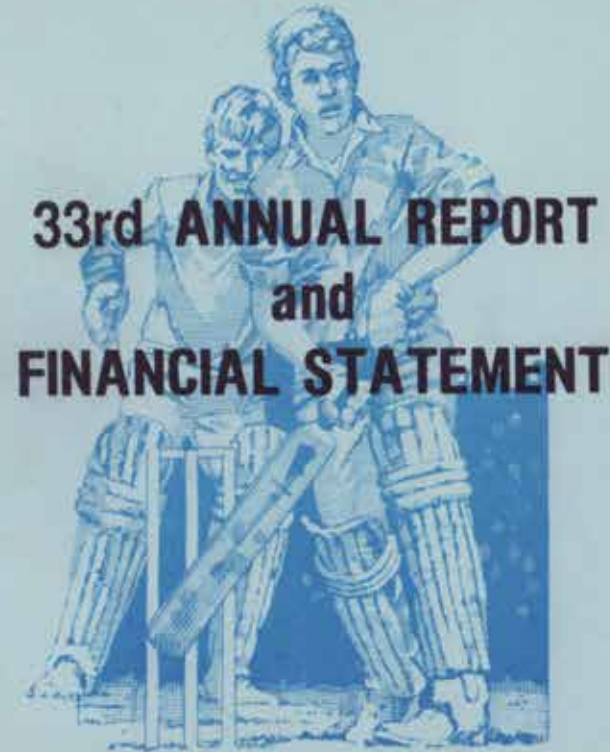

Resume of Career - all with Bosco

1982-83 season: In 10E won batting average (215.0), and aggregate (215) and the Mrs. Daly Award for best U-10 batting average, also won a batting helmet for performance as an all-rounder.

1984-85: In Chicago with family -played baseball for two seasons!

1986-87 season: In 12A (first A grade premiership for Bosco) took most catches (13), came eighth in batting averages (212 runs at 21.2) and third in bowling (18 wickets at 6.38). Also member of winning Cawsey Shield team.

1987-88 season: First year in 14A grade Matthew did not have any performances of note. Played in the No. 2 Moore Shield side.

1988-89 season: Captain of premiership winning 14A side. Won batting average (67.33) and aggregate (606), including two centuries. Also won Sutherland District Cricket Club Award for best performance in 14A; the Chaland Award for best batting performance in Traditional Cricket and the Cliff Paddy Memorial Trophy for Representative Achievement as Captain of the Moore Shield.

1989-90 season: In 16A scored 564 runs at 51.27, including two centuries. Played Watson Shield and member of winning Green Shield team. Toured Queensland with N.S.W.C.A. Metropolitan Under 15 Youth Squad. Scored over 1300 runs in total throughout the season.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 14A"SUTHERLAND DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB AWARD"

Wayne Schofield.

When Caringbah Sports Leg Spinner, Wayne Schofield steps to the bowling crease you can see the Wicket-keeper lick his lips, knowing full well that he's about to get a stumping or two, while the fielders in the catching positions also begin to smile.

This slightly built young man, known as "Bones", bowls with deadly accuracy which never allows batsmen to really get at him, and his haul of wickets in all classes of cricket testifies to his ability to keep the ball on the spot as well as to vary his flight and spin.

35 wickets in 14A is no mean feat and it was this effort which convinced the Trophy Committee that he was a worthy winner of this award.

A dedicated trainer and a player with great concentration he is probably our best spinner for some time.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 12A"SUTHERLAND UNITED SERVICES CLUB TROPHY"

Christopher Lake.

With 442 runs at an average of 44.2 Chris Lake of Engadine made consistency the keynote of his success with the bat. Six scores of over 50 plus a 47 illustrate graphically his ability to concentrate and to keep his eye on the ball.

Added to this were 12 wickets at a cost of 20 runs each which shows a better than average all round ability.

Natural ability and heaps of training have paid off for Chris who should continue to improve with time and become a Cricketer of the future.

BEST PERFORMANCE - 10A"LEN GILAM TROPHY"

Darren Reynolds.

Darren Reynolds of Miranda takes out this award with a really top performance. 359 runs at an average of 44.8 and 16 wickets at an average of 9.2 are figures that any cricketer could well be proud of.

A batsman with the rare ability to play the good ball with the intensity it merits, while working the ones and twos when possible, Darren none the less dispatches anything loose with power and accuracy.

Bowling right arm medium/fast Darren shows a belief that the wickets just don't come to you, you have to go after them, and attacks the batsman right from the start making runs hard to come by and victims a certainty.

Well done Darren, keep up the good work.

COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

The 1989/90 cricket season was a difficult one for the S.S.J.C.A. It was the first season that the user pays principle was put into practice by Sutherland Shire Council. The result of that change of policy was a huge increase in the cost of providing facilities for Junior Cricket in the Shire. To put the matter into perspective the fees charged by the Sutherland Council are about average for the Sydney Metropolitan area, however, it should be pointed out that many Councils, in fact some of our near neighbours, make no charge whatsoever to Junior Cricket and that the Sutherland policy of charging Clubs for hire of nets, which have in some cases been constructed by the Clubs, is unusual to say the least. Iniquitous might be a better word.

A major concern is the state of the grounds on which our boys play and for which we pay. The grounds are for the most part in a deplorable condition, made so by years of Council neglect and mismanagement.

It seems that only political pressure brought to bear by individuals, clubs and associations will bring about change to this situation. What is needed is a concerted effort by all concerned to persuade our Council that having what in my opinion are the worst cricket grounds in Sydney is not good enough for the residents of this Shire.

In the 1989/90 season the decline in numbers of teams was reversed somewhat with an increase in teams from 89 to 99. However, we are aware that the increase may have been caused in part by the interest generated by the successful Australian tour of England, so that provision of our game is still of paramount importance.

Congratulations to Carlingbah Sports in their fourth successive Club Championship and to all other premiership winners.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Financial statements set out later in this report clearly show that the Association is in a sound financial position and can look forward to the immediate future with confidence.

The 1989/90 was a difficult season due to the introduction of a "user pays" levy by Sutherland Shire Council. Unfortunately the levy became fact after most clubs had set their fees for the season and from an administrative point of view the change was a nightmare. In addition, it sadly caused some friction between clubs and the Association however this was quickly overcome and past excellent goodwill remained at season-end.

While it is always difficult to forecast the future, we would not expect fees for next season to increase unless the Council increases the user pays levy or introduces any new charge.
