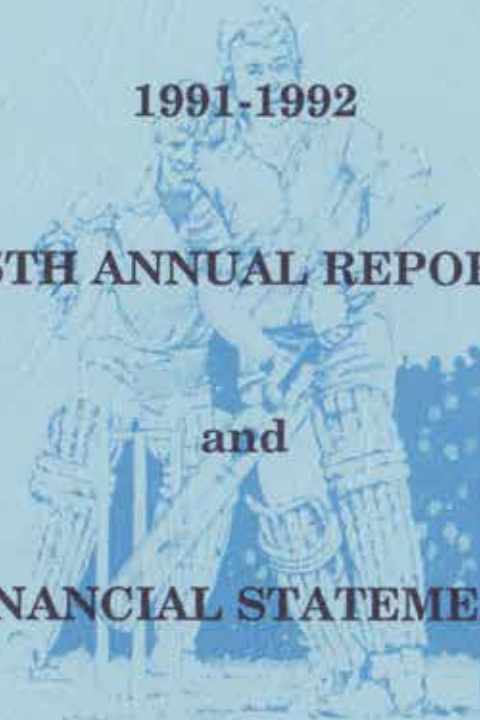

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

### The Season under Review

The 1991/92 season is one which can be remembered with some pride by the S.S.J.C.A. Our local competition under the guiding hand of Peter Schofield ran like clockwork. The finals, in their second year, were again blessed with marvellous weather, as ordered by Ivor Chalmers, and were a fitting climax to our season.

The representative teams were outstandingly successful, as detailed later, with wins in three age groups. All in all, a great season.

However, we are beset with major concerns for the future of our junior cricket. The decline in numbers continues, although we lost only one team last season, I feel that there is no reason not to expect a further downturn, if we just sit on our hands.

The grounds on which we play are still among the worst in the Sydney Metropolitan area, despite the best efforts of Peter Hickman and his staff in the face of financial constraints.

Thirdly, 50% of the S.S.J.C.A. Committee emanates from one club, not a healthy situation.

Really it is up to you, the clubs, to put in a little effort. There is growth potential if you seek it out. See what you can do to liaise with the Council to improve your ground (last season it was too much trouble to mark the creases). If you're not satisfied, complain to your local councillor.

Lastly, at our Annual General Meeting - nominate! It's time!

### Presentation Night

Again held at the Cronulla Leagues' Club, again organised by Ivor Chalmers, again a success. Thanks to the club for the use of their facilities.

The Cricketer of the Year was Craig Harran, the second player from St. John Bosco to win this award.

### CRICKETER OF THE YEAR - "JOHN WOODHOUSE MEMORIAL TROPHY"

#### Jason Holley - Gymea Bay Cricket Club

The 1991/92 cricket season has been a year of achievement for Jason, with the ultimate prize of being awarded "Cricketer of the Year". His performance with both bat and ball bear testimony to his all round ability as a fine young cricketer. Although he is a keen competitor, he has always played the game in a sportsman-like manner and is a great ambassador of the game.

His performance with his club side, Gymea Bay, won him both the batting and bowling aggregate and averages scoring 391 runs at 66.2, with a top score of 91 and taking 20 wickets at 8.8. As captain of this side he steered them to victory in the 16A premierships competition final.

Jason also captained the winning C. S. Watson Shield team and led by example in scoring 200 runs at an average of 40 and taking 12 wickets at an average of 7.8. His performance in scoring 69 runs against Illawarra when the team was struggling, was a great captain's innings.

At the beginning of the season Jason was selected by the Sutherland Grade Club in its train-on squad. After being selected in 5th Grade he was soon a permanent member of the side. He scored a total of 242 runs, with a top score of 94 not out, and took 20 wickets, which gave him the bowling average for that grade. This was an excellent effort for a young man who was still playing boys' cricket.



