PART I EXECUTIVE & FINANCIAL REPORTS.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another in a continuing string of successful years of quality cricket for the boys and girls of the Sutherland Shire has passed us by with the end of the nineteen hundreds. An increase in the number of players again put our facilities under stress. The opening of a new ground at Lucas Heights did help a bit and we look forward to more new grounds coming on line in the years ahead. It is always a difficult job to co-ordinate the use of grounds when we have so few reserves, and our Competition Manager, Vicki Routh again did a great job of organising the draw. I expect that next year we will have a further increase in numbers unless the Olympic Games interfere with registrations. We took some pro-active measures to stimulate girls cricket toward the end of the season. Vice President, Harry Peters along with Christina Matthews from Cricket NSW organised a Gala day at Caringbah Oval as well as a series of school visits to generate increased interest.

We were fortunate at the very end of the season with the weather for the finals. The first day was completely washed out for all of the games, but they were completed successfully on the second day. Congratulations to all of the premiers. The SSJCA had a very successful representative season, the Creak Shield, the Weblin Shield and the Moore Shield teams all qualified for the Semi-Finals. The Moore Shield team was successful beating Newcastle. This was their second win in two years. Our Presidents' teams performed with real quality. This is a proven path to help players move forward into Representative Cricket.

To the multitude of volunteers, my sincere thanks. Nothing can be done in this great sport without you. To the Club coaches, managers, umpires, parents our gratitude. To all of those who dedicated their time to the running of the Association my thanks again. This is particularly so for the efforts of Russ Waddell and Vicki Routh who used the vast experience of Ivor Chalmers and re wrote the Constitution of the Association. To all of the others, my thanks, to Peter Davis and Steve Mulally for their help with the Representative commitments, Ray Brennan for his work as Finance Manager, to the Vice Presidents Harry Peters and Karen Bowmer, Mike Mooney, Faye Kanard and Peter Smith - no-one knows how many hours of your time you give up.

This year saw the introduction of the Isport Internet site, some of the clubs took it up with enthusiasm, others have not yet seen the value that it can be. Next year will see an improvement in the site's operation and more training for clubs that want to use it.

Enjoy the winter and the Olympic Games (I intend to) and when we start again in October 2000, later than previously, we look forward to seeing you all again. To those of you who have finished your time as Juniors we thank you for the fun you gave us and hope that you continue to enjoy our great game.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Looking back on the season concluded I believe it has been quite successful. My congratulations go to Como-Jannali for winning the club championship for the first time since the two clubs combined. Also to all clubs and teams that were successful in attaining the title of "Premiers", well done.

The Presidents and Secretaries seminar held as a forerunner to the season's commencement was well received and I shall be recommending it be repeated. It is an ideal forum for key personnel of all clubs to improve personal contacts that can only be beneficial to cricket activities within the Shire.

The success of that strategy bore fruit with a decrease in the number of misconduct maters coming to the attention of the Association. With these matters being resolved in the main at club level through club to club discussion and management we are moving forward.

With cricket now being played at four levels, mini, introductory, modified and traditional, the season's results suggest that these arrangements are working well. The changes made to modified cricket look to have achieved the goal of increasing player participation and with one set of rules for modified cricket we seem to have reduced the instance of misunderstandings.

Our thanks, as ever, go to the hundreds of volunteer coaches, managers and scorers. Without your help there would be no junior cricket. The same applies equally to our reliable and hardworking recorders. Were it not for their conscientious efforts it would be close to impossible to extract the data to provide progressive point scores each fortnight.

Nevertheless, while applauding that splendid volunteer effort I plead that if you are going to make this worthwhile contribution to kids cricket please learn the rules. Attend SSJCA talks and seek clarification on any aspect where doubt exists. The biggest single area of concern we face is where well meaning people acting in doubt make their own rules. This not only causes problems when brought to notice but in the end result it is the players who suffer most.

This year saw the completion of a review of the Association's Constitution. The new Constitution has been accepted by the Department of Fair Trading and copies have been distributed to all clubs. Our thanks go to former Secretary, Ivor Chalmers, for his work in providing input and scrutinising the end product. Thank you Ivor for all your time and effort.

