



It has not been an easy period with the tragic events of September 11 having far reaching effects on our family and social lives including cricket with rising insurance costs.

A special thanks is reserved for our hard working committee who have overcome many difficulties in delivering a well-administered season for our children to participate in.

These difficulties included:

- Sunday Cricket
- Shortage of suitable grounds
- Falling numbers generally in children's sport and the change in the attitude of sport in schools due to the lack of suitably accredited teachers to coach teams.
- An abnormal number of disputes and examples of unsatisfactory conduct of players & team officials, on and off the field.
- Difficulty of securing volunteers to assist in administration of our cricket.

Despite the above, new technology has assisted us greatly, particularly in communication. Our association web site attracted over 20,158 page view hits and we urge all clubs to push this medium with members. Thanks to Peter Risby in developing and administering this site.

A change was needed, and we appreciated the overwhelming support from the clubs when we experienced a few problems early on. The new changes in selection & trial policy must be maintained in the future to ensure credibility. Congratulations to all rep teams and officials for their efforts this season past.

These people have worked tirelessly (without children involved) and have given me the utmost support at all times in the administration of our season. I cannot thank them enough for their knowledge and wisdom with the many difficulties we encountered.

**VALE – IVOR ALLAN CHALMERS. ASM**  
**4/8/1924 – 16/5/2002**



16 May '02 saw the passing of a gallant and cricket-loving gentleman, Ivor Chalmers. Ivor was Association Secretary from 1995 to 1997 which was the last position he held prior to retiring after a period of 12 years on the Committee of the SSJCA. He was renowned for his integrity, forthrightness and love of the game. He served cricket administration first with Caringbah Sports Cricket Club of which he was a Life Member and subsequently the SSJCA of which he became a Life Member in 1995.

Ivor had a passion for the game and its importance as a character developing influence for young people. His knowledge of the Laws of Cricket and Association's rules and regulations was unsurpassed in his time. He always exuded confidence and his role of Secretary featured a no-nonsense approach to the game, its history and traditions.

His early and untimely passing reflects the mortality we all live with and in his going he will be sadly missed.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT**

Season 2001/02 was one of mixed fortune. Once again the competitions and the representative season ran very well and the fact that they were successful is due in large part to the hard work and organisational skills of our competition manager (Vicki Routh) and representative managers (Ken Whittingham and Paul Giovenco) respectively. Their reports are found elsewhere in this Annual Report.

This year we established the SSJCA website which was a runaway success judging by the number of hits and downloads and has proved a valuable tool in being able to disseminate information to as wide a base as possible. Thanks to Peter Risby for the amount of time and energy he has devoted to this project.

With the introduction of this web site and correspondence via e-mail the primary step of getting the message to club secretaries is more immediate and this is an area where we will continue to develop and utilise.

There were a number of significant changes this season. Under 8 cricket was rolled into the Have-A-Go program. There were procedural / administrative changes as well. As with all change some were affected more than others.

This committee, under the guidance of Harry Peters, set a goal at the very first meeting, to ensure that the administration of cricket in this Shire was not only fair and equal to all concerned but that it was seen to be that way as well. The sniping and ill-founded innuendo that has been around for so long needed to be stopped. This goal was achieved with all decisions being open and transparent. This is not to say that everyone agreed with the decisions but it can be said that the rules and guidelines of the SSJCA were applied equally to all without fear or favour.

The number of junior cricketers registered in the Shire has been reasonably stable over the past five seasons. The full utilisation of grounds in the Shire is of paramount importance and the interactive and ongoing relationship with Sutherland Shire Council is imperative. While the SSJCA is always trying to increase player numbers we need to be mindful of the physical restraints present.

As pointed out by Harry in his President's report for a variety of personal and business reasons, a number of the current committee will not be standing for re-election next season. In this group, the Association is losing a wealth of cricket administration experience.

Each of these Committee members has in their own way made a significant impact on cricket and the way it is conducted here in the Sutherland Shire. To these 5 retiring members, thank you for your contributions to the SSJCA over the years. May I, on behalf of all parents and fair-minded people associated with Sutherland junior cricket, wish you good health and enjoyment in your future pursuits (for which you will now have far more time).

I should single out one of this group for special mention. Harry Peters has been a committee member since 1991/92. He is a life member of the SSJCA. Harry's contributions to voluntary organisations are truly amazing and this Association will

sorely miss his experience as well as his measured and valued advice. Harry has been a stalwart on the committees on which he has served

**SSJCA DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM ACTIVITIES.**

The Association's efforts to provide a program of development was quite broad and covered the development of a competition for girls, Introductory cricket, Have a Go Cricket, a Representative Cricket Off Season Development Program and Information dissemination and knowledge for parents and coaches/lumpries.

SSJCA Girls

The Girl's program was moderately successful. As a follow on from the inaugural introduction of cricket for girls in 2000/2001 the Association in the off-season sent out in excess of 130 letters to girls inviting them to participate in the 2001/2002 season. Registrations were taken, schools circulated, advertisements placed in local community newspapers. Pre-season coaching and training were conducted with the assistance of one of the Association's leading clubs. In light of a poor response to all the publicity undertaken two teams were formed to participate in the Association's normal weekend competitions.

