PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another successful year of high quality cricket for the boys and girls of the Sutherland Shire has passed us by, my sixth and last as President. It was a season of proactive and sometimes controversial activity. We launched our girls cricket season, which proved to be one of great fun and enjoyment. Thanks to Vice President, Harry Peters, Michael Mooney and Vicki Routh for their help along with great assistance from Cricket NSW. We also started Sunday cricket due to the increase in numbers of players and the relative shortage of grounds and the Council's desire to see their resources utilised to the full. We have conducted a post season analysis of this move in the face of some solid opposition to see if that opposition is widespread. Whatever the result, we will look at ways to improve the running of Sunday cricket, but the current committee is committed to the ongoing conduct of Sunday cricket for a wide range of reasons.

We were again very fortunate at the very end of the season with the weather for the finals. Congratulations to the Club Champions from Engadine and to all of the premiers. The SSJCA again had a very successful representative season, the Foster Shield team becoming the first side in many years to beat Bankstown and to take out the Shield. The Gee and Weblin Shield sides also qualified for the Semi-Finals. Our Presidents' teams continued to perform with real quality.

To the hosts of volunteers, my sincere thanks. In an Olympic year when the deeds of volunteers were so in focus you can all hold your heads high. Nothing can be done in this great sport without you. To the Club coaches, managers, umpires, parents our gratitude. To all of those who dedicated their time to the running of the Association my thanks again. To all of the members of the Management Committee my sincere thanks.

This year saw the continued use of the Isport Internet site, under Peter Risby's guidance our use expanded and while some of the clubs took it up with enthusiasm, others have not yet seen the value that it can be.

Enjoy the winter and when we start again in September 2001, we look forward to seeing you all again. To those of you who have finished your time as juniors we thank you for the fun you gave us and hope that you continue to enjoy our great game.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again another successful season notwithstanding the impact of the Olympic games and inconsistent weather. My congratulations go to Engadine for winning the club championship. To all clubs and teams that were successful in attaining the title of "Premiers", - Well done! Despite the best attempts by the weather to frustrate the finals we achieved success. Seventeen matches were played, seventeen results achieved. It was pleasing to see that of the fifteen clubs in the Association thirteen were represented.

It was not an easy year administratively. The impact of the Olympic games required some creative thinking. New NSW Government legislation on the protection of children with the concurrent introduction of the "working with children check" provided more work. The decision to introduce Sunday cricket was obviously a difficult matter. Creating a new competition for girls required hours of planning effort. Planning, organising and oversighting three coaching

accreditation courses also demanded time and effort. Incidentally, there are still some people who seem to lack an appreciation of the importance of the coaching accreditation scheme. The fact that it is safety based for the welfare of players (and protection of club officials) seems to have been missed by some. Use of the internet has grown substantially and E-mail is now our major intra association communication medium. Scores and other matters are regularly posted on the net (www.isport.com.au/cricket/ssjca). Many thanks to Peter Risby for his contribution in this area.

Overall, it was an important year. The first year that we played cricket on Sunday mornings. The first year that we ran a competition solely for girls. The decision to introduce Sunday morning cricket for the under 8 and under 10 (introductory) age groups was not taken lightly. Nor was it taken without consultation, as some would suggest. Whether the introduction of Sunday cricket was wise or ill conceived is beside the point. Those elected to manage the affairs of the Association made a decision, which is why they were elected in the first place. Only time will tell but it is not unreasonable for Association management to expect that once a decision is made and conveyed it is incumbent upon all club managements to accept that decision and implement to the best of ability

The new management team of Ken Whittingham and Paul Giovenco did a great job on the representative cricket scene. With ten such teams it requires a deal of work and commitment. Ken and Paul brought new ideas and a fresh approach. Apart from the success of the Under 10 Foster shield team the surprise, and a tribute to all the Inter-Association teams, was the unexpected winning (though shared with Newcastle) of the Shell Series award. This demonstrates how competitive all teams were and reflects great credit on the players, coaches and mangers. The three Presidents Competition teams performed well and shared the honours with Penrith. Thus, looking at the bigger picture, the Representative effort for the year was highly commendable and a credit to all concerned.

