PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2006-07 cricket season saw the SSJCA and Clubs provide the opportunity for 1,451 players in 125 teams to play cricket in the Shire. The provision of the facilities, the grounds, the registrations, the competition, the Development programs and Representative Competitions are due to the efforts of an incredibly hard working SSJCA Committee and their colleagues at club level. To this end I would like to thank all those involved for their dedication and the sacrifices made on their own and their family's time.

Of course this year represented the anniversary of 50 years of junior cricket in the Sutherland Shire and I would like to publicly acknowledge the past administrators and custodians of this game who have served on all the committees over those 50 years and who have left the current committee with a wonderful legacy to continue.

Of equal importance to the 50th anniversary has been the development of the on-line software developed by our Competition Manager, Tom Croucher. The ease of use and the access to statistical information is absolutely first rate and a real credit to Tom who spent countless hours on this project. This software development holds us in good stead for our future progression in the effective running of junior cricket, so much so that a number of other bodies and associations have looked at either purchasing or licensing the software from us.

I want to publicly acknowledge the continued generosity of our 2 major sponsors Harry and Carol Peters at Marine Product Marketing and Harry and Rohini Solomons at Kingsgrove Sports. I would implore all players and parents to support both these companies, whenever possible when purchasing their respective products.

To the Umpires I want to say thank you. All the Clubs would agree that the increased Umpire numbers we saw this year are good for the game, and in particular the number of younger umpires coming through is very heartening.

I would like to congratulate the Men's Association and the Sutherland Grade Club for their on field successes this year and for their encouragement of our juniors coming through the ranks. It is essential that the Juniors, the Men's Association and the Grade Club all work together and keep frank lines of communication open which will benefit all of our bodies, so thank you for your efforts in this regard.

In what have been very difficult circumstances our friends at Sutherland Council have done a great job in the availability and preparation of fields. In what are obviously trying times we owe you also a vote of thanks.

Representative Cricket saw a very successful year for Sutherland with special mention to Peter Schofield and the Gee Shield team taking out their Competition undefeated. None of the representative fixtures would be possible without the work involved from the Representative Manager, and in this regard I would like to thank Greg Thomas who took on the role this year after stepping down as President. Greg's dedication, perseverance and common sense approach to Rep Cricket ensured our players had a chance to grow and nurture their skills at a very high level. Being the Rep Manager is a very demanding and at times politically difficult job, but Greg handled all aspects exceptionally well, and was ably assisted by Darren Smith.

On the Development front Brad Loder has again done a great job. We see more opportunities for an expansion of our development programs into the future which we hope will mirror the great success that our Under 10's Development Squad has shown over the last few years. I know Brad is actively researching future ideas on how we can improve.

New to the committee this year was our Registrar Anyes McLean who did a great job not only on the registration front but also her input into our meetings was invaluable. Our Finance Manager Ian Connor not only kept a close eye on the finances but often went above and beyond the call of duty with his sage advice to the committee.

Russ Waddell's work in superbly organising our 50th dinner and the production of our 50th booklet cannot be thanked enough and Peter Risby continued his much appreciated assistance in the maintenance of our web site.

It is with some degree of sadness that I advise that our Association Secretary, Michael Mooney will not be standing for re-election for the coming season. Mike has served for over 10 years on the Management Committee, and has held the position as Registrar and Secretary and Selector. He has also been the SSJCA delegate to the Men's competition and the NSWDCA. From my own experience, and having spoken to others serving on previous committees, Mike's experience, knowing "who's who", his passion for the game and diligence onto the Committee will be incredibly difficult, if not impossible to replace.

In recognition of his outstanding efforts, Mike will be nominated at the AGM this year for Life Membership of the SSJCA (many Life Members have called already for his nomination) and the nomination will be heavily endorsed by the Management Committee. A well deserved tribute! I know all of you will share with me the anticipation of next year's competition, the fortunes and challenges it brings, but I would ask you all to consider that the more you can involve yourselves at both Club and Association level the more rewards our youngsters will obtain.

As you are aware this season we celebrated the 50th anniversary of junior cricket in the Sutherland Shire. We held a very successful dinner which was supported enthusiastically by the majority of clubs. We also launched a book covering our 50 years titled "History of the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association 1957 – 2007 (IT'S MORE THAN A GAME)" by Russ Waddell. Sincere thanks to Russ for not only writing and organising the publication of the book but also project managing the dinner - without his input neither would have come to fruition as they did. Thank you to Alison Megarrity MP (with assistance from Barry Collier MP and Paul McLeay MP) for gaining a \$5,000 grant from the NSW government to assist with the cost of producing the book. The competitions and representative seasons have been successful and thanks must go to Tom Croucher (ably assisted by Anyes McLean) and Greg Thomas (assisted by Darren Smith) for their commitment & contributions.

