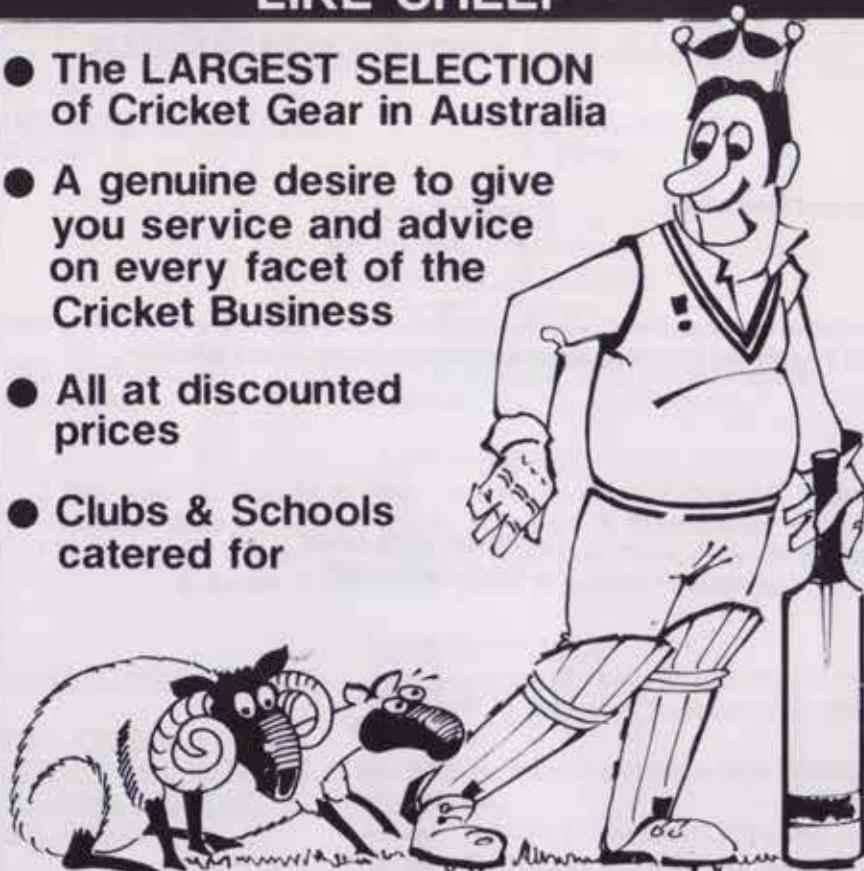

### MATTHEW BRADLEY - CARINGBAH SPORTS

Matthew comes from the strong Caringbah Sports Club with whom he has played all his junior cricket. From the moment I laid eyes on him as a very small nine year old, it was always obvious to me he had something special. Starting off his career as a right hand batsman, and medium pace outswing bowler, it didn't take long for Matt to show his class, scoring a brilliant century in the victorious Foster Shield Team's march to the finals. His performance in both club and representative teams, earned him a place in the N.S.W. Squads, captaining these sides from U/13 to U/16, also being chosen in the N.S.W. PSA team at the age of 12. Matthew toured Queensland in the U/13 and U/15 Metropolitan sides, captaining the team on both occasions. It was not until his later years that his bowling also started to improve. This is due to Matthew's attitude, not only in the game but his commitment to training is first class. Matthew has played two years Green Shield and in his final year, he captained the Sutherland side to a fabulous victory over St. George at Hurstville Oval. In his final year in junior cricket, Matthew has really blossomed, batting well above his years. His achievements this year have been little short of outstanding. He captained Sutherland Green Shield side, captained Watson Shield side and leading Caringbah Sports 16A to a fine premiership win. The Sutherland Grade Club has recognised Matthew's immense talents, grading him this year and again Matthew performed outstandingly, moving quickly from 5th to 4th grade with little difficulty. I have had the privilege of being involved with Matthew for quite a few years now and have no hesitation in saying Matthew is one of the best batting prospects to come from junior cricket in Sutherland for many seasons. A sound technique, beautiful footwork and tremendous timing certainly make him an outstanding cricketer. This year in junior cricket, Matthew scored 342 runs and took 14 wickets. ## SECRETARY'S REPORT

### The Season Under Review.

Undoubtedly the highlight of the 1992/93 season was Sutherland's magnificent victory over St. George in the Green Shield final. Those who witnessed the match were treated to an exhibition of first class cricket. The victorious Sutherland side comprised of the complete U/16 Watson Shield team, all locally coached junior cricketers, a complete team effort.

