PART II – EXECUTIVE, FINANCIAL & CLUB REPORTS.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another year has ended where we provided cricket for over 1100 boys and girls in the SSJCA competitions. Some of these boys experienced the next level of cricket in the Shell Shield where four teams (Creak, Cawsey, Moore and Watson) made the semi-finals and two of these went on to make the finals. Others participated in the President's Shield Competition, which we won and also in the U10 development programme. Overall we performed well at all levels in what was a good year for the SSJCA and I would like to thank my committee for their hard work to make these programmes happen. I would also like to thank all the volunteers who assisted in all the clubs. Especially those who assisted each Saturday to get the boys on the paddock – the coaches, managers, scorers and spectators – without you the game cannot go ahead.

This will be my last year on the SSJCA. Over the last 10 years I have been on the Illawong Management Committee and the SSJCA, I have coached from U8's through to U16's, been involved with representative sides through all age groups and observed the Emerging Blues Programme. During this time I have watched boys develop from swashbuckling 8 year olds, scoring predominately from pull shots, into reasonable cricketers. I have seen some develop, some not develop to their potential and some move into other sports.

One point I have learnt through these years is that Junior Cricket is a way for boys and girls to enjoy this wonderful game and to develop the skills that will enable them to move to their next level, whether men's cricket, social cricket or Grade cricket. There is no doubt that club and SSJCA management styles and decisions can effect development. As can coach attitudes and experience. Tom Croucher is doing some good work looking at these effects and how we can manage them. However, there are also some basic individual qualities that have to be learned to move to the next level. These are technique, experiencing variety and mental toughness and the SSJCA helps the development of these skills through competition and the programmes we run.

Firstly technique – whether batting, bowling or fielding it will be easier to progress if a player has a good technique. As an example I watched a fast bowler (from Gordon 3rd Grade) rip through Sutherland 5th Grade in the 2003-4 season. On talking to him afterwards he could tell me the technical deficiencies many of the batsmen had and thus how he was bowling to them. At all levels a sound technique gives a player a better chance of success. A lot of technique work will come from club coaches and the SSJCA helps them through the Level 1 certificate being run by experienced coaches, through the U10 development squads and through Gala Days supported by the Grade Club. I would also encourage the SSJCA to bring back the off-season Development Squads to offer another avenue for technique refinement.

Secondly Variety – this is the opportunity for batsmen to be able to face a variety of bowlers and develop suitable strategies against them. It is also the opportunity for bowlers to bowl to a variety of batsmen and develop strategies against them. The SSJCA helps provide variety through the competitions we run and participation in the Shell Shield and President's competition.

Thirdly mental toughness – this is the ability to fight through difficult game situations. For example a batsman coming in on a difficult pitch with the score 2 for 0, or a bowler coming on to bowl with the score 0 for 150 after 20 overs. This is probably the least important of the three in the U8's, but the most important as we leave junior cricket. It comes from being put into pressure situations during games and coaches using pressure situations during training. Again it is the competition the SSJCA provides which helps develop this skill.

So as my time in junior cricket comes to an end and I move with my son into the next level, I would encourage all clubs, coaches and managers to reflect on how they are helping develop their players. Are they all being given opportunities to refine technique, to experience variety and to become mentally tough? If not, what strategies need to be put in place by the SSJCA, clubs and coaches to help this development.

Thankyou to all who have supported me over the last few years, to my hard working committee and our sponsors Harry Peters from Marine Product Marketing and Harry Solomons from Kingsgrove Sports Centre. Thank you also to the Grade Club who has supported our development programmes.

VICE PRESIDENT (Development)

The Association's effort to provide a program of development for the year covered Have a Go Cricket, the Under 10 Development Squad and a skills development day run in conjunction the Sutherland District Cricket Club

The HAG cricket program was run by the Illawong, Aquinas and Gympie clubs and gave players a great opportunity to learn basic skills in an enjoyable and family friendly environment. I would like to thank the co-ordinators for their time and effort.