We fielded a girl's representative team this season for the first time and I would ask that we do all possible with promoting these teams as it can only be beneficial for junior cricket in the long term

Brad Loder has driven the initiation of the SSJCA development program and has continued to foster the representative development squad which, given results of the Creak Shield (Under 11) teams over the past two years, appears to be achieving the desired outcome. COMPETITION MANAGER'S REPORT

Congratulations to Gymea Bay for winning the Club Championship, their first such win since the 1990/91 Season. It is very pleasing to see clubs develop and challenge the currently strong clubs. Congratulations also to the 16 teams who won their SSJCA finals: and a big "Well Done" to all players and helpers who all contributed to making 2006-07 such a good season. It is very obvious as I visit different ages and grades that players are enjoying playing cricket and that skills are improving each season.

With this year being the 50th Season of the SSJCA I am thankful to Russell Waddell for organizing the 50th Anniversary Dinner and for writing the commemorative book. The dinner was a very fitting way to celebrate 50 seasons and the book is a very fitting way to pay tribute to the men and women who put in place what we perhaps take for granted.

Our 50th season saw a number of changes aimed at developing the skills of players, making the game more enjoyable and making it easier to administer.

- The major change was the introduction of the internet program, 'Cricket Online', to manage all player, club, team and match paperwork. I want to thank all the managers for the patience and willingness to attempt something so new. Players also embraced the new technology with the site having 2,000 to 3,000 visits per week.
- MOD cricket commenced this season replacing Introductory, Preliminary and Modified Cricket. The main aim of the change was to reduce the number of versions of the game and also to reward the team that scores most runs rather than the team with the best average. This change has also been well accepted by players and parents, except in the 12E's where the response to it was 'mixed'.
- 14D's played a mixture of two-day and one-day games where the response has been less than enthusiastic.

The trial of one-day games in 14D and MOD cricket in 12E is under review. I have surveyed players and parents in both grades and a full report will soon be presented to the SSJCA and clubs.

There are three major challenges for the 2007-08 and following seasons.

- The need to provide more support for people who are coaches and managers for the first time.
- The need to provide more support for people using the 'Cricket Online' for the first time.
- The need for the SSJCA to work more closely with Sutherland Council and all winter and summer sports associations to encourage the maximum participation in sport while preserving the best possible conditions of all sports fields. Public sports fields areas are a finite resource and they are in a fragile condition. All sports need to look at alternate training venues and better rotation of over-used fields. At this stage I believe that there will not be any changes to the number of fields available or the length of the season for 2007-08.

But what would life be without a few challenges!

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR – BEN MARCIANTE

It gives me great pleasure as the Watson Shield and Engadine's coach of the 16A's whom Ben both represented in 2006/07 to write of his cricket performances as the recipient of Sutherland Shires' most prestigious cricket award, the junior Cricketer Of The Year.

Ben came to our club as a second year U/12 player in 2002/03. As an aggressive left handed batsman and an off break bowler we were impressed from his initial net trial. I still recall Harry Robbins exact comment upon seeing him the very first time "this boy will get a lot of runs for our club" wise words indeed!

That prediction didn't take long for that same season Ben set a batting average that may never be beaten, 479 runs @ 159.67. That same season Ben scored his maiden century, 108*. Meanwhile his representative career was showing promise but was still one season away from blossoming. In 2003/04 Ben scored his first representative century, 106* against Hawkesbury after Sutherland were in real trouble at 4-27. His century coupled with a great partnership of 223 with Michael Sharkey setting up a great victory for his side.

In the meantime Ben was busy adding an extra string to his bow, as a threatening medium pace bowler. With developing height and strength Ben progressed from a first/second change bowler to an aggressive opener sharing the new ball. His developing skills saw him selected in the Emerging Blues. By 2005/06 Ben's all round talent was such, that as a first year 16A player he was the team's outstanding bowler with 21 wickets @ an average under 10. All the while compiling runs at a steady rate.