Our thanks, as ever, go to the hundreds of volunteer coaches, managers and scorers. Without such help there would be no junior cricket. The same applies equally to our reliable and hardworking recorders. Their contribution is underestimated by most. They are key players in our efforts and without their input our task would be far more difficult.

I note with regret that Peter Friend is leaving us after 8 years of service to cricket both at Shire and District Association levels. In the four years I have worked with Peter I have noted two outstanding traits. His genuine regard for junior cricket and encouragement of all that play it and, his tolerance and wisdom in the face of dissension. His term of presidency (6 years) has been a difficult one with a need to provide management skill or a host of varying demands from a wide range of sources. He has done well and this Association and all associated with it should be grateful for his leadership, good humour, and commitment to the task.

SSJCA GIRLS CRICKET COMPETITION REPORT

This season saw the Association introduce a cricket competition for girls only. It was both a success and a pleasant interlude from the more serious cricket played on Saturday mornings. That is not to say that the girls competition was not competitive It was, but it was played in such a carefree atmosphere as to make it a delight to attend on a Sunday morning.

Played using the Super 8 format it proved quite competitive and there was a deal of talent unearthed. As insufficient numbers prevented forming aged based teams each team consisted of a spread of ages. This did not appear to be a problem and the enthusiasm displayed by all outweighed any disadvantages.

Four teams competed. Named by the girls themselves, (Pink Sharks, Dream Team, Blues, and Stormers), some forty girls took part. The Association organised and ran the competition but special thanks must go to Marine Products Pty Ltd (Directors Harry and Carol Peters) for sponsoring the competition and providing the team shirts and caps. After ten rounds of cricket "The Blues" ran out the winners.

The SSJCA would like to acknowledge the efforts of the Managers for each of these teams: Jackie Bridge (Blues), Michael Herder (Pink Sharks), Paul Marsh & Bruce Booker (Dream Team) and Brian Freney (Stormers).

Plans are in hand to build on this program in the coming season. More attention will be given to coaching and development aspects and the Association will welcome expressions of interest from qualified coaches interested in taking part in this objective.

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS MEDALS.

On 31 December 1998 the Prime Minister announced the creation of an Australian Sports Medal in the Australian system of honours and awards. The year 2000 saw the introduction of this newly established national honour. Its purpose was to provide recognition for outstanding achievement in sport. The criteria provided for a range of participants.

The Australian Cricket Board was allocated 1300 medals on an Australia wide basis. In turn, Cricket NSW asked all Cricket Associations to submit nominations within the parameters of the criteria. All SSJCA clubs were asked to provide details of prospective recipients.

Subsequently, early in this season now completed (Sunday 22 October 2000), an awards ceremony was conducted by Mr. John A. Chapman OAM ASM, Vice President Cricket NSW. Fifteen people nominated by the SSJCA were presented with Australian Sports Medals.

COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

Congratulations to Engadine Dragons on their success in the Club Championship, to the Premiership teams and to those players who achieved their personal bests for the season.

The 2000/01 season of junior cricket has been both diverse and controversial - a season of one day games, the introduction of play on Sundays ,the introduction of a Girls competition and the review of the MCC Laws of Cricket.

Difficult decisions made by the Management Committee were not always embraced or supported as may have been hoped although they almost certainly resulted in healthy and somewhat passionate discussions. The Sydney Olympics certainly impacted on our competition and forced us to revert to 4 one- day rounds, one of which was unfortunately washed out! Next season will see a return to the traditional 10 two day rounds.

The shortage of fields and the desire to promote and grow junior cricket in the Shire led the Management Committee to make a difficult decision to schedule U8 and Introductory cricket games to Sunday play. Discussion has continued throughout the season on this issue and 1 am sure will continue for some time yet. It is apparent that the Management Committee will need to review Sunday play and make clear decisions that will assist clubs in registering players for the forthcoming season.

