### PART II - EXECUTIVE, FINANCIAL & CLUB REPORTS.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Well we have reached the end of another year where we provided an opportunity for over 1250 boys and girls to play cricket at all levels. For some, cricket is an opportunity to improve fitness, and enjoyment comes from participating in a team-based sport. For others it is a gradual building of skills and a testing of these skills through strong competition.

Earlier this week I watched 40 under 16 and 40 under 15 boys trial for spots in next season's Emerging Blues program. As I watched the raw pace of the fast bowlers, the guile of the spinners and the power and elegance of the batsmen I found it interesting to consider the progression that has taken the boys to this level - thousands of hours of practice and games that has developed and honed their skills. From an SSJCA point of view it is interesting to consider the progression we provide our players to help build their cricket skills.

At the youngest age we provide Milo Have-a-go run by volunteers at Illawong, Gymea and Aquinas. At this level the players are taught some of the fundamentals of the game in a non-competitive fun environment. They work on hand eye co-ordination and are introduced to batting, bowling and fielding, through structured teaching and games. Thank you to all those volunteers who make HAG available at these sites.

At the under 8 and lower grades of the younger age groups we provide Introductory Cricket and Modified Cricket. These are designed to help the players participate and develop their skills.

Traditional cricket is provided for all others from 10A and above. This enables the players to use the skills they have developed and continue to refine them in competition.

Other opportunities to develop skills are through the Under 10 development squad and the Gala day for other age groups. The Under 10 development squad provides skill development and then the opportunity to further develop these skills in games against each other. I thank Greg Thomas and his team for running this program in 2003-2004. The Gala Day provided all players an opportunity to participate in skill drills – thank you to the Grade Club for running the Gala Day.

We also provide opportunities for the under 11's and above to further develop their skills playing against sides from other areas in the Shell Shield and President's competition. This year we won the President's Competition and had our under 14's and under 15's make it though to the semi-finals in their respective competitions. We also had two boys win District Cricket "Player of the Series" for excellent performances in the under 14 and under 15 competitions.

At the next level of development there were a number of players who performed well in the Shell Shield competitions in 2002-2003 and were selected in the Emerging Blues program run by Cricket NSW. This program provides specialist coaching for the elite players. At the under 16 level there is the opportunity to progress beyond junior cricket. Many of the players take the opportunity to play in the Men's competition in the afternoon to get a feel for where they can progress once their junior careers are finished. Others have had the opportunity to experience the Grade Competition in the Green Shield or games in 5<sup>th</sup> Grade – 11 juniors played at least one game of 5<sup>th</sup> grade this season. We thank Brett Johnson and his team for the opportunities they have provided and the assistance they have given in running the Gala Day.

Volunteers run all these competition and development programs. I want to thank my committee for the long hours and hard work they have put in throughout the year. I want to thank the club committees who work with us to provide cricket for so many players. Thankyou also to the many mum's and dad's who coach, or manage, or score, or umpire or assist with many of the other tasks on game day.

An organisation of volunteers also needs sponsors and I would like to thank Harry and Carol Peters from Marine Product Marketing and Harry Solomons from Kingsgrove Sports Centre – please support the companies who support your children.

The website continues to provide up to date information for our junior cricketers & administrators thanks to the untiring efforts of Peter Risby.

We lost the services of Ray Brennan early in the season and Ian Connor stepped in to the Finance Manager role as well as continuing as the Assistant Secretary and I would like to thank Ian for taking on the added responsibility & workload.



### CRICKETER OF THE YEAR - GENE RICHARDS - CARINGBAH SPORTS 16A

Gene started his cricket with Caringbah Sports 10 years ago in the Under 8 competition and has grown into an outstanding cricketer very worthy of this prestigious award.

In Gene's final year at Sports he was again seen by the opposition as "the batsman to get out" and was now also being seen as pretty handy with the ball. 

At the start of the representative season this selection of players looked on paper and in the nets to be a "hot" side capable of dominating the competition. Their form throughout the season more than justified the high expectations and their only loss very nearly became their most spectacular of victories.

An opening partnership of 96 between Davis (71) and Dimitri (57) in our first game against Gordon exemplified the strength of this team's batting line-up. A total of 209 proved easy to defend with the consistently tight opening bowlers (Matt, Chris, Stephen and Tim) ably supported by our depth of bowling talent. Clever glovework from Andrew Whittingham brought about a stumping and a caught behind. Gordon all out for 114 and the reputation for unrelenting bowling and fielding firepower in this Sutherland side well established.

Our first away game against Hornsby was a "stormy" affair with the elements threatening to reduce the game to a run-rate battle. A respectable score of 159 by Hornsby looked very 'gettable' after Chris (4-17), Tim (2-6) and Dimitri (2-29) had

starred with the ball and wicketkeeper Andrew Martin (3 Catches) with the gloves. At 4-17 Sutherland looked as though the impending storm would be irrelevant to the outcome. A 70 run partnership between Andrew Martin and Chris turned the game in our favour before Chris recorded the first century of the season (100 n.o.). This time it was the batting strength of this versatile team that won the day.

Penrith represented the team's greatest challenge to that point. At 5-34 Sutherland were reeling; its batting 'stars' of the first two games already back in the pavilion. However, Penrith were unaware that this was a team of batting 'stars'. A thrilling partnership of 158 between Tim (53) and Chris shattered the Penrith spirit, with Chis Jamieson the chief destroyer with 118 n.o. Chasing 203, Penrith succumbed to the All Star bowling lineup - Penrith all out for 126 in 46 overs, and the reputation of this Sutherland side as the "gun" team now seemingly well founded.

Would the Christmas break affect this team's momentum? Apparently not, with Gordon self-destructing in the top order and Sutherland pouncing to roll them for 138. This time the batting honours were shared by Matt (47), Daniel (25) and Chris (25). We passed the total at 5 wickets down and the only disappointment was the lack of opportunity for other batsmen, keen to show their abilities in the middle.

Perhaps a sense of over-confidence accompanied the boys to Corea Oval for their match against Hornsby, for our batting struggled from the start to be 5–33. Only Dimitri Joel stemmed the tide of outgoing batsmen and the side struggled to a total of 112 off only 39 overs. Mission Impossible began. 8 for 60 - could this team achieve the most incredible of all their victories? Alas, no, but they gave it a sensational try! Again bowling tightly but aggressively, Sutherland were outstanding under pressure with Matt, Chris Jamieson, Chris Feggans, and Joel being well supported by brilliant ground fielding and well judged catches. Hornsby scrambled past our total without ever feeling comfortable against such a powerhouse side.

The final game of the season gave the boys the chance to atone for their single loss and prove their dominance. And prove it they did. Daniel Brett's determined 41 set the tone of our innings, highlighted by Joel's exciting 99. We finished on 209 The awesome bowling lineup quickly asserted their authority, Chris Feggans took 3 smart catches at slip but the pinnacle of performance for the season had to be wicketkeeper Andrew Martin's 2 for 1 off 4 balls, providing an 'unbelievable' finish to an outstanding season for every player who represented Sutherland in this President's U/14 champion sidel

Major credit for this team's success and the obvious bond established between the players must go to coach Neil Martin who consistently shared the opportunities for all players to shine. Well done and thank you, Neil. Also thanks to all the parents for their support and encouragement of the team, and especially to Leo Alevizos for sharing the greater portion of the scoring with me, and Graeme Theobold for "ground support".

Finally, congratulations to an outstanding group of young men whose friendly natures and pleasing manners made the job of managing the team a real pleasure. I wish all of you every success in future seasons!
