# TREASURER'S REPORT

# COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 1994/95 season has been successful with 116 teams registered in 18 different grades. It was pleasing to be able to maintain the same team numbers that we had last year and in particular the return of the 10B competition was a welcome addition. With the strength of the U/8 grade we should be able to continue to provide this competition. It was also pleasing to welcome a new club, Aquinas College, to the association with one of their teams almost taking out the 14D Premiership.

The competition returned to a normal format with 10 rounds and a final. I believe that this has been a successful formula and it will continue for the coming season. The revised U/8 rules have met with great support and even though we are looking at some possible changes they will be minor with the basic rules staying as agreed.

The Club Championship rules were amended this year to allow for a closer competition and to even up the points for those clubs with teams only playing half a competition (10C & 10D). It was a close competition with three clubs fighting it out. Congratulations to Caringbah Sports for winning the Bertshell Trophy for the fourth year in succession, with Gymea Bay second. A special congratulations to Sylvania, third in the club championship, but with seven out of nine teams making the finals.

Again we had a well balanced competition with ten clubs being represented in the finals and six clubs winning premierships. The most prolific club being Sylvania with 5 titles, Sports with 4 and Engadine 3. Let's see if a few more clubs can win premierships next season.

Thank you to all our sponsors whose support is vital to the continuing development of Junior Cricket in the shire. A big thank you to the recorders, Bev, Kathie, Karen and Steve for their tireless efforts throughout the season. It is not an easy task but the results were always completed on time and we were able to keep the delegates fully informed.

In looking forward to next season we intend to expand the regular meetings that we have had with the U/8's and U/10's to include all age groups if possible. We have had few problems with the 8's and 10's. In particular we will make every effort to meet with all teams playing under rotating batting rules. Courses in Coaching and Umpiring will again be held and we hope to improve on last year's good attendances. I think that you will find that all of last year's Level 1 coaching graduates had successful seasons!!!

In a number of ways it was a difficult season but we look forward to an easier time next season where we hope to provide an environment that fosters good sportsmanship, fair play and where all players will learn about and enjoy their cricket.

# NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974, came into force on 1st October, 1974. There are important provisions in the Act which contain strict regulations on advertising, all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study these provisions very carefully

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions for doing any of the following in connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion by any means of the supply or use of goods or services.

- (a) Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- (b) Falsely represent that goods are new.
- (c) Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories uses or benefits they do not have.
- (d) Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation he or it does not have.
- Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

### PENALTY:

For an individual

\$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment

For a corporation - \$50,000

It is not possible for this company to ensure that advertisement which are published in this magazine comply with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisements for publication.