Grounds are always a matter of concern. We have 65 grounds available to us within the Shire. Most, but not all, are Council grounds. Of that 65 some are not particularly attractive for a number of reasons and we avoid using them. Waterfall and Bundeena are two that spring to mind immediately for different reasons. The use of school grounds places additional pressures on us all in terms of complying with requirements for security and tidiness. We seek your assistance in meeting these requirements at all times or risk losing these grounds. Sutherland Council through its Sports & Recreation Department does an outstanding job in looking after our interests and for this we are very grateful. However, we have now completed a survey of all the grounds and will be talking to Council to develop a program of upgrades. There are many forms of sport being played within the Shire and we dare not lose sight that all requirements we submit are viewed against competing claims. That is life! The time is drawing nearer when, to have the use of reasonable grounds and at the same time have sufficient grounds to meet our needs, we shall have to give serious consideration to playing some games on Sunday mornings. We must retain a flexible outlook for the future or risk being left behind.

Finally, one more plea of our earnest volunteers. An area that continues to cause niggling concern is that of umpiring. The concern arises because I believe that almost without exception the cause creating concern is unintentional. I refer to a small number of coaches who appear to have an identity crisis when they take the field to umpire. Torn between concern for their players and the impartiality demands of umpiring they sometimes lose sight of the bigger picture. We are not here to play for Sheep Stations nor Telstra Shares but to encourage kids and assist them in developing an understanding and love for this great sport. Just remember when you take that field as an umpire you are umpiring a game of cricket and put aside the fact that the team you coach is one of the two involved.

COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

Having completed the competition statistics for the Annual Report, it's now time to reflect on the past season.

Congratulations to Como Januali on their success in the Club Championship, to the Premiership teams for their efforts, and also to those players who have been recognised for their individual performances.

It has been a season of change, particularly for the younger players with the introduction of some innovative changes to both introductory and modified cricket – all of which were directed at ensuring a greater degree of player participation in the younger age groups and grades.

With a view of becoming more "user friendly" and clearly more relevant to the scoring of junior cricket in this Shire, change was also witnessed with the introduction of a new scorebook.

It has also presented some challenges, not the least of which has been to maintain play on Saturday mornings for all grades of cricket, but with some careful strategic planning the draw was able to accommodate this. Clubs should however accept that the move to Sunday cricket will undoubtedly need to be introduced at some time in the future if the SSJCA is to fully maximise the use of better playing facilities for all grades of junior cricket.

Challenges also came in the form of the interpretation of Regulations and Laws of cricket. While acknowledging that there is a great deal of time given freely by volunteers on Saturday morning, there is also a need to establish a better understanding of the laws and regulations and a more uniform approach to the game. This must be a co-operative effort on the part of both the clubs and the SSJCA – ongoing throughout the season.

One of our greatest challenges lies ahead in the introduction of girls' cricket. Towards the end of the season, Harry Peters (Vice President) with the assistance of NSWDCA planned the Association's first taste of girls' cricket by conducting a Gala and Information Day. "Lady Luck" was sadly not with us and because of the weather it was postponed, however the number of girls in attendance still rose above 40 and clearly with a concentrated effort in the off season, next year will see our first competitive girls competition.

The approach to next season's competition promises to be very different. Given that the Olympics will commence at a time when our junior competition would normally be scheduled to commence, the SSJCA has had to be more flexible and as a result our competition will be structured as 6 two day matches and 4 one day limited over matches.

In closing, my personal thanks to:

- The SSJCA Recorders Karen Bowmer (U16), Terry Chalmers (U14), Debbie Watson (U12) and John Worton (U10). I rely heavily on their efforts at the end of each match and at the end of the season – it is not only time consuming but the degree of accuracy that is achieved must be commended.
- The Sutherland Shire Council who once again has been very supportive of junior cricket in the Shire and has endeavoured to work with us throughout the season. To this end, my thanks are extended to John Gordon and Kirin Lindop.

- The SSCUA who once again assisted the junior competition by providing appointed Umpires, and particularly Sid Edwards and his Committee. Umpire courses are conducted regularly by the SSCUA during the cricket season and I would urge all those who will be involved in this area to attend.
- The Management Committee of the SSJCA and Secretaries/Delegates of the each club for their support and co-operation throughout the 1999/2000 cricket season.

FINANCE MANAGER'S REPORT

The coming two seasons will see us required to invest considerable funds in replacing outdated equipment and relaying worn synthetic wickets to ensure our boys play on the best surfaces we can make available. We are ready for these commitments with a sound financial position supported by this year's strong operating surplus, although this was exaggerated by lower than planned expenditure on new synthetic wickets.

All things considered, there would be no expectation of any fee increases next season, notwithstanding the introduction of the Goods & Services Tax on 1th July.

While there was the usual excellent support from Club Secretaries/Treasurers during the season, the performance in collection and accounting for representative monies caused me much frustration and duplication of effort.



Skipp Richards batted well to be 29 not out at the end and Mitchell Bowmer pulled off the catch of the season behind the stumps as wicketkeeper.

Now we have to wait until next year to do it all again!
