PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1997/98

As the season passes from Summer to Winter, I hope that you have fond memories of the 1997/98 cricket season still fresh in your minds. I have. The past year was full of activity and innovation.

More teams and players registered to play than in the previous season. This caused Vicki Routh, our Competition Secretary, real problems trying to find grounds to use. To give this matter some real edge Cricket NSW is planning on a 50% increase in playing numbers within the next five years. If their predictions are correct, and I suspect that they will be close, then we face some real challenges in trying to accommodate all of these players. The good news is that the new sporting complex at Lucas Heights will be coming closer to completion. It is important that lovers of cricket make it clear to the Sutherland Council that you support their plans to place a number of pitches in that complex. We also need to support the development of turf pitch there. The SSJCA is fortunate to have a local council that helps us to the absolute maximum and is sympathetic to the idea that team sports, both summer and winter are a social asset. You may not know it, but Sutherland is the only local council in Sydney that does not charge for the use of its playing fields, for which we are grateful.

To matters of the competition, Caringbah Sports again won the Club Championship. Congratulations to all of their players and officials. Eleven of our clubs had teams playing in the competition finals, indicating the increased standard of coaching at the club level.

There are some issues that we need to give some consideration to as we approach the next season. "Sledging" is becoming more common, particularly in the older age groups. We will not permit this to continue. We will deal with any player or parent reported for this practice. The emphasis on coaching accreditation will be increased next season, any coach who told us that he or she would get a Coach's Certificate last year and did not, will not be allowed to coach just because they tell us that they will definitely get it this year. Clubs may need to ensure that they understand their 'Duty of Care' to their players. In order to protect themselves and their volunteer officials against potential legal action, they may need to look carefully at their rules and procedures. The Association is always available to help in this regard.

Our representative teams continued to excel. The Foster Shield team made it all the way to the Final. The Watson Shield team will tell you that they should also have done so, as will the Moore Shield side. The Gee Shield side got to the Semi-Final losing to their nemesis, Newcastle, who won the Shield. Three players won awards for their efforts during the Representative Season, Mark Hadfield, Watson Shield Player of the Year, Tristan Rigby, Gee Shield Wicketkeeper of the Year and Adam Chivers, Cawsey Shield Bowler of the Year. The combined efforts of the Foster, Cawsey, Moore and Watson Shield sides allowed Sutherland to win the Shell Shield for the Combined age groups. We were fourth in the Alan and Rae Ward Shield for the Creak, Gee and Weblin Shields and third in the Gerry Meyer Shield for the combined Junior and Senior competitions.

The Committee of Management elected last year worked superbly during the season. It would not be fair to mention individuals as they have all made significant contributions. They all know what I think of them. We undertook the task of compiling registrations data, going back in some cases ten years, of age groups and teams, along with figures of players who did not re-register. This innovative program was the result of hard work by Mike Mooney, our Registrar. We plan to issue a survey form to every player on our data base. We ask you to answer the questions and return it. The information gained from this survey will help us to design a competition that best meets the needs of the players, the parents and the Clubs. Our work in this area is being recognised by Cricket NSW as the most creative in the State. We have also undertaken a sweeping readjustment of the structure of the Committee of Management. We have taken the view that we need to be more accountable as well as being more focussed on specific tasks within the Committee. To that end, the Committee now more accurately reflects a business orientation. My thanks to our Secretary, Russ Waddell, for his advice in this area.

Finally, I would like to thank you for the opportunity given to me to be involved in the best Junior Cricket Association in NSW. Enjoy the winter and I look forward to seeing the players and parents again as the days lengthen into a summer dedicated to retaining the "Ashes".

SECRETARY'S REPORT

As the "new kid on the block" having stepped into the role of Secretary last September following Ivor Chalmers retirement due to health problems I may not be the best person to write this report. However, I shall do my best.

First and foremost is the sincere wish that every child who took part in the 1997/98 season enjoyed the experience, found new friends, developed skills, and had a thoroughly worthwhile time. To those with an edge over the rest of us, that is, those who played Representative cricket and nurtured ambitions and advanced their skills, I say, "well done". Whether you were a success or not is immaterial. As the old saying goes, "it is better to have tried and failed than never to have tried at all". Never be afraid to try. To those parents who supported representative teams and encouraged players my congratulations. Parental involvement and encouragement are marvellous ingredients for success.

My congratulations to all Clubs for a job well done in fielding so many teams, 138 of them, and for their support of the Association in its endeavours to manage what is a challenging activity. In my six months in "office" I have come to appreciate the commitment, impartiality, and even handedness demonstrated by my fellow members on the Association's Management Committee. Through occasional comments made, and reports which reach my ear, I gain the impression that these invaluable attributes seem to be questioned by a few every so often. Such questioning is totally lacking justification and, by its nature, counterproductive.