The Representative season saw a number of new faces in coaching positions and although not quite as successful as the previous season, Sutherland still produced finalists in the Harold Moore Shield, Walter Gee Shield and semi-finalists in the Foster Shield. Congratulations to Fred Lake, Coach/Manager and Greg Godkin, Asst. Manager and the Moore Shield team for their convincing win in the Shell Shield Final.

The 1992/93 season also produced a record number of Sutherland juniors selected in the N.S.W. Metropolitan Squads, an indictment of the Representative teams' coaching staff.

Due to the diligence of the S.S.J.C.A., the season ran very smoothly with few hiccups and although interrupted by bad weather, the finals were very successful, watched and enjoyed by a large number of spectators.

This year the introduction of U/8 teams has slightly boosted our numbers and I am sure with a little foresight and forward planning by some clubs, this age group will prosper, thus ensuring a continuing growth in our ranks for the forthcoming seasons. It is very heartening to see more parents participating in coaching and umpiring courses. This can only be beneficial to junior cricket in the Shire.

With the financial support from the N.S.W. State Government's Department of Sport, Recreation and Racing Capital Assistance Program, new synthetic turf has been laid on Oyster Bay, Gwawley North, Boystown, Scylla Bay and Woronora Heights. More wickets have also been allocated to be returfed for the 1993/94 season, a fine achievement by the S.S.J.C.A. Committee. The grounds, although still not up to scratch have improved but simply there are far too many sporting codes playing on too few grounds.

Presentation Night in June 1992 was again successfully organised by the effervescent Ivor Chalmers at the Cronulla Sutherland Leagues Club, Ivor being ably assisted by Jan Chalmers and Bev Stanford. The 1992 Cricketer of the Year Award was presented to the talented Jason Holley from the Gynea Club.

Finance - As detailed in the Hon. Treasurer's Report.

Inter Association Competitions. Because of the amalgamation of St. George and Georges River, the Rob Allen and the Executive Trophy have been combined. These trophies have been traditionally sought after by St. George, Georges River and Sutherland. The Allan Ward and Mort Edson Shield awarded for the Best Representative Team was won by the U/14 Moore Shield Team.

The prestigious Representative Cap Presentation was held at Cronulla-Caringbah Junior Rugby League Club. The layout, facilities and hospitality contributed to a very successful event.