The development day was aimed at players in the U10 and U12 age groups with approximately 100 children attending the afternoon session. The development day was conducted by the Grade Club. There were a number of stations that the boys rotated through focussing on the basic skills of batting, bowling, running between wickets and fielding. The assistance and enthusiasm of the Grade players and officials in conducting the development day was greatly appreciated.

After the success of the Development Squad last season, it was decided to continue with the concept and not field a Foster Shield side. This year the Development Squad was limited to 24 boys. It was pleasing to see that we had approximately 40 boys from all U10 grades attend the selection.

The aim of the Development Squad is to provide the boys with intensive coaching concentrating on skill development by senior coaches from the Association and players from the Grade Club. The format of the Development Squad was similar to last year whereby the boys attended training sessions for a six week period and finished by playing 3 games between themselves under representative playing conditions.

Once again, the highlight for the boys was the training session at the SCG. The boys held a 2 hour net session at the Indoor Centre and finished off with a 30 minute fielding session on the outside training area.

After Christmas, the boys were divided into 2 teams and played 3 games against each other. It was pleasing to see not only the improvement in the boy's attitude and techniques over the period but the way in which the games were played.

The assistance of the Grade Club in providing players to assist in the coaching of the boys cannot be overstated. It was great to see many of the Grade players who attended the training sessions were themselves Sutherland junior cricketers and the boys responded well to their words of advice and encouragement.

I would also like to thank the Sutherland Shire Cricket Umpires Association and in particular Tim Rogan and Robert Hobden for their support in not only umpiring the Development Squad games but also in the way they provide encouragement and assistance to the boys playing their first all day games without a coach assisting them on the field.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the enormous contribution of Bob Proctor, John Worton and Mark Chapman in assisting me in the running of the Development Squad. Bob, John and Mark gladly gave up their time to encourage and teach the boys - without their encouragement, guidance and patience, the Development Squad would not have been the success that it was.

COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

Congratulations to Engadine Dragons the new Club Champions and to the 15 teams that won their respective finals. Congratulations also to all award winners; but most of all I want to congratulate and to express my thanks to all the players who took part in the SSJCA competition. Matches were played in the best spirit and good sportsmanship was always evident. For the second year in a row we have not had one incident report about the misconduct of any player.

I want to express my thanks to everyone who has helped make our competition possible. Thank you to Sutherland Shire Council who have done an excellent job providing 46 fields in good condition, despite the continued drought and severe water restrictions. Thank you to the members of the SSJCA committee who give up many hours each year to ensure all players have a well run and enjoyable competition. Thank you to all coaches, managers and other volunteers who give up many hours to assist teams so that 1,218 players can enjoy their cricket each week.

One major change this year was the introduction of the compulsory use of helmets in all grades from Under 10 to Under 16. The issue had generated much debate for several years. But as 26% of all reported injuries over the previous two seasons were head injuries to batters, the committee felt compelled to make a decision that took the choice out of the hands of players, parents and clubs. Despite concerns that it would be an unpopular move the decision has been very well received. It is pleasing to report that during the 2004/05 season no batsman sustained a head injury while batting in a match.

The other major innovation this year was the introduction of the computer-generated file for each team with the individualised team list, season draw and summary sheets similar those found in our scores books. The overwhelming majority of teams had no trouble correctly completing the information and returning the file to the SSJCA by the date requested. The provision of information in this manner greatly simplified the end of season administrative tasks, and will produce a similar saving of time and effort at the start of next season. The challenge now will be to put procedures in place to assist those teams who struggle with the electronic approach.

The area of greatest growth in the last few seasons has been the number of players in the Under 8 competitions. It is a delight to see the enthusiasm of these young players and their obvious delight in playing cricket each week. The challenge will be to provide an environment that encourages these young players to continue playing cricket through to Under 16's and into the senior ranks.

Finally I would like to thank the four recorders: John Worton, Michael Ryan, Anthony Chapman and Mark Wissam for their assistance in checking result sheets and compiling the results after each game. My job was made so much easier because of their good work.