The girls competition commenced with a great deal of enthusiasm – proudly sponsored by Marine Product Marketing, all players were provided with a playing shirt and cap with the theme "Girls can too!" emblazoned on their shirts. Four teams were registered, with ages spanning 8 to 15 years. Having reviewed the season with Managers of the teams, next season will commence in September, there will be scheduled coaching sessions and the format will be more traditional. We will make a concentrated effort at primary school level to increase our numbers and it is expected that team numbers will double.

Junior cricket cannot survive without the efforts of volunteers in the form of Club officials, Coaches and Managers and I am grateful for the time that is freely given by these people, however I am once again drawn to comment that there is a need to establish a greater understanding of the Laws of cricket and the regulations that are specific to this Association as well as adopt a uniform approach to the game.

The standard of recording this season was again to be commended and I am grateful to the commitment and efforts of Terry Chalmers (U16), SallyAnn Copp (U14), Debbie Watson (U12), John Worton (U10) and also Chris Danielson (U8).

Official Umpires were provided by the SSCUA at a record number of junior matches this season and it would be remiss of me not to thank Syd Edwards and his Committee for their commitment to the SSJCA.

In closing, I would like to thank the Management Committee who have assisted and supported me throughout the season and also to the Club Secretaries who hand in hand with providing me with some "food for thought" on several issues, have also provided support when required.

It is with great pleasure, as coach of EDCC 16A's in 2000/2001 that I have been asked to write about Ryan (also known as and referred to as "Shep").

Although in my first year of team coaching, having been actively involved in cricket at all levels in the Sutherland Shire for over 36 years, I feel confident in my judgment that Ryan is something very special and capable of progressing to the very top.

The 16A's competition was well contested with a host of quality players, many of who would have been worthy recipients of this prestigious award. However, in Ryan not only statistically was he the best performed, he was easily the most respected opponent of all opposing players and coaches. This is often far more relevant than anything else.

Ryan was the premier batsman in the competition, a model of consistency, only missing out once when he was run out in the final. Suffice to say his impact on any game when at the crease is so great, that it was clearly the turning point of the game. I know all those associated with the eventual premiers Miranda, breathed a huge sigh of relief when Shep walked from the field

The most significant fact about Shep's batting is the manner in which he scores his runs. Always looking to dominate opposing attacks, scoring quickly, plundering anything loose, whilst accumulating runs all round the wicket through his complete array of strokes. Another key feature of his batting, which is often a weakness particularly with young players, is his excellent running between wickets.

Almost every partnership of note that our team enjoyed involved Ryan. Each player enjoyed batting with him, although it can be hazardous at the non-striker's end when the ball whistles past you at great speed. The team's confidence grew every time Ryan began to dominate.

Ryan plays the game the way it should be played letting his willow do the talking for him. What impressed me most about him was the manner in which he accepted his dismissals whether they are dubious or otherwise. There were no remonstrations, sulking or excuses he simply accepted what occurred.

Most of this report has concentrated on Shep's batting but one should not forget his bowling and fielding. As is the case with many of our shires elite players, they are athletes capable of performing all disciplines. Ryan bowls at good pace, using his strength to maximum advantage. At first slip he took several good snares & even wicket kept on occasions with distinction.

Shep was an integral member of both the Watson & Green Shield teams. Filled in for the Engadine Dragons A1 team and Sutherland District 5th grade, again demonstrating everyone's confidence in his ability and temperament to play against those many years his senior. It also shows his love for the game, as boys these days seem to be playing or practicing cricket almost every day of the week.

What I failed to mention earlier is that Ryan is in his first season of 16's! One can only wonder what he might do next season.

When you look at the statistics below please remember last season was an Olympic year, meaning 4 of the 10 games played were 30 over a side games. It was also a particularly wet

period with grass coverage on fields, presenting an unfair challenge to all of our young cricketer's.




