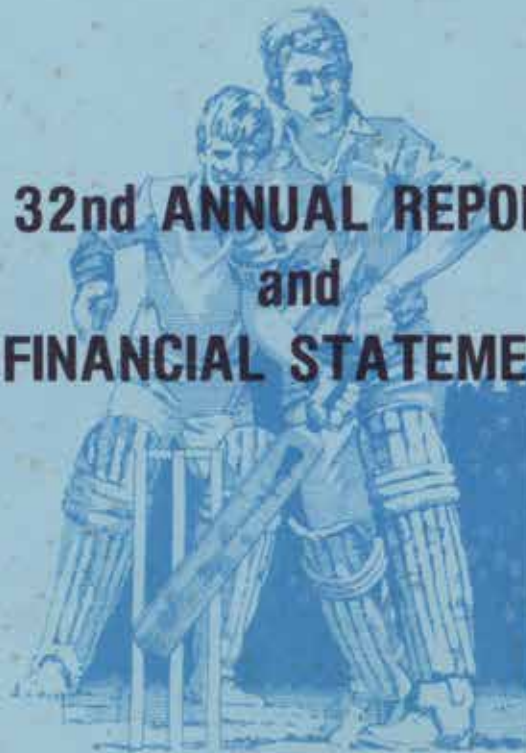

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

"JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

NATHAN MORANDO - ENGADINE

Nathan's first season was with the Engadine Dragons in 1982/83 and whilst not setting the world on fire with bat and ball he did signal that here was a cricketer of some ability by taking 10 catches for the season. His second season saw Nathan unleash his full potential by scoring 479 runs including a century, and taking 32 wickets at an average of 7.22.

Since then there has been no looking back and his year to year statistics tell the story dramatically, that here is a player who is a cut above the rest. His achievements are too many to list in full but some of the best are listed below.

1985/86 took 42 wickets including a double hat trick for his club, scored a massive 379 runs in the "Cawsey Shield" series at an average of 42.1 and took 37 wickets at an average of 5.4. Captained the Metropolitan East School team at the N.S.W. titles and the N.S.W. team at the Australian Titles.

In the past three seasons he has scored more than 300 runs and taken 30 or more wickets on every occasion. In addition to this he has been selected in the Metropolitan Youth Squad in each of these years.

Representing the Shire on no less than seven occasions Nathan has been in the first division five times and was Vice Captain of the Cawsey No. 1 team and Captain of the Moore No. 1 team.

In the 1988/89 season in Club cricket, Nathan has scored 352 runs including a century and taken 30 wickets. Additionally he has represented the Shire in the Watson Shield series scoring 110 runs and taking 14 wickets, also represented the Shire in the Green Shield series and played 5th grade for Sutherland on a number of occasions. In addition to all this he has, this year undertaken the

coaching of an under 14B team for the Marton Club, and has been selected as Engadine Dragons Club Champion for the second year in succession.

A fast bowler of devastating speed and accuracy and a hard-hitting batsman whose conduct and sportsmanship have been first class at all times, Nathan Morando is a worthy winner of Cricketer of the Year for 1988/89.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A

"SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

Matthew O'Brien of St. John Bosco is the 1988/89 winner of this award with top performances in every department of the game.

In batting 606 runs, including two centuries flowed from his bat, while his average of 67.33 is quite outstanding for a player whose usual position in the order is at number one where not outs are difficult to obtain.

In bowling Matthew sent down 88 overs, 25 of which were maidens and took 10 wickets at an average of 13.7, and his impeccable length and direction make it certain that the opposition will earn every run they take from him.

A quiet and dedicated cricketer who is blessed with great concentration, safe hands in the field and above all good behaviour and sportsmanship at all times.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A

"SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Kurt Thessman - Miranda Magpies.

Consistency was the keynote of this young player's success. Rarely, during the entire season did Kurt fail to score a respectable total of runs, but just to show that big scores were not beyond him he knocked up 102 in round 9 and this when coupled to two fifties and a couple of forties make it clear that this is a better than average batsman.

His aggregate of 421 runs at an average of 46.17 added to his bowling haul of 12 wickets at an average of 12.6 are indicative of his all round ability.

A strong player, with plenty of potential, Kurt is capable of becoming a first class cricketer.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 10A

"LEN GILAM TROPHY"

Adam Brodbeck from Caringbah Sports was the outstanding player in the 10A Competition. With 319 runs at an average of 53.17 Adam was easily the best of the batsmen and while his bowling was limited he did enough to show that he has potential in this part of the game.

A first class fieldsman, keen and ever alert, he approaches his cricket with a zest and intensity which should see him develop into a top class player.

Season 1988/89 was a good season for Sutherland. Whilst we will always strive to repeat the 1986/87 effort of the club championship and four of the seven premierships (or to even better that), nevertheless we should be reasonably satisfied with finishing third in the club championships and winning two premierships.

