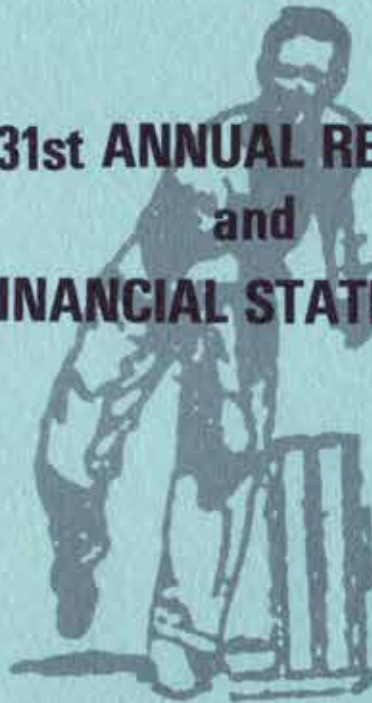

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

"JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

SHANE DUFF - ST. PATRICKS

Shane started playing cricket in 1979/80 in 10A and has played A grade every season since.

Shane was a slow starter as far as outstanding results but there was always that hint that better things were soon to come.

First played Representative Cricket in the Cawsey No. 1 side in 1983/84 season and has played every season since, except last season as the family was in Perth during the Representative season.

He has won the Association Wicketkeeper award for the past three seasons.

Shane is a member of the Metropolitan Squad and this season Captained the Sutherland Green Shield side and was selected in the South Side Green Shield and then in Combined Green Shield side, as well he played fifth and fourth grade with the District Club. A big future is tipped for Shane.

Also considered Peter Gardner and Bret Kirby.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A

"SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

With 757 runs at an average of 84.11 James Holley of Illawong/Menai set a new Association Batting Aggregate record for 14A and when you add to that the good bowling figures of 96 overs 18 wickets for an average of 11.67, it is not difficult to see why James is the winner of this award.

The flashing bat of this gifted player netted him no less than three Centuries and he finished the season with 119 not out in round 9 and continued this with 136 not out in round 10.

A great performance by a player with limitless potential.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A

"SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Justin Abeleven of Caringbah Sports is the winner of this award with a display in all departments of the game.

Justin, who won the corresponding award in 10A last season has continued to develop his skills and is a player of great maturity. Justin's figures for the season, 246 runs at average 24.6 and 31 wickets at average 5.83, give some indication of the ability that this fine young player possesses and his all round dedication and knowledge of the game make him a player of the future.

This was a most closely contested award and the winner was Anthony Briggs of Gympie Bay Club from a densely packed field.

He performed consistently for the entire season and proved himself to be a worthy winner of this award.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

COMPETITION SECRETARY

109 teams were graded in the 1987/88 season a drop of 18 teams on last season. This is the lowest number of teams playing since the 1974/75 season. The biggest drop was in the U/10's (seven). In two seasons the U/10's have dropped from 33 teams to 19 teams a very big worry for the Associations. Introductory and rotation cricket is working fairly well but there are managers who are still playing to win at all costs, take a look at the 10A bowling figures, one bowler 146 overs other 121 overs both from the same team, the rest of the team 9 players bowled 133 overs, what a disgrace, if half this team do give up cricket would you blame them. WHAT DO CLUBS DO WITH MANAGERS WHO PLAY UNDER 10 CRICKET THIS WAY, NOTHING.

Most grades were very close with a lot of results not known until the last round, and there was one play off in the 12C between Sylvania and Heathcote won by Heathcote 5/126 to 74.

Caringbah Sports won the Club Championship again this season by a big margin.

TREASURERS REPORT

The financial statements set out later in this report show that the Association is in a comfortable financial position notwithstanding that the laying of further synthetic wickets during the season resulted in a decline in end of season funds.

It became clear during 1987/88 that three items of expense impacted heavily on our financial position viz:

- costs of representative cricket
- cleaning of synthetic wickets
- provision of umpires for four-hour games.

It is the Association's aim to provide cricket to all boys at the lowest cost while at the same time maintaining the highest standards.

Provision of synthetic wickets and official umpires are seen as essential elements of this scenario. All fees will be reviewed prior to next season and some upward revision may be necessary.

During the season Association funds were boosted by sizeable amounts from fines and protest fees. While the income is useful it is not our desire to see a continuation. All would benefit from compliance with the rules and regulations of the Association as breaches thereof are not only costly to clubs but also work for our already burdened recorders and executive. Disputes between officials and clubs subtract from the enjoyment which the game of cricket provides.

I would like to thank all clubs for their co-operation during the season.