This past season was always Ben's. In club cricket his 464 runs @ 58 average was more than a hundred runs clear of anyone whilst he was equal top wicket taker with 19 scalps. Ben scored two centuries, 101 (retired himself) and a murderous 160, an innings which rates as possibly the best I have witnessed in junior competition. His fine form carried over into the districts Green Shield where his powerful batting accounted for 278 @ 46 per innings. With limited bowling opportunities Ben still managed 4 wickets from 15 overs with his best return 3-9. His great form culminated with his inclusion into the 1st Green Shield combined team.

In the four years as Ben's coach I am proud to say that he has always shown nothing but respect to all associated with his cricket, team-mates and opponents. He comes from a very close family who has always supported and only encourages his sporting ambitions.

Ben, your junior cricket may have finished, but the door is only opening to what should be a very promising cricket career. As an extremely worthy winner we wish you every success in the future of this great game.

This was a very challenging series for the boys. For several it was their first taste of representative cricket and for everyone it was a big step up from club cricket. Some of the opposition batsmen showed us how to build an innings and really attack the bowling. Opposition bowlers got results by consistency in line and length and we saw how important good fielding is. We had a great win over runaway leaders Newcastle and competed well against some of the other teams by getting ourselves into winning positions only to see games slip away at crucial moments.

It was great to see the lads get on well and be genuinely happy for each others success, encouraging others when required and generally having a fun time playing every game. Even though the results were disappointing I'm sure the boys enjoyed themselves and can take a lot away from the season.

We trained hard to get the basics right before the series began with lots of work on fielding, catching, running between wickets etc. Sometimes we got these right for an extended period during the game but the more successful sides did it for longer periods

than us. We also made a few poor decisions when confronted with pressure situations but that is all part of learning the game. I'm sure everyone learned from those experiences and will be better players for it. We need to bowl consistently in "the corridor" around off stump, concentrate in the field and try to accelerate our scoring when we have established ourselves with the bat.

Having said that, there were some fantastic results throughout the series as well. Liam Hamling showed good technique throughout the series with bat, scoring runs when opening. Jonathon Lamotta batted well when given an opportunity at the top of the order and was one of the quickest bowlers we saw. James Thomas's 6 – 28 against Hornsby almost won the game for us in round 2 and Sam Cooke batted well at the top of the order also when given the chance.

Jake Purser skippered the side and has the makings of a good all rounder. Better shot selection will improve results with the bat. Can tend to bowl too short which was punished at this higher level. **Liam Hamling** opened for the first couple of games and was our leading run scorer for the series. Will need to add a few more shots to his repertoire as he gets older in order to keep being successful. Liam also did a fine job behind the stumps. **Jordan Trajcevski** certainly hit the ball harder than anyone we saw this year. Some technical refinements will benefit him. Bowled with good pace at times and will get better results by pitching the ball up more often. **Jonathon Lamotta** improved throughout the summer and is a wonderful athlete with real potential in all aspects of the game. More confidence will see results improve even more. **James Thomas** was the standout bowler on several occasions but needs to find consistency to be more successful. Troubled all batsmen with his sharp bounce. A better batsman than his results showed. Be patient, James! **Ernie Ng** has a beautiful action for a left arm medium fast bowler. Found it was a big jump from club cricket but overcame this with some tidy spells after Christmas. Potentially a good lower order hitter and needs to work hard with the fielding and catching. **Mitchell Blake** also has a lovely action and also found it was a different game on Sundays. Line and length improved as the series went on and took some useful wickets along the way. A good pair of hands in the field with several great catches mixed in with a few misses. **Brendan Royall** was a first year under 12 player but was not intimidated in any circumstance. A fine keeper in the making. Didn't get many opportunities this season but will improve next season. **Harry Chapman** was another first year boy with limited opportunities who played better after Christmas with some handy knocks at the end of the innings. Some fantastic catches at first slip were standouts. **James Pfundstein** has a great technique but couldn't quite convert it into runs this series. Also bowls a more than useful leg spinner. **Sam Cooke** played well when given the opportunity at the top of the order scoring some good runs. Developing more run scoring shots will help his game. Bowled at a lively medium pace with good control – an important skill performed better than most in the team. **Gavin Ho** was our main spinner and even though he did not take many wickets kept a wonderful attitude to the game. Some minor technical improvements will see better results next year. **Ethan Verdich** played well in the games he played for us. A good all round cricketer with a great approach to the game.

Finally, a big thank you to the parents. It's not easy giving up a whole Sunday, often with younger children in tow and travelling to Glenorie, Castle Hill and Penrith! The encouragement and support from everyone was first class with everyone genuinely happy to the players' success, sharing their disappointments and always encouraging the boys. As usual the afternoon teas from Sutherland were miles ahead of anything else.