Bowling first or first change pace for one spell and then coming back to bowl another 6 overs of leg spin showed his versatility with the ball. The bowling wasn't a problem at all, he loved the contest of ball on bat.

Whilst looking back from the first time I saw Anthony play until the last game of the season, I have to congratulate a young man who enjoys his sport, the competition and the social side of cricket but above all I think Anthony matured enormously as a cricketer this year as his average and this award deservedly show.

Congratulations once again Anthony and we hope your cricket continues to prosper.

BEST PERFORMANCE 14A - ALEC JUDD

Alec captained the Caringbah Sports 14A side to 8 wins and 2 losses over the 2004/05 season with the team ultimately finishing as losing finalists. He took responsibility for all decisions made during each game, displaying a strong understanding of technical & tactical aspects of the game whilst always respecting good sportsmanship and a strong commitment to ensuring each match was always played in a spirit highly espoused by supporters.

REPRESENTATIVE CRICKET MANAGER'S REPORT

The Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association fielded 9 representative teams over the 2004/2005 representative season with a fair result being obtained overall.

The SSJCA again this year did not enter a U10 Foster Shield Team in the Inter District Competition electing to watch the progress and results of the U10 Development Squad instead. This squad was run for the second time this season with both very positive comments and results coming from it. This year's U11 Creak Shield Semi Final side is one example of these positives with a lot of the team progressing from last year's Development Squad.

The U12, U14 and U16 Presidents XII teams all combined to win the Presidents XII Competition this year with the U12's winning 3 out of 6 matches, the U14's winning 3 out of 6 and the U16's winning 5 out of 6 of their matches. Congratulations to all the Players, Coaches and Managers for helping Sutherland to retain this trophy. It is nice to receive positive feedback from other associations, as was the case this season, highlighting that Sutherland can show to other District Associations that both on and off the field representative cricket can be played at a high level, in the right spirit and enjoyed by all players, officials and parents while still being competitive.

This season could probably be described as "The one that got away". The Semi Final against our nemesis Penrith was disappointing. After being bundled out for just 130, Penrith had no trouble hauling in our score for the loss of just 2 wickets. A sad way to end a special series.

Thanks very much to Helen Mall who was a great assistant and Manager of the team - thanks also to the parents for their unstinting support and dedication - you should be proud of your boys.

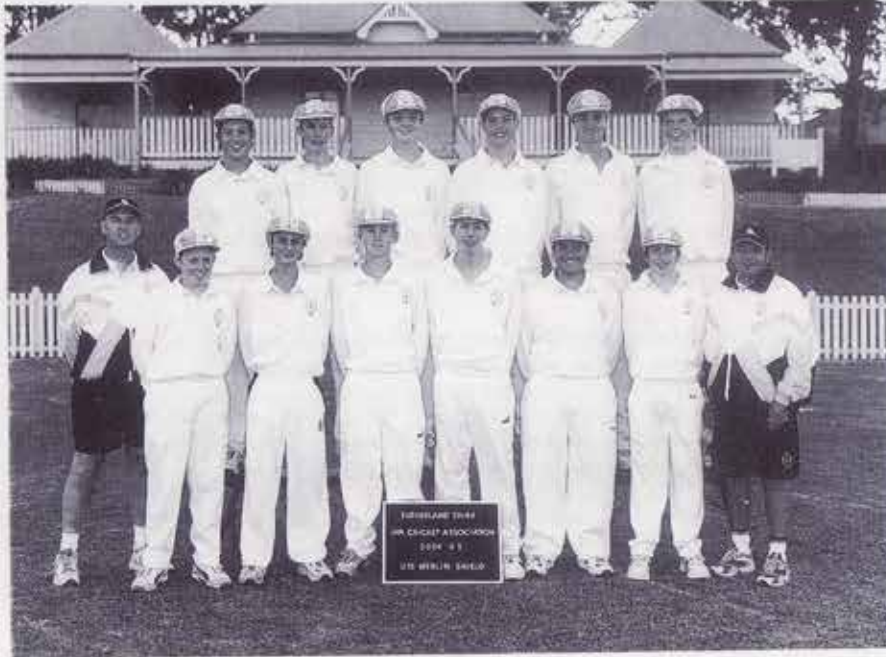

Before a ball was bowled one of the teams best players broke his arm at school and looked gone for the year, then one of the team's openers dislocated his thumb in the practice nets and spent two rounds recovering, and so on. But the thing the team really had to work hard at to overcome was their lack of experience at rep level.

