" the subject of ridicule.  
 1774 Priced 6d the first handbook appeared entitled "New Articles on the Game of Cricket" set down by a committee of noblemen and the gentlemen of Kent, it described the Laws.

REMARKABLE INCIDENTS

In the match Australia -v- Yorkshire, 1882, Bonner rushed at Peate and twice in succession smote him out of the ground. The feat was vociferously applauded.  
 William Beldon died in 1862 aged 96. The Post said part of his life he gave to cricket, the other part to his wives. He was the father of 39 children 28 by his first wife and 11 by his second.  
 H.H. Francis playing with the Cuckoo Fenmers -v- Wellington 1878 carried his bat throughout the innings for 0. His innings which lasted 2 hours was described as partly entertaining.  
 In a match between East Hampshire and Lawrence's Aborigine team 1868 Twopenny a demon bowler took 9 wickets for 3. The last batsman declined to face him, so he was duly accredited with 10 wickets.  
 A batsman in Tom Caesers' eleven at the Oval playing Shermans eleven was struck in the back and given out LBW. On going in a second time he strapped his pads to his back which so incensed the Umpire, that he promptly resigned.  
 Gunner Quinlon in a match at Ceylon in 1864 in an attempt to catch a ball missed it and it lodged fair on top of his helmet (a regular one), instead of bouncing off, it went right through resting on his head inside. The Umpire gave the batsman out whereby he aimed his bat like a rifle and promptly "shot" the Umpire.  
 Trumper and his dog in 1827 played a single wicket match against two gentlemen at Horefield Common. Trumper taking an innings for his dog. The dog stood by his master and though many long hits were made the speed of the dog was so great that runs were difficult. Although betting was 5 to 1 against them, they won, the dog biting one of the gentlemen in the rear and causing his early departure.