Jason captained the "A.H. Green Shield" side for the grade club and played with distinction in this competition. He was also selected to play in the combined Green Shield side to play against Combined Country. He was selected in the Metropolitan East school side to play in the N.S.W. Public School Championships at Newcastle. Jason joined two other past Sutherland Junior cricketers in this strong side, Nathan Morando (Cricketer of the Year 1988/89) and Mathew Lumb. This competition boasts many fine cricketers, some playing high grades in the Sydney grade competition and as a junior in the side Jason gained valuable experience.

In the representative field Jason has served the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association with distinction, playing in all age groups from under 12 years through to under 16 years. He was vice-captain of the Cawsey Shield side in 1987/88, captain of Moore, Weblin and the successful Watson Shield side this year.

Jason began his junior cricket with the St. Patricks Club in the under 10 competition and transferred to the Gymea Bay Club in his second year of under 14. He has amassed a total of 1,173 runs at an average of 36.6, taken 113 wickets at an average of 9 runs. In his eight seasons of boys' cricket, a truly magnificent achievement by a dedicated young cricketer.

On his performances this year Jason Holley is a deserved winner of this year's "Cricketer of the Year".

##### Paul King - St. Patricks

Paul has played all his junior cricket with the St. Patricks Club, Beginning in 1986/87 in the 10B's. Paul has consistently made 200-250 runs a season and taken 10-15 wickets, and has represented the Sutherland Shire in Foster, Cawsey, Gee and Moore Shields.

This season Paul really matured as a cricketer making 429 runs, including his maiden century (110 not out) at an average of 53.6 and taking 10 wickets at 10.8. He was also a mainstay of the Moore Shield Team, who were beaten finalists.

Paul is not the type of cricketer who immediately stands out but when he has been batting for half an hour you will see 20 runs against his name. Put him on to bowl and the runs from his end dry up. His aggressive batting and economical off-spin are based on sound techniques; his fielding is consistently brilliant.

Paul is a fine competitive cricketer, always thinking, always in the game. He does great credit to his club and to our Association, this award is most deserved.

Unfortunately Paul has moved to the N.S.W. South Coast. We wish him well in his future cricket career and hope that he remembers the S.S.J.C.A. with some fondness.

## EXECUTIVE REPORTS

### COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 1992/92 season, I feel, has been a very successful one. We had a total of 89 teams and it was good to see Heathcote enter two teams again. I hope it continues next season. The combining of Como and Jannali has certainly been a great success, the club is definitely heading in the right direction, so for that, congratulations must go to their hard-working committee, who also hold positions on the Executive of the Association, a thing that ALL clubs should think more about. Surely a true representation of the committee would be a make-up of all the clubs.

In the representative series we had probably the best results for many a season. That did not happen purely by accident. Apart for course from a tremendous effort from all the boys involved, many other people contributed to this. I would personally like to thank -

Kevin Holley, who with myself ran a coaching clinic right through the winter for the U/15's and U/16's. This certainly paid off as the Watson won the series and the Weblin were runners up.

Alan Craston, who sat up writing letters to all boys to attend trials and personally attended every final and semi-final on the respective days. Who could doubt his commitment to cricket.

Darryl Mann and Darren Holley, two grade players from Sutherland Club who attended and helped to select the teams. A step in the right direction. I hope next year to have a grade player as a selector in every representative side

**TREASURER'S REPORT**

Perusal of our accounts reveals that in general terms fees raised from clubs covered only 50% of our operating costs for the 1991/92 season. Bluntly put, this means that we need to either double our fees or continue to generate significant funds from non-cricket sources, i.e. sponsorships.

So the desperate bowler retrieved his dentures, re-inserted them, dust and all, and appealed again. "Not out" said Skelding.

**NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS**

The Trade Practices Act, 1974, came into force on October 1, 1974. There are important new provisions in that Act which contain strict regulations on advertising and all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study these provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions for doing any of the following in connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion, by any means, of the supply or use of goods or services.

- (a) Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade, or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- (b) Falsely represent that goods are new.
- (c) Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories uses or benefits they do not have.
- (d) Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval, or affiliation he or it does not have.
- (e) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- (g) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

**PENALTY:**

For an individual - \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment.  
 For a corporation - \$50,000.