The Management Committee works for the good of the game and the development of the sport and the enjoyment for those who play it. In similar vein once or twice I have sensed that there is a small minority out there who take it too far. In their enthusiasm and incessant desire to win they have lost sight of the fact that winning is not everything. We are here for kids to play cricket as a sport. A sport with a proud tradition of good manners, sportsmanship, fair play and unquestioning acceptance of the umpire's decision. Parents who have not experienced the values of cricket, and perhaps have not played the noble game themselves can be forgiven for not understanding these values. It is up to those of us who were raised on these values to ensure that in this modern age we do not lose sight of them.

Putting aside these lesser concerns it is with pleasure that I report on happier aspects. I express appreciation for the hard work done by my predecessor, Ivor Chalmers and his assistance in facilitating my move to "his" chair. I hope that I can measure up to the standard he set.

We share in the pleasure of the District Club in winning the Sydney Grade Premiership not to mention their history making match against New Zealand. Their success is our success. More than 90% of our District Club players are former SSJCA Juniors. For those with the skills and ambitions there is a "career path" to follow.

Congratulations to Caringbah Sports Club on once more taking out the Club Championship.

Congratulations also to Luke Dudman on deservedly winning the "Cricketer of the Year" award for 1997/98.

Congratulations also to all players who made it to Representative level this season, and to all those who tried out.

Congratulations to all those who participated in the visit by the NSW North West Association in early January. While we were soundly beaten in all three matches it was a great social success. I am pleased to think that we provided a group of keen young lads (and one young lady I am pleased to say) with the opportunity to play cricket on turf wickets with picket fences, something they may never do again. I few provided the stuff of which dreams are made, we did well.

The season can never be successful without the work of the Sutherland Shire Council and in particular the Sports and Recreation Department. The degree of assistance and cooperation cricket receives from this group cannot be truly understood unless you are involved. Time and time again, our requests are met with a speedy and willing response. We are truly fortunate to receive such considerations. When you consider that this Shire

is one of very few where the "User Pays" policy is not applied every resident involved with cricket, not to mention other sports, should be grateful that we live in such a well treated community.

Thanks must also go to the Sutherland Shire Cricket Umpires Association for its support through the year. I am a strong advocate of the principle that the "Umpire is always right (even when he/she isn't)". My involvement with the great game extends back more than 50 years and I know of no more difficult aspect of the game than umpiring. Parents who have never worn the "black and white" and raised on a diet of TV cricket (particularly one day games!) are probably the worst umpires in the world. In an ideal world more parents would gain their umpire qualifications and would find that, apart from being different when you are out there, umpiring is a challenging and rewarding part of cricket. To all those who did umpire in the 1997/98 season, whether "black and white" or otherwise, I say "thank you". As long as you called them as you saw them you can do no more.

Finally, as I get to know more and more people at Club level, I wish to give my thanks for the assistance I have received and the courtesy and friendship extended. We do need to work together and to talk more to ensure that we all continue to advance cricket. In this age of litigation and self interests we must ensure that from the Association level we provide the leadership and direction essential for the well being of all affiliated clubs so that working together cricket will continue to prosper in the challenging years ahead.

I look forward to 1998/99 confident that none of us from Club level upwards will rest on our laurels but will strive to make Shire Junior cricket the best for kids in NSW.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Perusal of the Association's financial statements suggests, at first glance, that the season just concluded yielded a cash surplus of close to \$11,000, however, allowance must be made for net proceeds of \$4,500 from the previous season's raffle and a 'one off' State Government grant of \$4,000 - these bring us back to a much more realistic surplus of around \$2,500 for the year which is seen as satisfactory given the strong overall level of activity during the 1997/98 season.

Our only disappointment relates to the absence of new sponsors. The fielding of extra representative teams, if repeated, will demand that we obtain more sponsorships. While saying this, we must not forget the sponsors who stick with us year in - year out viz Caltex-Ampol, Harry Solomons (Kingsgrove Sports Centre) and Harry & Carole Peters (Ocean Monarch).

Unless some untoward expenses (such as increased insurance costs) pop up unexpectedly, it would be my intention to recommend no increase in fees for 1998/99. All in all, SSJCA is in a sound financial position which will enable us to continue the capital works programme to improve both the number and quality of our grounds in the Shire in partnership with SSCA and Sutherland Shire Council.

Relationships with clubs have been good with only a small amount being unpaid at balance date. Thank you for your co-operation.

COMPETITION SECRETARY'S REPORT

In reflection, this past season has been exciting with an increase in player registrations, but at the same time challenging with no increases in the availability of grounds. If this trend continues, and it would appear that it will, it is important that we seize every opportunity that presents itself to develop new grounds and maintain those we have in the competition already. I am confident that we will have an extra three, possibly four grounds next season for the higher age groups. However, there will still be a significant shortage in the smaller concrete wickets for our very young players.

