

COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is only the support and assistance of the Management Committee and effective communication with Club Delegates that provides a Competition Secretary with the "tools" to create a successful competition - with this in mind I would like to thank all those involved in the 1995/96 cricket season!

The season commenced with a series of meetings which created an opportunity for managers and coaches of all teams to gain a better understanding of competition rules and regulations, and administrative responsibilities - as a result far fewer problems presented themselves during the season. I am hopeful that these meetings will be regular preludes to each cricket season.

Thirteen clubs registered 114 teams in U8 to U16 competition. 1 would like to congratulate Caringbah Sports on winning the Club Championship - the Bertshell Trophy - for the fifth season in a row and Gymea Bay for their success in the 16A, 16B and 14A competitions.

"Have-a-Go" cricket was introduced with centres at Miranda, Heathcote and Bangor and positive feedback from children and parents has ensured that this will continue next season and we are confident that there will be significant increases in numbers.

It would be remiss of me not to note the conscientious involvement of SDCC this season who assisted the juniors in various ways. Barry and Rodney Davison programmed a Gala Day of coaching for all Sutherland junior cricket players - schools visits were undertaken - representative teams were provided with pre-season coaching sessions - coaching sessions were held with the clubs upon request. The Management Committee is grateful for their assistance and welcomes an even broader commitment next season.

In addition to this, a "refresher" course for Level 1 coaches was conducted by Barry Davison at the commencement of the season and followed up with a Level 1 coaching course which was successfully completed by 32 participants, five of whom were U16 players. The SSCUA also conducted an umpires course which was well supported and as a result our junior cricketers enjoyed the presence of increased numbers of official umpires on Saturday mornings. Both of these courses will be offered again next season and all managers and coaches are urged to consider attending accredited coaches and umpires will benefit every player in the competition.

Recording results is never as straightforward as it should be and I would like to thank Steve, Kathy, Karen and Ingrid for their efforts.

In conclusion, I am confident that the 1995/96 season has been most competitive and successful and I am sure that the Management Committee joins me in wishing all junior cricket players in the Shire success in the forthcoming season.



NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

The Trade Practices Act, 1974, came into force on 1st October, 1974. There are important provisions in the Act which contain strict regulations on advertising, all advertisers and advertising agents are advised to study these provisions very carefully.

It can be an offence for anyone to engage, in trade or commerce, in conduct "misleading or deceptive". In particular Section 53 contains prohibitions for doing any of the following in connection with the supply of goods or services or in connection with the promotion by any means of the supply or use of goods or services.

- (a) Falsely represent that goods or services are of a particular standard, quality or grade or that goods are of a particular style or model.
- (b) Falsely represent that goods are new
- (c) Represent that goods or services have sponsorship, approval, performance characteristics, accessories uses or benefits they do not have.
- (d) Represent that he or it has a sponsorship, approval or affiliation he or it does not have.
- Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

PENALTY:

For an individual - \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment

For a corporation - \$50,000

It is not possible for this company to ensure that advertisement which are published in this magazine comply with the Act and the responsibility must therefore be on the person, company or advertising agency submitting the advertisements for publication.
