PART I EXECUTIVE & FINANCIAL REPORTS.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The past summer saw another season of our great game in the Sutherland Shire. Cricket has always been the most important summer sport of Australia. During the season the SSJCA presented high quality submissions to our partners, the Sutherland Shire Council to help them, and us, plan for the continuation of this tradition.

The demands on open space, particularly in an area of high land value, are growing greater with the passing years. We need to help the council understand the dynamic effects involved in the planned growth in the numbers of young boys and girls who will want to play cricket in the decades ahead. There are great opportunities becoming available with the release of the new Lucas Heights Sports grounds. These need to be maximised for the benefit of our game. We always keep in mind that our role as a leading partner in these areas of decision making in the Shire demands that we act creatively, and not simply to behave like a crying baby to ensure that we are always given attention. Your Management Committee under the professional guidance of Russ Waddell, with the able assistance of Vicki Routh made strong contributions to these matters.

The Association was a pro-active contributor during the year to a number of developments presented by the NSW Districts Cricket Association. We have agreed to help with a pilot program to identify work experience opportunities available amongst our parents and their community networks, to provide increased access to a varying range of work experiences for young people. This program is also being developed in the Northern Districts Junior Cricket Association. When completed, the program will create a database that will, in conjunction to similar programs in the schools environment, match a young person's interests, and his/her geographic area of Sydney with a provider of that sort of work experience. We will be seeking the co-operation of all of the Clubs if this is to be successful We have also been targeted by Cricket NSW to trial some innovative cricket programs. It is fair to say that the Sutherland Cricket community makes a huge contribution to the conduct of cricket throughout the State. Tom lecton is a member of the Board of Cricket NSW, and the ACB Sub-Committee and David Givney is the Cricket NSW Medical Officer Bill Johnston and Peter Schofield are members of Cricket NSW's coaching panel for the Emerging Blues program. Ray Brennan is a member of the Committee of Management of the Sydney Cricket Association, and I am a member of the Executive Committee of the NSW Districts' Cricket Association There can be no other Club or Association in NSW that is as involved in the game as we are.

During the season we developed a "Sunsmart" policy to be used by all Clubs. We modified many of our playing regulations, with the guidance of the Clubs. The end result of all this activity was a season that we believe was enjoyed by most of the players. Seven of the clubs participated in the Final series. Caringbah De La Salle, ended its 40 odd year involvement with the SSJCA on a high note winning its first 16A premiership. Congratulations to the Caringbah Sports Club for again winning the Club Championship. We were pleased to see this season that St. John Bosco Cricket Club marked its 30th anniversary as an Association member. It celebrated with a function to mark the occasion.

Our involvement in the Inter-Association representative season was more successful than in recent years. Four teams competed in the semi-finals, the Under 10's, 12's, 13'2 and 15's.

The under 13's convincingly won the Gee Shield Final. One of their players, Ryan Shepherd, was recognised as being NSWDCA Player of the Year, and Steven Smith from the Under-10's Team was awarded Foster Shield Batsman of the Year.

Thanks go to everyone who made a contribution to the season, Coaches, Managers, Club officials and particularly those who served the SSJCA on the Management Committee. Each of them carried their workload with good humour, sometimes under stress. We did labour slightly by virtue of being one member short throughout the year. Please consider standing for office in the elections to held shortly. We constantly need new ideas and fresh attitudes to keep us going forward and to preserve our reputation as the most progressive and creative Junior Cricket Association in NSW.

SUPPORTING SPORT IN THE SHIRE

SECRETARY'S REPORT

This is my second report as Association Secretary. In reviewing and reporting on the 1998/99 season it would be simple to sit back and write "it was a good year, all did well, thanks to all the volunteer hard workers, the season was a success, and congratulations to all the winners." All these comments are appropriate and meant, but only tell part of the story. The other side is less attractive but needs to be addressed. To deny what went on this year is to abrogate my responsibility as Secretary. The Secretary is the Public Officer and watchdog of the Association. The position charged more so than most with ensuring that we maintain the traditions of fair play and sportsmanship that are the core of the game's attraction and longevity for more than two thousand years.

This year saw too many instances of swearing, sledging, biased umpiring, off-field coaching, and unwarranted complaints that the Association was being too hard. If the Association was being too hard it was for good reason. The outcome of a game of cricket is easily influenced by an untimely or inaccurate decision. The fall of a wicket to an illegal delivery, the batting of a player out of order, the calling or non-calling of a no-ball, an improper LBW decision, all these things can change the course of a match. Despite our best endeavours, the issue of documentation, the creation of "Wickets", the conduct of briefings, the willingness to visit clubs and communicate, these faults continued to repeat themselves game after game.

Times change as do attitudes, practices and community standards. Nevertheless the fundamental principles and philosophies that guide the game remain. We are conducting a program of competition cricket. It must be conducted fairly and squarely. Those who volunteer must make the effort to know what the game is all about and oversee its conduct accordingly.

The most disturbing events of the year were those relating to on field behaviour and swearing. These are totally unacceptable. It is the responsibility of all coaches, managers and those who stand as umpires to say to any offending player. "This is not on! Stop it or leave the field". This Association will support any umpire who takes a stand against such behaviour.

The late Alan McGilvray, that doyen of commentators wrote in 1985, "The game is not the same". Never was there a truer statement. The game is not the same, it is changing but not necessarily for the better. It is up to us all whether at Association level, or Club level, whether officials or parents, umpires, coaches or players, to ensure we do all in our power to reverse the trend and get the game back to where it was, - the finest summer sport in Australia that any child could ask to play.