First grade had its best season for a number of years, just missing the semi-finals, with many of the team members putting up outstanding performances. In particular, Steve Rixon led from the front in what has turned out to be his swansong to a fine cricket career.

Third grade won the premiership with a brilliant effort in the final, after a very consistent season. A combination of youth and experience proved to be the right trick, with a number of outstanding performers. Fifth grade were very unlucky to miss the semi-finals by a point, they were a young side who will all benefit from the experience. Seconds and fourths performed well at times, but lacked consistency.

Once again, we are the Poidevin-Gray Shield premiers, successfully defending the title won in 1987/88. The A.W. Green Shield team finished in the middle of their division with some good performers. These two sides continue to be proof of the strength of the S.S.J.C.A. as a nursery for the senior cricket body in the Shire.

Finally, we should again record the achievements of our representative players. John Dyson, who returned to the club after an absence of 11 seasons, performed consistently for N.S.W. Justin Kenny made his debut for N.S.W. in Adelaide and also played for N.S.W. 2nd XI and N.S.W. Colts. Rodney Davison played for N.S.W. 2nd XI and N.S.W. Colts, while Nick Howard played for N.S.W. Colts. Last, but by no means least, Darrell Mann was selected in an Australian Squad for the third successive year. He played an important role for the Australian U/19 team in their wins over New Zealand, after earlier playing a vital role in N.S.W.'s win in the Australian Championships. All of these players learnt their cricket in the S.S.J.C.A. competition - let's hope there are many more of this calibre in the current ranks.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

Last season the S.S.J.C.A., in common with other junior cricket organisations, experienced a dramatic decrease in the number of players registered. Our numbers dropped from 109 teams in the 1987-88 to 89 teams, a decrease of 18%. That also represents a decrease of 30% from 1986-87. Everyone has their pet theory to account for the situation and a remedy, but a lot of hard work will be required if the trend is to be reversed.

The N.S.W.C.A. has appointed five development officers who will promote cricket in the schools. We hope to play our part by organising more coaching clinics, and we would like all clubs to promote the game as much as possible in their areas.

The 1988-89 season was my first as Competition Secretary. I was disappointed at the number of complaints received about the low standard of umpiring. Ideally we would have official umpires at all games, this is unlikely to happen, firstly, because umpires are not available in sufficient numbers, secondly because the cost (about \$30/season/player) would be seen as prohibitive by most clubs.

I would like all clubs to review their policies regarding umpiring, as this seems to me to be one of the worst aspects of junior cricket in this Shire.

Congratulations to Caringbah Sports on their third successive Club Championship, again by a handsome margin. We had our usual quota of close competitions, none more so than the 15A competition which was decided by a run out on the last ball of the final game. There was one final played in the 14C grade, where Gysea Bay defeated Cronulla Seagulls.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

In the 1988/89 season 1141 boys were registered in the 89 teams playing in the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association. Boys playing with the Association for the first time numbered 300 of whom 158 were under 10 years of age and 94 were under 12 years of age as at 1st October, 1988.

As can be seen from the comparison of registrations listed below the Association has lost another 20 teams since last season, dropping 1 grade in each age group

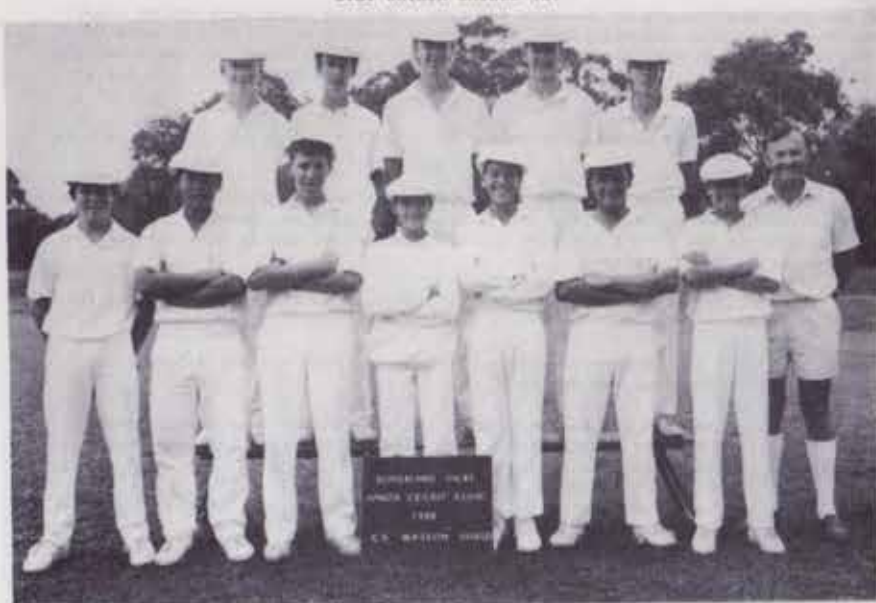
