

#### PART II - EXECUTIVE, FINANCIAL & CLUB REPORTS.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We have now reached the end of the 2005/06 cricket season, and my first as President of the SSJCA.

The aim of the SSJCA is to provide boys and girls with the opportunity to play cricket at all levels. This year we were successful in providing the opportunity for 1,343 children to play cricket from the U8s to the U16s. We also had 217 children learning basic skills and having fun through their participation in Have-A-Go Cricket.

One very important initiative being developed by Tom Croucher, Competition Manager this year is the computer based software for the recording of, amongst other things, match results. The software should be operational for the commencement of the 2006/07 season and will greatly reduce the time for results of matches being provided and distributed to Clubs as well as being posted on the website.

This year we introduced the U12 Super 8s where clubs were represented by a mixture of players from their U12s teams. The Super 8s were played over a 4 week period where each team played 3 games on a Monday night. Our thanks go to our Vice President Marketing, Peter Brown and Steve Mulally from CricketNSW for arranging the U12s Super 8s.

In developing our player and coaching skills, this year we introduced, in conjunction with the Sutherland Grade Club, the very successful Development program where players and coaches attended a number of development/training sessions run by Trent Woodhill, the Sutherland Grade Club head coach and assisted by a number of senior Grade players. Our thanks go to Trent Woodhill and our Vice President Development (Brad Loder) for the enormous effort in getting this important development initiative off the ground.

Another aspect of our player development was the U10 Development Squad which provides skills development over a 5 week period and then an opportunity to further develop their skills in games against each other. Our thanks go to Mark Chapman and Robbie Knight for running this program.

We also provide opportunities for the U11s and above to play in the Shell Shield and Presidents XII competition. This year our Watson Shield was runners up and our Creak Shield made the semi finals.

We would not be able to run the competition and development programs without the efforts of volunteers. I would like to thank the club committees who work with the Executive of the SSJCA to provide cricket for so many players. I would also like to thank on behalf of the players, the mums and dads who coach, manage, score and assist the teams getting on the field on Saturday mornings.

I would also like to thank John Gordon and the staff at Sutherland Council for their efforts in providing the playing fields and practice facilities, especially in this period of water restrictions.

I want to thank my Committee for their long hours and hard work they have put into the running of a successful competition. In particular, I would like to thank Allan Morgan (Representative Cricket Manager) and Peter Risby (Promotions Manager) who are standing down from the Committee for their years of service to Cricket in the Shire.

#### VALE JACK MOODIE

Jack Moodie passed away in 2005 after many years of ill health.

Jack was a founding member of the current junior competition (the SSJCA). Jack was one of the attendees at the meeting held at the Scouts' Hall Sutherland on 16th September 1957 when the President of the Men's Association instructed those present to form a committee "to deal with all matters affecting the C grade Competition" (The C grade was the boys competition in those days.)

He was a guiding influence in those formative years. He was elected to the first committee as Publicity Officer (he represented the Evoca Cricket Club where he managed one of their sides). Jack was the Honorary Recorder in the first year of competition and served as Secretary from 1958/59 to 1962/63. Wally Croucher took over the roles of Hon Recorder and Publicity Officer. He was the first Life Member of the SSJCA (awarded in 1963)

Jack was Secretary of the Sutherland Shire District Cricket Club in its foundation season of 1952/53 (this Club became the current Grade Club in 1965). Jack was also a senior first grade umpire during the 1970's.

Jack was awarded Life Membership of the Sutherland Shire Cricket Association (the Men's' competition) in 1961.

His sons Warren and Brian played grade cricket with SDCC in the 1970's.

## VICE PRESIDENT (Development)

This season the SSJCA saw the need to further expand our development programs to allow more players, coaches and Clubs the opportunity to improve their skill levels with the guidance of a Level 3 coach in Trent Woodhill who was the Sutherland Grade Club coach.

This saw the introduction of skill sessions for Club players, Club coaches, Representative players and coaches which complemented our existing HAG program as well as our U/10 Development program.

Our HAG cricket programs this season were run by the Illawong, Caringbah, Gymea, St John Bosco and Aquinas Clubs and saw an overall increase in player numbers from 105 in season 2004/05 to 217 in season 2005/06 a great success indeed.

Our Club player Development program incorporated skill sessions in batting, bowling (both spin and pace), wicket keeping and fielding and was available for the U/10, U/12, U/14 and U/16 age groups and held at Caringbah Oval.

The Club coach development program saw training sessions held at club venues as well as the introduction of 4 Club coaching forums held at Caringbah Oval with the assistance of the grade club. The forums allowed Club coaches to improve their skills by learning new training drills as well as having a forum to discuss any issues or topics concerning coaching.

Our U/10 Development program saw 24 players selected from a group of 42 players who attended the selection trials. These 24 players then attended 5 training sessions culminating in a net session at the SCG indoor facility. At the end of this session, the squad were invited by NSW Cricket to attend the match between NSW and Tasmania which gave the boys a real thrill.

After Christmas, the squad were divided into 2 teams and trained for a further 3 sessions before playing 3 matches under Representative playing conditions.

Many thanks go to Mark Chapman and Robbie Knight who gave up a lot of their time to run the training sessions and guide the 2 teams through the 3 matches played. The contribution by these two coaches cannot be understated and with the encouragement and patience shown saw many players improve their skills.

The inclusion of our representative players into the development program saw the U/11, U/12, U/13 and U/14 Shield sides as well as the Presidents U/12, U/14 and U/16 sides receiving specialised training as well.

While this year has been a testing year for the Development programs outlined above, the further development of these programs for the coming years is of vital importance to allow us to improve the skill levels of our coaches and players and in turn offer a stronger competition in which to play.

His on field captaincy improves with each match and he leads by example with his smart work in looking for run outs and a safe pair of hands when catching. His club, team and coach wish to congratulate Shayne on his achievements this year.

#### **BEST PERFORMANCE 10A – ETHAN GRINHAM**