Come this time next year it will be most satisfying if I can confirm that together we have succeeded and 1999/2000 was not blemished with those undesirable aspects that marred 1998/99.

The responsibility for the management of youth cricket in the Sutherland Shire rests ultimately with this Association. To be effective we need the best people with an interest in, if not a passion for the game, to be involved, to be part of the Management Team. Thus next week we seek people to give of their time and energies to come forward and nominate. Nowhere is this more important than with respect to the position I occupy. If there are people who believe my comments are unjustified, in poor taste, or offensive, please step forward. I will willingly stand down.

Nevertheless, we are already hard at work planning new initiatives for next season and taking on board the criticisms and suggestions arising from this year. We look forward to 1999/2000 and the start of the next century with optimism. There will be a lot to be done in the next few

years as we adapt to new technology and changes in the way we operate. Changes are necessary if we are to prosper.

I for one am quite confident that if we work together, that is, if all clubs work with the Association in facing up to the challenges ahead, not only will success be attained but it will prove to be an exciting and rewarding time for us all with cricket the major winner.

COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

In reviewing the 1998/99 cricket season, there are several issues that require mention.

The Association provided cricket for 130 teams this season. Aside from U8 Mini cricket, players competed in introductory, modified and traditional cricket in competitions ranging from 10E grade up to 16 A.

Caringbah Sports once again won the Club Championship for the 8th consecutive year Congratulations! Caringbah De La Salle have completed their last season of cricket with the
SSJCA due to dwindling numbers and are leaving in fine style having captured the esteemed
16A premiership – Congratulations also on their fine effort.

Though there was a decrease in teams registered this season, it offered the opportunity to extend the 14B and 16C competitions to 60 overs. Next season, it is hoped that our numbers will increase once more due to the exposure and the anticipated success of the Australian World Cup Team This will undoubtedly place pressure on the allocation of grounds!

We were able to bring on line three extra grounds this season-Woolooware High School. Engadine West Public School & Prince Edward Park However we were limited to the use of only one of the Solander fields for the entire season and Lucas Heights Oval was relegated to a spare ground. This decision was made following a directive by Sutherland Council that the ground be shared with baseball. The view of the Association then, and now, is that that proposition is unworkable.

Vandalism and poor playing surfaces once again resulted in regular changes to the draw usually with little notice.

The Association has commenced to compile a register for all grounds in the Shire and this will be used in consultation with the Council and, as necessary, the SSCA to determine priorities in maintenance and upgrade programs. The Association has also submitted to Council a proposal for the Lucas Heights tip development seeking a full range of facilities for training and matches at all levels including representative.

Following consultation with representatives from all clubs, the U10 competition underwent a major "face lift" with changes introduced to the regulations that govern both introductory and modified cricket. The introduction of new bowling and batting regulations were designed to maximise these aspects. U10 players at these levels should have maximum participation. Cricket should be fun but still provide for skill development.

Coupled with this is the need for Coaches to become accredited and Managers and Scorers to become knowledgeable in the application of the regulations. A further review is intended prior to the start of next season, and it will include U12 modified cricket.

The Competition Results & Review Committee was presented with some varied and interesting challenges this season which on occasion led to a need to make some difficult and at times unpopular decisions. The Committee aimed for consistency and consistently set out to inform and educate the reasons for its decisions. It is evident that there is a need for the Association to become more involved with Managers & Coaches prior to and throughout the season - assisting them in the interpretation of the Regulations and MCC Laws of Cricket and issues aside from those that arise during Saturday morning matches. It is also clear that there is a need to review the "penalty system". Both of these issues are presently under review.

It is important to recognise that junior cricket will ultimately be the winner if teams are prepared to adopt positive attitudes and clubs work together. While winning is important there is more to be gained - enjoyment, sportsmanship, team work, friendships and ultimately a love of the game.

The SSCUA were again able to provide us with a maximum number of Umpires to officiate at our matches and I am grateful to Syd Edwards and his committee for their co-operation.

Sutherland Shire Council has again provided solid support and assistance to the Association this season and particular reference should be made to John Gordon, Kirin Lindop and Paul Harding for their efforts.

It would be remiss of me not to thank the Association Recorders - Kathy McInnes, Terry Chalmers, Andy Crawford and Karen Bowmer - for their efforts. Recording requires a good deal of time and accuracy is essential Regrettably the efforts they expend are not always recognised for the valuable contribution they make to junior cricket.

The Management Committee's continuing support is always appreciated and the assistance I receive from Russ Waddell invaluable - thank you!

In closing, I thank everybody who participated in or contributed to junior cricket over the past season. As a result the future of junior cricket in this Shire remains promising.

HAVE-A-GO CRICKET

Young boys and girls in the Sutherland shire from 4 years to 9 years old are havingfun and learning the skills of cricket on Friday nights at the Sylvania and Illawong centres. The program is designed to develop basic motor and cricket skills through a carefully planned progression of practice and games. The success of the program is shown by the growing numbers each year (47 at Sylvania and 51 at Illawong)and the high proportion of participants that continue until the very last night.

The program caters for the four to six year olds with a Junior program, while the older players can advance at a faster rate in a senior program. Not only does the program give the players and introduction to cricket, but by involving the parents in every activity we are also teaching the next generation of coaches how to teach the basics

In the future it would be good to see more Centres in the Shire, and also more clubs helping at the centres, such as in the case of Illawong which is run jointly by the Illawong and Aquinas cricket clubs. If we had a few more centres, perhaps we could even finish the program with a short series of games against other centres.

The Have-A-Go program is the best option we have to foster junior cricket in the shire, the more we support it, the more young people we will have wanting to join our junior clubs