RECORDERS REPORT

The most significant fact to emerge from an examination of the scorebooks in each grade, is that we appear to be experiencing a decline in batting standards throughout the Shire.

A look through the results in this book will show that in most grades very few batsmen have been able to meet the standard required to have their name included, whilst bowlers are in plentiful supply. Both of these facts seem to indicate a fall in batting ability generally throughout the grades.

Apart from the usual cry from the recorders about poorly filled in scorebooks and result sheets, the season has been a successful one, with closely fought competitions in most grades.

Congratulations to the Competition winners and to the individual Trophy winners and to the losers better luck next season.

REGISTRARS REPORT

In the 1987/88 season, 1349 boys were registered in the 109 teams playing in the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association. Boys playing with the Association for the first time numbered 318, of whom 162 were under 10 years of age and 89 were under 12 years of age as at 1st October, 1987.

As can be seen from the comparison of registrations listed below the Association has lost some 34 teams since the 1985/86 season, the majority in the U/10 and U/12 age groups. I sincerely hope that the recent success of the Australian team will lead to an upsurge of registrations in future years.

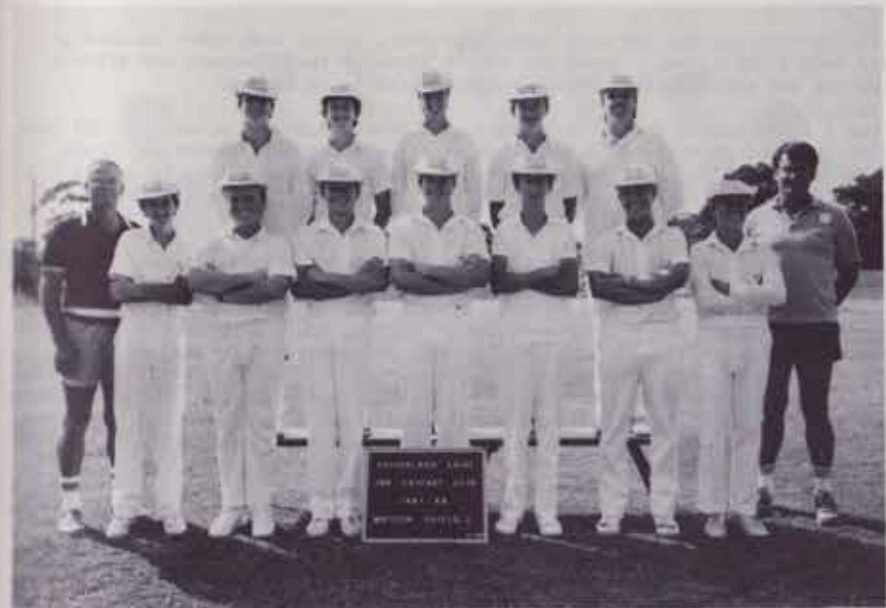

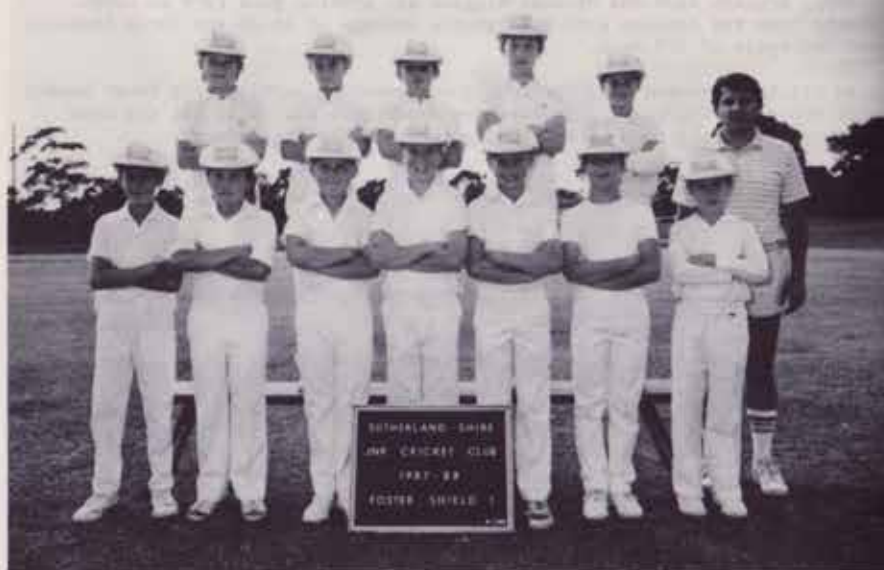