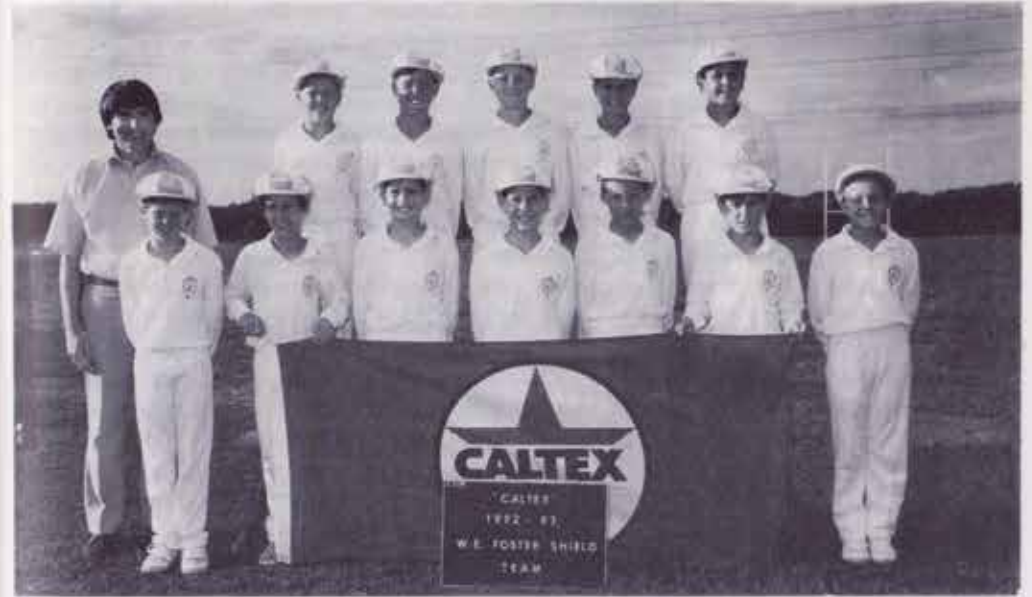

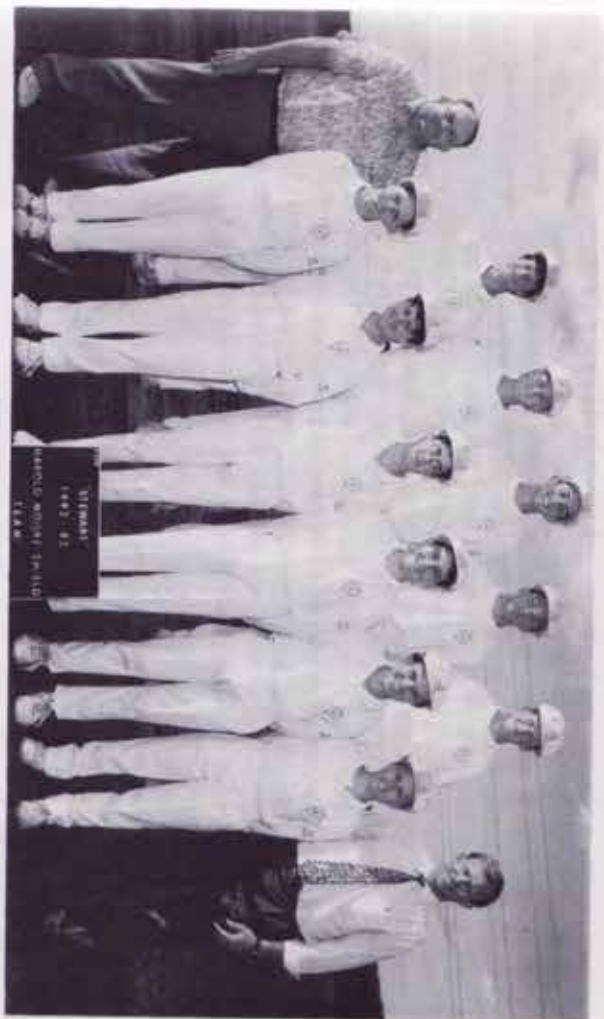

## NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974, came into force on October 1, 1974. There are important new provisions in that Act which contain strict regulations on advertising and all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study these provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions for doing any of the following in connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion, by any means, of the supply or use of goods or services.

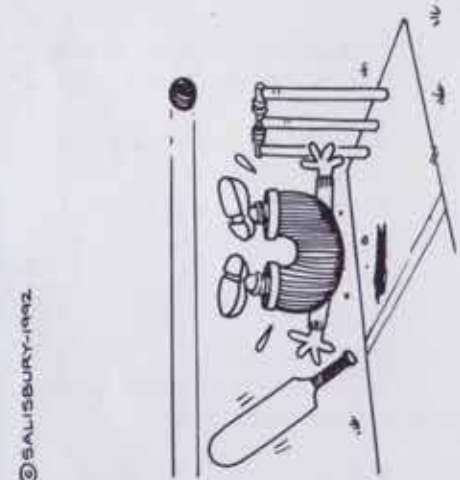
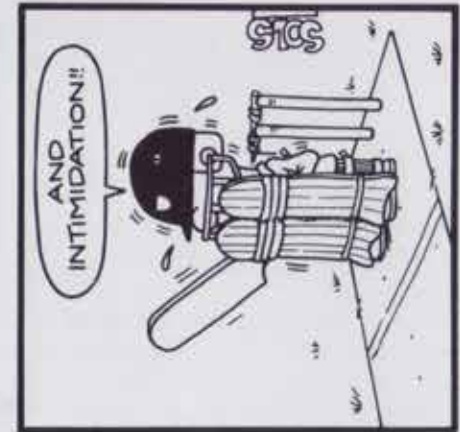
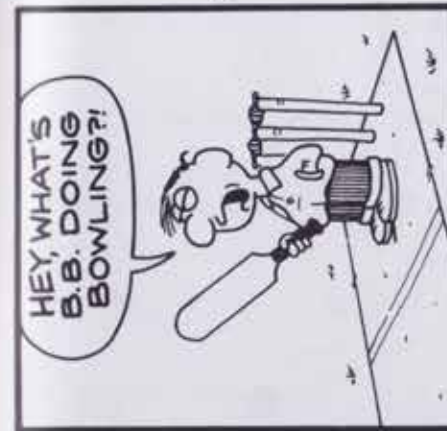
- (a) Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade, or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- (b) Falsely represent that goods are new.
- (c) Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories uses or benefits they do not have.
- (d) Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval, or affiliation he or it does not have.
- (e) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- (g) Make false or misleading statements concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

### PENALTY:

For an individual	-	\$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment.
For a corporation	-	\$50,000.