A measure of success may be found in the following team reports.

14E Team.

Firstly I would like to thank all the young ladies who made this season so enjoyable for all who were associated with them. Secondly the parents, who put so much time and effort into the overall smooth running of the Belles. To Jim Meyer who was our umpire, Allan Rolleston and Jim who ran our practice sessions and to every family that took their turns scoring. Thirdly our sponsor who so generously provided for the teams.

And not forgetting S.S.J.C.A for establishing and promoting female cricket in the Shire.

Our inaugural year of competition in the Boys 14E was always going to be a struggle given the level of experience that the team had overall. But judging from the comments from opposing teams as the season progressed, the Belles were fast learners in their skills, sportsmanship and camaraderie on and off the field. Next season I am sure will be more exciting and successful. Once again thank you all very much for such a pleasurable and rewarding summer.

10E Team.

The girls came together for a training run just before the season started. They really started to come together as a team very early in the season and the effort put in increased by 100%. Team spirit and friendship were fantastic. Skills were honed and improved through training and the effort resulted in the team ending the season a very credible 2<sup>nd</sup>. An excellent effort by all players that made for a very proud and happy coach.

Skill Development days for those playing Introductory cricket were carried out with the assistance of the Sutherland District Cricket Club (the Grade club) and focused on basic skills of fielding, running and wicketkeeping. The assistance of these players and club officials was invaluable and their efforts very much appreciated.

With the cancellation of its Under 8 competition program for children the Association focused on broadening development at two levels in the youngest age groups. Those involved with Introductory cricket as set out above, and those playing Have a Go cricket. The Have a Go program spread to cover five centers at Engadine, Caringbah, Illawong, Bangor, and Gymea. Conducted by joint club efforts at some centers, these centers provided basic skills development work for 230 children. The programs being undertaken will prepare these children for entry into Introductory cricket for the 2002/2003 season.

Stemming from the introduction of the Laws of Cricket (2000 Code) the Association saw merit in providing players, coaches and parents with an information program aimed at increasing an understanding of the game's laws and the importance of the Code of conduct. Using its website and encouraging all Clubs to publish the information in Club Newsletters the Association's initiative under the label of "Know your Laws" attracted attracting positive reaction from readers as a positive measure to increase an understanding of some of the more complex laws.

The Off Season Development program for aspiring representative cricketers was conducted on a weekly basis at an indoor center and conducted by Level Two coaches. While there is no automatic selection to representative teams arising out of this program it served to identify players with potential and provides selectors and coaches with an insight to players' skills, attitude and commitment.

In review, these activities now completed seen to have been of value and well received. I hope that this program or a similar one is continued next year.

#### HAVE-A-GO CRICKET

This year we had five sites Aquinas, Caringbah, Engadine, Gymea and Illawong offering Have-a-go cricket to prospective young cricketers. A total of 235 boys and girls were involved across the shire and of these 170 were new registrations. Comments from some of the sites are listed below.

##### Bangor

This year the Have a Go Program on Friday nights was hampered by inclement weather, but our registrations were up and the 62 kids all were always ready to go even if the black clouds were all around, Mums and Dads were praying that the rain would stay away.

Again the success of our Billa Rd Centre was due to the input from the boys from our Senior team, U16B and U14A team, so to Daniel, Marc, Luke, Pat & Morgan thanks for your time and for making my job so much easier. Also Kevin Cohen & Peter Evans performed up to their usual standard and their help is greatly appreciated.

In my last year as Have a go Coordinator I thank everyone involved with Have a go especially Craig Beed at Cricket NSW who was always very helpful, it was great to see the smiles on the kids faces when they were getting hats or drink bottles or just hitting the ball with the bat – thanks for a lot of fun.

##### Caringbah

This is the first year Caringbah HAG centre has operated. We enrolled 26 children and recruited several parents to assist in the weekly running of activities. The children range in age from 3 to 8 years so we are catering for a wide spectrum of ability levels.

The sessions have been very successful in the areas of skill development. The children are very eager and this is evident in the conversations overheard each week concerning Steve Waugh and the Australian Team.

##### Engadine

This was the first year that the Engadine District has conducted a Have-a-go Programme for budding Cricketers from surrounding areas. The Programme was conducted at Boys' Town Fields on Friday afternoons over a ten week period finishing just before the Christmas Break, and can be considered a resounding success.

We had 39 registered participants including just one very enthusiastic young lady from the Engadine, Loftus, Heathcote areas. Overall the kids had a lot of fun, and learned quite a bit as an introduction to Cricket.

I would like to thank those people who assisted with the week to week running of the Centre, in particular Ian Latham from Engadine Dragons Club, who was present every week lending a helping hand.

Further, special thanks must be extended to the Junior Cricketers and Team Coaches from Engadine Dragons and Bosco Cricket Clubs for their assistance, in particular Ben Latham (Engadine), Ryan Mulally and Matt Milross (Bosco) who were there nearly every week running groups of kids through their drills.