Carrigbah Sports again won the Club Championship, having led the way since Round 1 and I congratulate the players of that Club for their successes on the field as well as the Coaches/Managers and Officials of the club.

I extend my congratulations not only to those teams who won Premierships - Carrigbah Sports, Illawong, St. Patrick's, Sylvania, Miranda, St. John Bosco and Como Jannali - but to every team who created such good competition which shouldn't be measured on performances alone, but which is a combination of keen sportsmanship, team spirit and enthusiasm from all players, as well as hard working Coaches/Managers and Administrators from all clubs.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the addition of a "new" club to the Association this season - Loftus - who made a welcome return with an U8 team, which they are committed to building on over the next few seasons.

The regulation which applied to Rotating Batting Order underwent a facelift this season in an attempt to overcome problems that had existed with the previous system for many seasons - most feedback from Coaches/Managers has been very positive, however over the "off season" there will be a review of the temporary regulation and any concerns raised will be addressed.

I believe that the U8 and U10 competitions are also in need of review - a view which has been supported by many club officials. There is a genuine concern that the structure of these competitions are not encouraging players to continue in the game - as a result they will be reviewed in the winter months.

This season, with the assistance of Russ Waddell the first edition of the Association's newsletter "Wickets" was published in an attempt to try and assist the Delegates with the dissemination of relevant information to Coaches and Managers. It is the intention of the Association to publish it on a very regular basis next season covering issues that are particularly important to the Officials at Saturday morning games.

In an effort to provide Coaches with more skills, the Association regulated that all Coaches must be accredited to a minimum Level O with the NSWCA, or seek accreditation in their first year of coaching and this will be strictly enforced in 1998/99. I am grateful to Barry Davidson who has assisted us by conducting both courses this season and I am hopeful he will continue to do so - it is intended that there will be a course at the end of August 1998 to provide accreditation at the beginning of the season.

I am grateful to Sid Edwards, Secretary of the SSCUA who assisted throughout the season by providing Official Umpires on Saturday mornings and for every grade in the Finals. Umpire courses are conducted each season and I urge all parents who will be umpiring on Saturday mornings to please consider attending the course - a better knowledge and understanding of the Laws of Cricket must benefit the players.

The Recorders were not part of the Management Committee this season and as a result we had to consider how this could work. Through a more involved reporting process to me everything ran smoothly and I am most appreciative of all their efforts - thanks to Kathie, Andy, "Scholie" and Karen.

The Sutherland Shire Council has continued to provide tremendous support to the Association and assisted us in the maintenance of existing grounds and development of new grounds. My thanks in particular to John Gordon and Murray Halls.

In closing, I would like to thank the Management Committee and club officials for their respect and co-operation, especially Russ Waddell who stepped into the shoes of one of the most respected people involved in junior cricket - Ivor Chalmers, both of whom have provided me with continued support.

GROUNDS REPORT

Once again your Association has worked closely with Sutherland Shire Cricket Association and Sutherland Shire Council to continue our intense programme of ground improvement.

At the end of each season we seek reports from all clubs on the state of grounds, practice facilities etc. and undertake an examination of data received and endeavour to prioritise works ready to undertake a formal evaluation when the wickets are uncovered after the football season. Some clubs provide excellent detailed reports, others are found wanting, which hinders the effectiveness of the programme.

During the 1997/98 season we replaced synthetic surfaces and/or undertook remedial earthworks at Boys Town 1, Boys Town 2, Lakewood City, Oyster Bay and Seymour Shaw 3. In addition, a new wicket was laid at Billia Road to alleviate the obvious shortage of facilities west of the Woronora River.

We are searching far-and-wide for situations where a wicket could be laid - negotiations are continuing with two schools and we are confident that at least one will result in a new facility for the 1998/99 season.

The Coca Cola Runs for Australia scheme was again approached and yielded valuable funds to enable Como Juniors to upgrade their practice nets at Oyster Bay and Engadine Dragons to lay a new synthetic practice net at Anzac. Well done fellas - these are top class facilities.

Again the Council provided excellent support and we are grateful for the guidance of John Gordon.

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR - LUKE DUDMAN

Luke Dudman, a member of Caringbah Sports Club, won the 14A Best Performance award last year and has eclipsed that effort by going on to win the "Cricketer of the Year" for 1997/98. A tremendous performance for a first year 16 given the quality players in that age group.

His credentials speak for themselves. In the season just completed Luke scored 573 runs in club cricket at an average of 63.7 and took 14 wickets, including a hat trick at an average of 12. He has been Captain of the Moore and Weblin Shield teams, Vice captain of the Sutherland Cricket Club Green Shield Team, and a member of the NSW Combined Metropolitan Team.