I have always actively supported the changes the SSJCA has sought to promote dating back over 25 years to the time we introduced modified (Tabloid Cricket) to Australia, so I'm certainly not complaining now. But it did make our mission a little more difficult competing against other Associations who, at the present time, do not support our no under 10 Foster Shield policy.

Personally I would like to see our Creak Shield team for next season chosen now. This would allow the coaching staff time to work on the team's technical and emotional skills and perhaps go some way towards creating an even playing field.

As for this series, I couldn't have been happier with the effort and attention given by the players to the task we placed before them.

Without exception, every player gave everything he had towards playing the game in the best traditional sense. In addition they did their utmost to achieve the bringing home of the coveted Shield. We came close, but on this occasion, it was not to be.

There is one thing I am certain of though and that is, providing these boys maintain their enthusiasm for the game, they'll be more than a force to be reckoned with next season.

It is impossible to write a brief summary of a season that seemed to be begin so long ago without mentioning those who helped make it all work. Our Manager Kerrie Smith was wonderful. Our coaching staff headed by Robbie Knight, Joe D'Imperio, Rob Smith, Tim Moreland, Jimmy and Michael Gleeson, and Darren Smith all contributed to the players gaining of knowledge and know-how.

To the players themselves. Personally I couldn't have asked for a more dedicated and committed group of young men. I think they learned a lot about the elite level of cricket.

And finally to the parents. Nothing happens without their assistance and encouragement and this they gave in abundance.

I am personally very proud of this fine group of people and I will remain grateful to our Association for allowing me the privilege of being a part of the Creak Shield team of 2004-2005.

The only bright part about our batting was the rain. Lucky to get a draw this time guys!

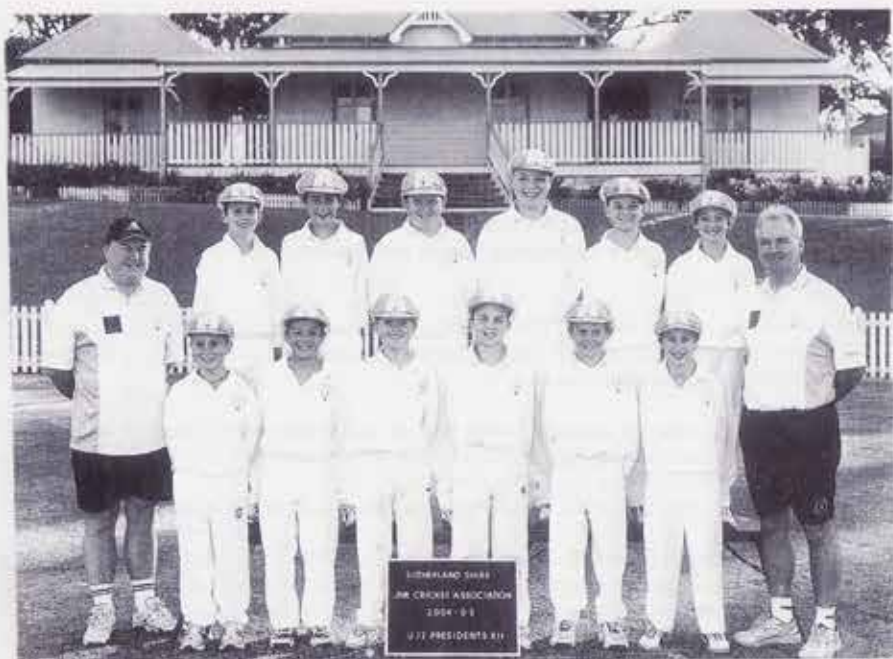