##### Gymea Bay

The Have-A-Go Centre in Gymea Bay proved a great success for another year. Drawing from children in neighbouring districts, registrations for both girls and boys were up to sixty.

Held on Friday nights between 6pm and 7.30pm, the children responded enthusiastically to the emphasis placed on having fun whilst learning the basic skills with bat and ball. By popular demand we ran the course through the summer holiday and with the reduced numbers of children were able to develop onto playing cricket games appropriate for their age groups.

Finally, thanks to the kids and their parents for their involvement and enthusiasm. I'm sure that next season will see a further increase in interest and participation once word of the success of the Engadine Have-a-go Centre spreads.

Thankyou to all those who made HAG such a success this year. in particular the Co-ordinators who shoulder much of the responsibility for making each night an enjoyable experience for the children.

#### COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

My report for this season is penned with a degree of "sadness" as it will be my last for the Association in this role.

I would like to congratulate Sylvania Heights Cricket Club on winning the Club Championship, and all of those players who will follow in the Annual Report for their personal achievements.

This season, changes were made to the under 8 competition when it was melded into the U10 competition – although to some this was new, to those of us who have been around for some time, it was in fact reintroducing practices that were in place some seasons ago. Under 8 players had an opportunity to register for Have-A-Go cricket at several centres established throughout the Shire or to register for U10 cricket, primarily working through a structured competition of Introductory, Modified and then Traditional cricket competitions.

A review of U8 and Sunday cricket, undertaken with representatives from the clubs, recommended that U8 competition be re-introduced, and Have-A-Go be extended to include some competition games after the Christmas interval. The Management Committee has endorsed this for the forthcoming season, and I am hopeful that this will assist the clubs in their registrations for next season.

The second season of Sunday cricket and the introduction of a policy which restricted play on Sunday to one year only for new registrations in the U10 age group did a lot to settle that area of competition. This policy will remain in place next season, following the review of Sunday cricket.

The Girls competition was a little disappointing in the sense there were not enough numbers to schedule a "girls only" competition, however with the support of the clubs, we were able to register two teams – one in Introductory cricket, the other in 14E competition. If we are to succeed in this area, there will need to be some very active promotional work in the off season to recruit a significant increase in the number of girls registering.

Over the past six years, the role of Competition Manager has not only embraced the fundamental processes of chairing grading committees, structuring competition draws and overseeing matches but has also involved the continuing up dating of the Regulations and Laws of cricket in association with the Secretary.

Much has been achieved in these areas and I am grateful to the Committees that I have been part of, who have sought ways to improve the competition and have recognised the need to look to the future for initiatives that will continue the development and growth of junior cricket in the Shire.

I have often spoken about the need for communication between the SSJCA and clubs, and clubs and their officials – this is still an area in which I think we have some work to do. The website this season has gone a long way in "taking the word to the people" – my thanks to Peter Risby for his work in this area, but we as administrators along with club officials need to ensure that Managers and Coaches are well prepared for Saturday/Sunday morning cricket. So often, teams and or clubs are penalised for oversights on the part of team officials which could so easily have been overcome if they had been better informed about the MCC Laws of Cricket, Competition Regulations and procedures.

While I acknowledge that they are volunteers, so are those at the other end of the line, and we all need to try and pull together to provide the best possible outcome for our junior players.

With the resignation of two recorders at the beginning of the season, things were looking rather grim – I will always be grateful to Amanda & Steve Kelloway for stepping in to record for the U12 grade and Tim & Sharon Butler for recording in the U16 grade. Anthony Smith recorded for the U14 grade and John Worton stepped up again to cover the U10 grade for me. These people are tireless workers whose time and effort are immeasurable – many hours every fortnight are expended on recording and I thank them for their commitment to the task and their assistance to me.

The SSCUA again provided us with official umpires throughout the season in our more senior grades – thanks to Syd Edwards who as always has provided support to the SSJCA in this area.

This season, Sutherland Shire Council, at no cost to the Association, upgraded the pitches at Waratah Oval, Loftus Oval and Gwawley West. In addition to this, work was undertaken at Anzac 1, Kareela South and Kareela Central. While the impact on the allocation of grounds for the competition draw, was substantial, the surfaces on the grounds should be much improved for further seasons. My thanks, in particular to John Gordon and Kirin Lindop, who as always, have provided tremendous assistance and support to the SSJCA in attempting to meet our needs.

In closing, again I would like to thank those who I have had the pleasure to have worked with over what seems a "lifetime" on the SSJCA's Management Committee, for their support, assistance, respect and continuing commitment to junior cricket in both local and representative arenas.

New faces will appear on the SSJCA Committee in the forthcoming season and I am confident they will bring with them a new and refreshing point of view. I am hopeful that along with those views they will recognise the need to maintain the direction that has been taken in order to continue to achieve growth in the future.

To those who will register to play junior cricket in the future - enjoy the game, and take from it a sense of team spirit and tolerance, a degree of personal achievement and most importantly a respect for and a love of the game.