Kevin Everson, Coach of the 1997/98 Weblin Shield Team has this to say about Luke. "It is certainly no surprise to me that Luke has now reached this pinnacle in his cricketing endeavours. He has worked hard on his game in the last couple of seasons. He bats No. 3 for Caringbah and is without peer. A most solid batsman in the Mark Waugh mould, he complements this with clever off-spin bowling.

Tributes on Luke's all round skills pay credit to his leadership qualities. He has been referred to as an aggressive and respected Captain, and a very good fieldsman.

To achieve Cricketer of the Year is no mean feat. To have it said that "Luke has the ability to go on and achieve whatever it is he wants from the game" speaks volumes for his ability and commitment.

Not yet 16, Luke certainly has a future in the game. Kevin Everson remembers when Luke was a 7 year old. Even then Kevin remembers Luke "playing some of the most natural shots with effortless ease".

Luke is no fluke, if you will forgive the pun. He won the Best performance in 12As in 1995, and in winning the 96/97 Best Performance in 14A scored 562 runs at Club level with an average of 93.7.

The final word on Luke's efforts over the years which have culminated in this prestigious award comes from Kevin Everson again.

"The game has a lot to offer Luke, the rewards are great but remember you will only get out of it what you put into it. Stay focussed, it's there if you want it. Congratulations."

Those remarks we endorse sincerely. It is a pleasure to see a cricketer like Luke with so much potential earn this award.

BEST PERFORMANCE 14A - MATTHEW HUGHSTON

Matthew was the captain of the premiership winning 14A side for Caringbah Sports and an integral member of the More Shield team in season 1997/98.

Matt came of age this year as a batsman, thirties and forties of previous years turned into match winning 60's and 70's and in club cricket Matt accumulated 445 runs, and got them at the top end of the order.

In representative cricket Matt is feared as a hard hitting middle order batsman, and has the power to dismantle and opposition attack. A superb fieldsman in close (11 catches this season), he has turned his hand to slower

off spin bowling and this will become an important weapon in his armoury in the coming years. Seventy overs for not many more than 2 runs an over is very important in the style of cricket we are playing these days.

Matthew has won this award from a tightly contested field, and the Shire is fortunate to have this quality of cricketer grouped together in this age group.

Congratulations Matt, especially from your team mates, you captained your side well and are a deserved winner of this very prestigious award.

BEST PERFORMANCE 12A - STEPHEN CUSH

Stephen had another very successful cricket season in 1997/98 after winning the equivalent award last season in the Under 10's.

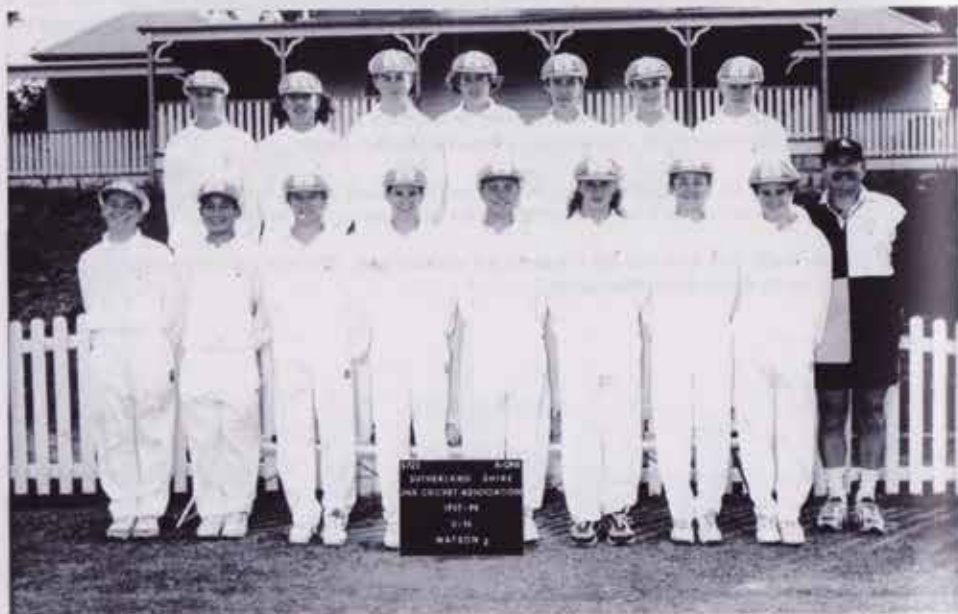

NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

- (f) Make false or misleading statements concerning the need for any goods, services, replacements or repairs.
- e) Make false or misleading statement concerning the existence or effect of any warranty or guarantee.

PENALTY:

For an individual - \$10,000 or 6 months imprisonment
For a corporation - \$50,000
